FIRE FIGHTERS & FIRE STATION VISIT

October is Fire Safety Month. On Sept. 30 and Oct. 1 fire fighters will visit the 2s and 3s at school, outside the church garden entrance. Children will see the ladder truck and see a fire fighter put on his gear. We want children to feel safe around fire fighters so they do not run from them in an emergency.

On October 6 and 7 the 4s and Pre-K classes will visit Fire Station #2 downtown. Parents are welcome on this field trip. Please meet outside your child's classroom after drop-off. Then we will all walk as a group to the station at 9:45 a.m.



Ms. Amy's Science Update

We jumped into learning about germs and the importance of soap and washing our hands frequently at school. Children learned that germs can only be seen by a microscope. They were given pretend "glitter germs" so they could see them and practice washing their hands efficiently.

Pre-K and 4-year-old students are currently conducting an experiment with germs and bread: they have made predictions, are observing, and will see results of germs growing on bread soon.

We have started the study of our 5 senses: seeing, hearing, touching, smelling, and tasting. Last week, children practiced using their eyes to see and name their friends and items in the science room. Pre-K students made their own kaleidoscopes.

This week, children will try to identify different types of sounds just by using their ears. Later in the month, children will use their noses and tongues to smell and taste different items. These activities are always a favorite for students and teachers. Some children make the cutest facial expressions when they taste something sour.



SmartCare

Here are a few reminders for our childcare system:

- If you sign in before 9:10, you will be charged for Before Care.
- If you walk your child in or out of the building, please remember to sign them in or out at the SmartCare kiosk.
- If you use the carpool line teachers will sign your child in and out.
- People who pick up children on a regular basis should get their own QR code or key tag. Please see Ms. Nikki or Ms. Kim in the preschool office. Key tags do not require that you download the app to your phone.
- We charge a late fee for children who are picked up after 12:30 or 2:30 p.m. The fee is \$1 per minute.
