Sarah's Story



Children's Dental Health Services received a phone call from a single mom, Sarah. Sarah shared that she had been struggling to find a dentist to treat her 5 children, ranging in age from 3 to 14 years old. CDHS staff was able to help Sarah register her school-age children to receive preventative care at their school's dental clinic, and her younger children were seen at a public health clinic. At the time of their preventative care visits, 4 of the 5 children were found to have extensive treatment needs and referred to our dentist. As a single mother, Sarah faces several barriers to finding time for dentist appointments.

Our staff worked with her to schedule appointments for multiple children each day. Additionally, our dentist provided as many treatment procedures as possible per appointment in an effort to assist Sarah's busy schedule and transportation needs. After a few restorative appointments, all 5 of Sarah's children have happy, healthy mouths because of our programs reducing barriers and improving access to dental care for their family. Sarah's school-age children will no longer contribute to the over 51 million hours of school that are lost each year to dental disease.

Unfortunately, stories like this one are far too common and just further reinforce the need to have such an important school based preventative and restorative dental program available to provide access and eliminate barriers for underserved children. In this case, it was a success; however, if we were unable to see Sarah's children as quickly as we did, this story may not have turned out to be so positive.

Oral Health Facts



YOUR SMILE IS IMPORTANT

Tooth decay is the #1 chronic illness in America
Untreated infections from tooth decay can spread to other parts of
the body and have serious, possibly life-threatening results.

- 1. **Dental disease is caused by bacteria** that dissolves tooth enamel and infect tooth pulp and other soft tissue.
- 2.1 in 5 U.S. children lack routine dental care. It is the most common unmet healthcare need for children with disabilities.
- 3. Dental Emergencies cost 34 million hours of missed school
- 4. **The annual cost** of dental visits to the Emergency Dept is \$2 billion.
- 5. More than 40% of Children have cavities by the time they reach kindergarten
- 6. Children with poor oral health are 3 times more likely to miss school because of dental pain.
- 7.30% of young adults surveyed said the appearance of thier mouth has negatively affected job interviews.
- 8. **47% of adults** over the age of 30 have some form of gum disease.
