The Other Coin: Scottish Coins

As I have mentioned before my family came over from Scotland in 1640. They were Lowland Presbyterian Scots originally from Argyll, a Cowan sept of the MacDougall rather than Colquhoun. We departed from Fife. The Boston Puritans threw us out to western Massachusetts, and we made our way to Pennsylvania. Despite our long residence in America, we kept up the tradition of the MacDougall clan being on the wrong side of every battle. Of the thousands of Cowans not a one fought in the Revolution. All were Tories and many left West or went to Canada after the Revolution.

My grandmother was from the Hebrides, insisting she was Swedish, but she was doubly wrong. Her "Swedish" Viking forebears were Finnish and arrived around 1000 AD, so hundreds of years in Northern Scotland makes you Scottish. A Scottish 2 pence



1632-1639. Charles, by the grace of God, King of Scotland, England, France, and Ireland in Latin abbreviations// thistle, nemo me impune lacessit (No one provokes me with impunity). From c. 1124 until 1709, the coinage of Scotland was unique and minted locally. The first king of Scots to produce his own coinage was David I (r. 1124–1153). In 1136 he captured Carlisle, including its English mint and nearby silver mines from Stephen, King of England.

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Instead of head facing, the Scots had profile left with scepter before. David by grace of God// King of Scots, long cross and stars. Robert III continued to devalue Scottish coins, making them worth one-half of their English counterparts by 1392. He also replaced the profile bust on the obverse of Scottish coins with a facing head, which made his coins much easier to confuse with the more valuable English issues. Robert III (1390-1406) successfully



introduced the gold lion crest, which showed St. Andrew crucified on his saltire (X)-shaped cross xpc : regnat : xpc : vincit : xpc : imperat Christ (the king) reigns, Christ conquers, Christ (the king of kings or emperor) rules. He also imitated the English coins with facing bust to try to get them passed with about half the silver. Robert by grace of God, King



of the Scots//God is my Defender and my Redeemer, City of Edinburgh. James III (1460-1488) adopted French models for coins quoting from the Psalms 68:1 Let God arise and let his enemies be scattered. Crosses fleury and star with rays. James VI (James I



Of England, 1603-1625) melted down all the old coins replacing them with the thistle merk in several denominations. Reverse; Jehova protects the



the King 1601. In 1604, the year after the Union of the Crowns, the Council ordered Scotland to use the same coinage standards as England. The mint at Edinburgh remained open. Melting all the old coins that could be gathered made Scottish coins rare, but the coins were often cut in half or quarters, which are affordable. There is also some copper coinage officially minted or privately minted beginning with James VI.

Silver for early Viking coins came from melted Islamic coins. Minted on Jutland island c.840. Odin



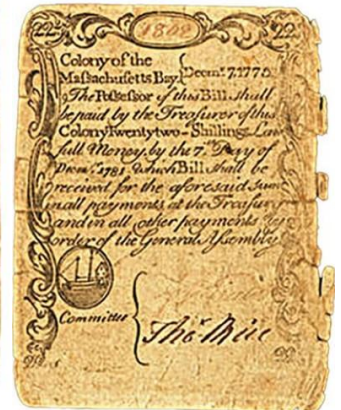
