

### First Facts

### Don't Waste Your Summer

The days are getting longer and the heat is finally, undeniabley here. While summer offers unparalleled opportunities for both work and play. I am convinced that many people waste their summer or, at the very least, don't make full use of it. I don't mean most folks waste the opportunity to vacation. I don't mean they waste the opportunity to work on the yard, their tan or attend concerts, either. I mean they waste what is a unique opportunity to serve and grow. Here are just three encouragements to help you keep from wasting your summer:

- 1) **Prioritize gathering with God's People.** For most churches summer is the season with the largest drop off in attendance. While an annual vacation takes many Christians away one or maybe two Sundays during the summer, others seem to take nearly the entire summer off from church. This should not be. There is nothing wrong with students taking the summer off from school, but Christians should not take the summer off from gathering to worship. Hebrews 10:25 does not say "do not neglect the assembling of yourselves as is the habit of some, except in the summer ... " By failing to gather with the church you are putting your own spiritual health at risk, if you are a parent the spiritual health of your family, and you are robbing the church of your spiritual aifts.
- 2) Make use of the warm weather to engage the lost. Summer is an excellent opportunity to engage with the lost. It's harder to run into some folks during the winter, which is when many people hunker down and neighbors are rarely seen in their yards, but warmer weather means more people are out and about. People will be out mowing, grilling and washing their cars. People go to the store more frequently and visit parks and other public places. What if you capitalized on that? What if you used the warm weather as a chance to invite a neighbor over for a BBQ and then shared the gospel? What if you stopped by and struck up a conversation with a neighbor who is out mowing his lawn and then invited him to church? What if you began praying for the other moms you see regularly at the park and then strike up a gospel conversation? Be strategic.
- 3) Use the summer as an opportunity to serve. Summer is the time when many people take on major projects in the yard and around the house. Summer means power-washing, car washing, staining, painting, tree chopping, and more. Let me encourage you to use the summer, not just to serve your own needs, but to serve the needs of others. What if everyone in our church committed to adding a project for someone else to their summer "to-do list"? What if you agreed to mow a widow's yard this summer, or paint the shed of an elderly neighbor? What if you offered to assist a neighbor with building his deck or helped a single mom cut down a couple of dead trees? What if you used the good weather to show others the love of Jesus?

These are just a few ways you can make this summer a productive and God honoring one. I'm praying you don't waste it.





Although summer doesn't officially begin until later in the month, here we are ! I'm sure some are glad that the temperature is gradually climbing. Back-vard barbecues, folks fishing, some have their pools open, others going on vacation, and finally, life getting back to normal!

Speaking of vacation, VBS is upon us! Connie and I did A note "child care" for the homegrown disciples workshop, and it got me fired up for VBS! By the way, I put child care in from quotes because it was more like entertaining for over
