The Grateful Bread Mission

In September we will start a monthly mission to provide a meal to 65 homeless and low-income men and women at Safe Harbor in Easton.

This Grateful Bread Mission of RUMC is very similar to the Bridge Ministry mission many might remember from a few years ago. Those that wish to serve in this mission of love will be provided with a simple casserole type recipe and an aluminum casserole pan each month available in the narthex for pick up.

On the second Tuesday of each month we will all make the same recipe at home, provide a loaf of bread or maybe a salad or dessert, bring it to church and then it will be delivered to Safe Harbor for their staff to serve. Depending on the number of people who sign up to make a meal, you may only have to make a meal every other month or so. Don't cook but want to help? Volunteer to drop off the meal to Safe Harbor instead.

The first meal will be **Tuesday September 9**. Time will be provided later for drop off at the church. Please sign the sheet in the narthex by August 1 if you would like to take part in this fulfilling mission.

Safe Harbor is a program driven transitional shelter for the homeless and a place to help those who have difficulty in the tasks of everyday life. Please visit safeharboreaston.com to see all that is offered to assist these individuals.
