The Other Coin: Iconic Coins



ANA is celebrating National Coin Week by heralding

the US Mint's six coin series of DC comics superheroes. Superman will be on ½ ounce gold \$50 coins, 2½ oz. ounce and 1 oz. silver medals, and 1.2-inch clad medals, all in a proof finish. Above is the recommended design with Superman on the Kent farm. Unlike similar coins minted around the world by private and national mints, it appears the coins will not be colorized and not be issued as circulating coins. Canada, Australia, Great Britain, Poland, Austria, and most other national mints as well as private mints have promoted commemorative and circulating coins with images from comics, movies, books, and cartoon shows. Currently there are series for James Bond, Simpsons, Star Wars, Harry Potter, Chinese New Year, WWI and WWII, and much more.





Perth (Australia) mint usually makes iconic bullion and colorized iconic coins. Britain usually has circulation coins as well (10 pence coin right). Britain and Commonwealth have the advantage of having to design only the reverse as the monarch will be on obverse. The recent Star Wars series from the Royal Mint was produced in gold, silver, colorized or not and a circulating 50 pence coin.

2019 brought a plethora of WWI commemorative and circulating coins from the Commonwealth nations and France, but Russia still wins for its every five year set of WWII commemorative mostly circulating coins. Russia was portrayed every battle, weapon

Reverse is Athena Promachus (fighting on the front line) with spear and shield, helmet and Lagid eagle before. Medal for Field Marshall Paul von





Hindenburg's 1914 victory over the Russians in East Prussia in the Battle of Tannenburg. He is standing naked over the Russian bear.





An electrotype 1794 silver dollar from the British Museum mid 1830s. Along with the Ashmolean Museum tens of thousands of different electrotypes were made from 1836-1931 by Robert Ready and his sons for collectors, other museums, and teaching institutions. Much like chemical 3D printing, thin

microscopic layers of metal are placed on a mold. An electro-chemical process creates the desired thickness, then the reverse and obverse molds are put together, leaving a seam, but making a much more detailed copy.



The process replaced casting in molds. I have a British Museum electrotype of the famous Syracuse tetradrachm. This is a superior copy than a coin made in



a mold or struck on Russian or Chinese press because it keeps all the detail of a hand struck coin and hand engraved die. The Crown Coin is the most valuable coin the most valuable coin in the world with 6,426

natural diamonds estimated to weigh over 475 carats and nearly 8 pounds of gold. It was made for Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee and is now presented as

a memorial after her death. With a diameter of over 9.6 inches, a collection of 11 24-carat gold coins, with the centerpiece coin weighing in at over 2 pounds. Six of the surrounding coins represent the guiding virtues as seen on the Victoria Memorial outside of Buckingham Palace: courage, justice, truth, victory, charity, and consistency. The five others chronologically showcase the Queen's portrait. On one side, the abundance of diamonds is arranged to simulate the United Kingdom's flag while the other side follow the designs of the late monarch's intricate tiaras. The one-of-a-kind commemorative piece is engraved with quotes from Queen Elizabeth. One side reads, "With age comes experience and that can be a virtue if properly used. By being willing to put past differences behind us and move forward together." On the other, the border includes an inscription from her first televised broadcast in 1957, "Throughout all my life and with all my heart I will strive to be worthy of your trust. The things I have here before promised I will perform and keep so help me God." The coin is valued at \$23 million dollars.

And a toned silver John Howard at Cowpens. The first American decoration for valor in battle, awarded to Colonel John Armstrong and his officers after the destruction of the Native American village of





Kittanning in 1756. The medal's obverse depicts the City of Philadelphia's shield of arms, and the reverse shows the burning village of Kittanning, Armstrong with a rifle, and two guards, along with the inscription "Kittanning Destroyed by Coll. Armstrong, September 8 / 1756." The original medals were made from smoothed Pillar 8 reales coins and were awarded to the veterans of the raid. The US Mint later produced restrikes of the medal from the original dies. **President** Trump and the Elon Musk-led Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) have now targeted the San Francisco Mint for closure in a bid to sell the real estate in San Francisco. The Bavarian Mint is making a bid to establish German bullion coins, which Germany as a whole does not have. Bavaria is hoping the standardization of one ounce silver and gold coins with Neuschwanstein Castle will become popular. It is a model for Disneyland castles.
