Reminder: Last year (2023) Pastor Steven used his space in our monthly newsletter to unpack our church's statement of faith, the Baptist Faith & Message 2000. He will continue to do so this year in his articles.

#### The Lord's Day

The Friday before taking the ACT, I stayed up late putting on a concert with my high school rock-in-roll band for my co-workers at the Catfish House in Springfield. The next morning during the math portion of the test I fell asleep until I was tapped on the shoulder by one of the test administrators and told, "Sir, you may want to wake up...this test is fairly important to your future.

Few things are more important to a Christian's Spiritual health than our regular participation in the Lord's Day. The Puritans used to call the Lord's Day "the market day of the soul", referencing the day most folks back then used to go into town to get the provisions they needed for the coming week. The BFM 2000 says this about the Lord's Day:

The first day of the week (Sunday) is the Lord's Day. It is a Christian institution for regular observance. It commemorates the resurrection of Christ from the dead and should include exercises of worship and spiritual devotion, both public and private. Activities on the Lord's Day should be commensurate with the Christian's conscience under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Exodus 20:8-11; Matthew 12:1-12; 28:Iff; Mark 2:27-28; 16:1-7; Luke 24:1-3:33-36; John 4:21-24; 20:1,19-28; Acts 20:7; Romans 14:5-10; 1 Corinthians 16:1-2; Colossians 2:16; 3:16; Revelation 1:10

Much more could be said about the Lord's Day but the BFM 2000 is relatively minimalistic. In part, this is because there is a great deal of disagreement amongst Christians concerning the extent to which the Old Testament Sabbath regulations apply to the New Testament's Lord's Day. Can I eat out on Sunday? Can I watch TV? What about mowing the lawn? Can I throw a football with my kids after church? Faithful Christians disagree over these types of particulars. What the BFM 2000 majors on when it comes to the Lord's Day, is what the New Testament majors on, not so much things that **must not** be done, but the things that should be done. It says that activities on the Lord's Day "should include exercises of worship and spiritual devotion, both public and private." By "public and private" the BFM 2000 means that those things should happen every Sunday as believers gather together in their local churches and also in their

Although, as previously stated, the BFM 2000 is slow to tell us what must not be done on the Lord's Day, thoughtful Christians will necessarily forgo a great many good things so that they might observe the Lord's Day well. Just as a high schooler about to take the ACT should think twice before staying up late the night before, skipping breakfast, or trying to squeeze in activities before the test that could jeopardize their arrival or ability to give themselves fully to the test, Christians should give even greater attention to how they prepare and participate in the "market day of the soul."
