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GOING HOME INSTRUCTIONS FOLLOWING ANORECTAL SURGERY

- 1. High fibre diet is generally recommended.
- 2. Local anaesthetic may have been used during your procedure. You may experience onset of pain 4 -6 hours post procedure. You will need to take painkillers as the anaesthetic is wearing off.
- 3. Activity: Avoid any activity which causes discomfort. Full activity is OK. Avoid straining, lifting more than 5kg and vigorous sports for 4 weeks or as directed by your doctor.
- 4. Driving: May drive whenever comfortable 24 hours after your procedure. Do not go alone the first time and do not drive after taking pain medication.
- 5. Stitz baths 2-3 times (20 mins each) a day and after each bowel movement for 2 weeks or longer. Instructions overleaf.
- 6. After bowel movement, use soft tissue or toilet paper when wiping. Pat the area gently dry. Avoid vigorous wiping.
- 7. If the anal area is very raw and painful, apply zinc protective cream e.g. Sudocrem ® to the area and place absorbent pads between buttocks to keep cheeks separated and absorb any moisture.
- 8. Do not take an enema unless this is discussed first. It may cause serious damage.
- 9. Usually avoidance of constipation is recommended. You may require Lactulose or Coloxyl to achieve a soft easily-passed bowel motion.
- 10. Alcoholic beverages are OK, in moderation from 24 hours after your procedure.
- 11. The following may occur and are to be expected:
 - a) Minor pink staining and a few spots of blood.
 - b) Erratic bowel movement and sometimes seepage of stool and gas.
 - c) Minor drainage of pus and mucus around a drain tube if inserted for fistula.

12. Medications:

- a) Pain relief as supplied eg: Panadol, Tramadol.
- b) Laxatives such as Metamucil or Lactulose.
- 13. Notify your doctor when the following occurs:
 - a) Heavy rectal bleeding with passage of clots or if it soaks through >2 pads a day.
 - b) Severe pain not relieved by pain killers.
 - c) Temperature more than 38°C.
 - d) Drain tube falls out often this needs to be replaced within 24 48 hours.
 - e) Heavy drainage of pus.
 - f) Passage of stool and gas through the vagina, especially when these were not present before surgery.
 - g) Difficulty in passing urine.
- 14. Review appointment is usually 2 to 6 weeks. If not already arranged prior to discharge, please call 9328 8890 for an appointment.

STITZ BATH

You may prepare the stitz bath in a bathtub, shallow bucket or you can purchase a stitz bath from your local chemist.

To prepare a stitz bath please follow these instructions:

- Fill the bath/bucket/stitz with approximately 8 10cm of warm water.
- Add ½ cup of salt and stir until dissolved.
- Soak the perineum area for approximately 15 20 minutes. This should be performed up to 3 4 times a day during the acute period and should be done after each bowel motion for approximately two weeks.
- Carefully pat the area dry with a clean towel when finished.
