

## ART REQUIREMENTS | OFFSET/DIGITAL

- I recommend saving as a .PDF with fonts either embedded or outlined.
- You may also send the file in the following types: JPG, JPEG, TIF, TIFF, EPS, and PNG.
- · All files must be @ 300DPI or better.
- · Bleeds should be set @ 0.125" us"
- PDF files are much easier to handle & will likely speed up your turn time.
- · Remember to flatten your files before uploading.
- · Save your artwork in CMYK. Printing with RGB can have unexpected results (color shift)
- · Avoid using scanned images or objects (this goes for letterpress files too)

## ART REQUIREMENTS | LETTERPRESS

- Whenever possible, use VECTOR art. This format works best for spot colors.
- · Always separate colors into layers whenever possible (this will reduce any potential design fees)
- Specify colors with a Pantone Solid Uncoated reference number.
- Acceptable file formats inlude: .AI | .EPS | .PDF (with illustrator editing enabled)
- · If you can't get your hands on these types of files, you can use .TIF (BITMAP @ 300 DPI+)
- DO NOT USE .JPG! Just don't. I can't stress this enough.
- When using halftone, set linescreen @ 100 DPI
- Outline ALL fonts in your file before sending. This will resolve any font conlicts.
- Trim (crop) marks are very helpful.
- If your project requires bleed, they should be 0.125" (1/8")

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## TIPS

- When designing, keep in mind that each color gets its own pass through the press so overprinting can creating some interesting results.
- · lnks lack opacity so light colors on dark stocks will create problems, some metallic inks can resolve this or you can FOIL STAMP.
