Activity Report 2019-2020

 Playschool for young children and Community Welfare Centre (A combined Educational and Health Care Initiative)

Project Address: New No. 4/198, Mariamman Koil Street Navapatty P.O., Navapatty Panchayat Mettur Taluk, Salem District Tamil Nadu – 636452

- 150 children (2 to 5 years of age) have been schooled in six years and sent to regular schools.
- Children were enrolled from 8 villages out of the 14 in Navapatty panchayat.
- 2500 Sq. Ft. working area.
- Two Office Bearers of the trust, in-house
- Educational materials provided in the study room:
 - o Pictorial books in Tamil and English languages
 - Math and number books
 - o Environmental science activity sheets
 - Handwriting books
 - o Slates, coloring and sketchbooks
 - o Nutritional information and elements of natural surroundings
- A play area was constructed and provided to give them an hour of the day between 10-11am to engage in games, physical activities, yoga, exercises and hygiene.
- The children were taken care of by 2 teachers, 1 matron, 1 cook and 1 helper to maintain the building. (6hrs per day,8am-2pm, 5 days per week.)
- Medical and healthcare were provided by an in-house doctor.
- Regular assessment and screening conducted for proper nutrition, hygiene and prescription medicines were provided to children, staff and their families, and village people.
- Administrative work was done by an office bearer.
- Routine for staff, subjects for children, eco walk, yoga, a modified syllabus to improve the
 overall development of children in a rural setting was studied, formed by the trust and
 initiated by an office bearer.
- Most of the children were transported by an auto-rickshaw hired by the centre within 2kms reach. Other children were accompanied by their parents.
- Parents' participation and response very good in the children's activities and progress.
- PTA meeting conducted with all parents. Various aspects of the children's behaviour, growth, methodology of schooling and progress were discussed and followed.
- Few children were sponsored for regular schools.
- Donors contributed to the school and healthcare activities regularly.
- Approx. 30000 consultations made in 6 years. 3000 consultations recorded for the year.
- The healthcare initiative catered mainly to the farming community. Others were manual labourers, drivers, school children from government institutions, workers, and staff from industrial establishments such as thermal station at mettur, weaving units from the community and neighboring villages of mettur.
- The problems were mostly generalized, common cold, fever, skin problems like fungus, eczema, psoriasis, vitiligo, lichen planus, insect-bite allergy, occupational and contact dermatological problems.

- Orthopedic problems, arthritis, soft tissue injuries, low back pain, cervical strains due to occupational disposition and aging were treated.
- Other medical problems like diabetes, hypertension, tuberculosis, chest infection, amoebiasis, worm infestations, eye infections, ENT problems, dental and gynecological problems were consulted, treated, medicines provided, referrals made on merit of case and few were sponsored for specialized management.
