There is no indoor benching available. Plan on benching out of vehicles

November 25, 2023, 2 Trials– judging starts at 9:00 am for trial 1.

Limited Entries Day of Entry available if capacity is not reached move ups and lateral moves are allowed.

You will need to complete a separate form for **EACH** dog. Dogs must have a NASDA number prior to entering. This may be obtained from: <http://nasda.dog/registration/>.

NOTE: For all Level III and higher events, a handler may run only one dog. If you have multiple dogs you wish to compete with, you must list a different handler for them.

Entry Fees:

Before the closing date: \$30 per trial entry / \$20 per puppy aptitude test

After the closing date/day of (if available), \$35 per trial entry / \$25 per puppy aptitude test

All prices are in Canadian dollars.

Please note the prices, but **DO NOT PAY YET!**

Once our trial secretary has received your entry, you will receive a confirmation email. You must send payment within 48 hours of **that email**, or your trial spot will be given to someone else.

The North American Sport Dog Association has granted permission to hold these working dog trials under the NASDA rules.

Dog Eligibility:

Dogs of any breed or mixed breed, six months of age or older on the test date, may compete in Level 1 and above.

Dogs may enter concurrently in multiple levels in which they are eligible to compete.

For example, a dog with their Level I title of an event may run Level I and Level II in the same trial for that event.

Dogs of any breed or mixed breed, older than four months of age but younger than nine months, may compete in the Puppy Aptitude Test.

All dogs must be registered with NASDA to compete.

Deaf and/or blind dogs may compete in any event classes that are on leash.

Dogs with missing limbs or in wheelchairs are eligible to compete, provided they have a veterinary or physiotherapist note and do not appear to be in pain.

The judge may accept veterinary or physiotherapist notes as proof of soundness, providing the dog does not appear visibly in pain.

Bitches in Season:

Bitches in Season will be permitted to compete. Bitches in season must compete at the end of the class and wear britches. Please let the trial chair know a week prior to the trial if this occurs.

Rules:

PASE reserves the right to remove any individual for any reason from the premises. Corrections, harsh training methods, abusive behavior towards dogs or people, and corrective equipment will not be tolerated. No refunds will be issued.

Quarry:



Gerbils will be used as a quarry in order to comply with Alberta laws. Care of the quarry is of the utmost importance to the judge, the host and the organization. Please follow all

rules and judge's directions regarding the quarry. Refusing to do this may result in you being removed from the trial with no refunds.

PASE reserves the right to not allow dogs to compete in quarry events without a muzzle if the team has been advised at a prior event that they must wear a muzzle due to how hard the dog hits/works the quarry box.

Awards:

Awards will be handed out at the conclusion of the trial. Ribbons are awarded for qualifying score, Best of Breed and High in Class. New title ribbons will be awarded.

Refunds:

No entries will be cancelled or refunded without a veterinarian's certificate. No refunds will be made for cancellations after the closing date or entries which are absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the decision of the Trial Host or judge(s).

General Notice to Exhibitors:

Information about any changes in COVID protocols will be sent with information on run orders approximately a week before the trial. If you feel sick, you will be asked to wear a mask indoors. Masks will be provided on-site.

Refunds will be mailed seven days after the event.

No refunds will be made for dogs dismissed on the day of the trial for having sutures, open wounds or are visibly lame. The judge's decision is final in these cases, even if a veterinary or physiotherapy note is presented.

No refunds will be made for cancellations after the closing date or entries which are absent, disqualified, excused or barred from competition by the decision of the Trial Host.

Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate and legible information on their entry forms.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behaviour of their dogs, children and/or guests. Any exhibitor whose dogs, children and/or guests repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour may be asked to leave the trial site



at the discretion of the Trial Committee. In such a case, no refund on any entry will be made.

All dogs must be penned, crated or on a leash when not in the ring. All dogs must be under control when they leave the ring after their run. Any dog engaging in aggressive or out-of-control behaviour when leaving the ring will be disqualified and/or required to leave the trial site. **NO REFUND** of fees will be paid.

Exhibitors are responsible for being in the waiting area when it is their turn to run.

PASE reserves the right to refuse any entry without cause or explanation.

Equipment:

If competing on lead, dogs must wear a flat buckle or snap collar. Harnesses that are fixed – for example tracking or body harnesses are also permitted. Leashes should be long enough to provide adequate slack.

Martingale and slip collars may be used on the grounds but may not be utilized during an on-lead search. Head halters, prong collars, moving harnesses (such as “no-pull” harnesses) and any harnesses that are designed to be correctional are not allowed. Electronic collars which provide vibration, shock, sound, or spray/chemical corrections are not permitted on trial grounds, however, GPS and location collars are permitted on course. Judges may request proof or to examine the collar should questions arise.



Please respect the venue and ensure you are cleaning up after your dog.
