IN MEMORY OF LEO MAREN III

It is with great sadness, that I am writing about the passing of a beloved member of the Professional Car Society and of our very own Northeast Chapter. Leo died suddenly and unexpectedly at his home in Stirling, New Jersey on September 4, 2014.

Details of Leo's passing are not known to me, however, there is some speculation that his death was related to his very long battle with diabetes. I spoke with Leo's mother and she told me that she had spoken with Leo on Monday, just a few days prior to his passing and she had no idea that he was sick, or in danger.

Although I am uncertain of the exact year Leo joined the PCS, he was already a long time member when I joined, way back in the Fall of 1993. Leo was one of the first people to introduce himself to me and welcome me to the PCS, as I attended my first Northeast Chapter meeting that day. After my initial meeting with him, I had the pleasure of working with Leo a number of times through the ensuing years. Leo Maren served as Northeast Chapter President for a number of years. He also served as the 1999 International Meet Chairman and once again as International Meet Chair in 2008.

Perhaps best remembered for his participation at PCS shows, meets and other events, driving his silver over red 1974 Miller Meteor Cadillac Criterion ambulance, it is easy to overlook the other important parts of Leo's short life. Born in Jersey City on March 8, 1959, he was one of four brothers. Leo worked for Verizon for over twenty five years. He was also a certified EMT for the Long Hill First Aid Squad for many years. Leo had family and friends who will miss him dearly. There have been countlessloving comments written about Leo Maren, both on the PCS Message Board and in the electronic guest book at the Valley Funeral Home website. It is plain to see that Leo Maren III touched many lives in his fifty five years here on Earth.
