BE IN THE KNOW REGARDING GARAGE SALES IN THE COMMUNITY

Dear Kirkwood Homeowner.

One of the questions we're often asked is how many garage sales can a resident have? The answer is two garage sales per year under Texas Law. The Limited Sales, Excise, and Use Tax Law says that people who are not operating a business are permitted to have no more than two sales of their goods each year. If you exceed this amount, you will be treated as operating a business, and you'll need to obtain a sales tax permit from the state. And generally, businesses that are "selling tangible personal property or providing taxable services in Texas to customers in Texas must obtain a sales tax permit. Please note, this information is not intended as legal advice but to provide a general understanding of the law regarding these types of sales. HOW TO TRIM CRAPE MYRTLES

Though many people plant crape myrtles, few people prune them correctly. Correct pruning yields gracefully shaped trees with more blooms that are held upright on strong stems. And flowers arrive earlier than do those on unpruned or mispruned plants. So, here's some tips for trimming crape myrtles:

Crape myrtles bloom on new growth, so prune them in early spring before they break dormancy. Although some gardeners prune their crape myrtles in the fall, many don't recommend doing this. Fall pruning not only creates an unattractive look for winter but also removes the current year's growth as a buffer against any potential winter damage. Good pruning while crape myrtles are young will mean less maintenance when the trees are older.

Start at the bottom of crape myrtles and prune back suckers and additional trunks. For most crape myrtles, choose three, five, or—at most—seven main trunks. An odd number of trunks is more pleasing to the eye than an even number, which often looks like soldiers in formation.

Remove low branches. Branching should begin 6-8 feet off the ground. It looks better and is more practical.

Remember, to thin the crown. The upper branches look best if they spread in different directions, so remove any that are growing into an area already occupied by another branch. Make your cuts slightly above a bud that faces the direction in which you want your new branch to grow. Prune unwanted low branches all the way back to the main trunk. Your final cuts will be to prune out any branches or stems smaller in diameter than a pencil. Leaving wood that small on the tree results in weak new growth, which will have a difficult time supporting any flowers.

HOME SAFETY TIP:

EXTERIOR LIGHTING WORKS TO REPEL CRIMINALS

Exterior home lighting has been found to aid in reducing the likelihood of your vehicle or home falling victim to intrusion. Criminals don't like to be seen especially at night.

Does your home have proper and adequate exterior lighting? There are different types of lighting used on the exterior of a home; landscaping lighting, architectural accent lighting, and security lighting. Don't let your home be a good target for criminals.

Also, remember to take all personal belongings out of your vehicles for the night. Lock all doors and roll up all windows and turn on outside lights at home at night.

How To Reduce The Number Of Mosquitos

• Remove standing water - This is one of the most important things you can do to minimize the number of mosquitos. Standing water is a major contributor to mosquito problems, because it is where adult mosquitoes typically lay their eggs. Make sure you remove standing water from bird baths, ponds, outdoor storage areas and small swimming pools.



- Check EVERYTHING! Mosquitoes like to get tricky. So, spots that you wouldn't even expect mosquitoes to reside are still major potential breeding grounds. This includes children's sandboxes, dog bowls, grill covers, tarps, old firewood, and even plant/flower pots. What do all these secret hiding spots have in common? They can hold leftover excess water. This also means that your gutters are one of the most troublesome hot spots for mosquitoes. Make sure to have them cleaned regularly and often by a professional; especially after it rains.
- Take care of your yard Mosquitoes love to inhabit cool areas with shade. This means you can usually find them hiding under plant leaves and in tall grass. A properly maintained yard, free of weeds and overgrown plants can be a huge help in reducing the number of mosquitoes you have.

Spring Lawn Tips

Stop summer weeds: Don't let weeds ruin the look of your lawn. Spread a pre-emergence herbicide to stop them before they sprout. Apply the pre-emergence product in Spring for best results.

Begin mowing: Start mowing your lawn as it begins to grow in mid-to-late spring. Don't let thatch build up. Thatch prevents air, water, and nutrients from getting to your lawn's root system.

Fertilizing: Fertilizer can help your lawn grow thick and lush, but if it's not used properly, it can actually damage the grass. A slow-release nitrogen fertilizer is best, and it should be applied early in the season when the turf begins actively growing. Check the packaging to see when and how you should apply it.
