1829 medal commemorating Netherland's William I attempt to fix the border between US and Canada, which failed, but became the basis of the 1842 land border with the river and water boundaries in dispute until 1925. Archaeologists from the



Russian Academy of Sciences found a **hoard of 409 gold coins in Russia's Tver Region**, dating from 1848 to 1911. Probably a small fortune hidden and not retrieved for some reason.

America's first quarter with a total of 6,146 coins minted designed to have the same silver content as the Spanish 2 reales. Sophie Downing, 29, was given what



she thought was a £10 coffee shop voucher for Christmas. But she discovered **the balance on the gift card totaled more than £63 quadrillion** when using it to buy a matcha latte last week. That's 63 with 15 zeros. Or a thousand trillion. Or a million billion. Coin of the Year nominations start with **Austria's Hippocampus coin** getting an early nod. Very nice under black light.



And Trump is still trying to get the US Mint to issue a gold coin for the Semiquincentennial with him standing behind the oval office desk. CCAC is resisting and slowing all the coinage decisions. Trump is insisting the he is not wanting a bust like a monarch, but is standing. Calvin Coolidge issued a coin with a bust during his presidency. The never ending fight continues and July 4th is nearing.

ANA is on Instagram now as **americannusmatic** displaying a series of colonial coins. Other countries like Liberia and France are celebrating our **Founding Fathers**. Liberia offers colored and silver



plated coins of Founding Fathers. France offers restrikes of a 1784 medal in silver or gold with Benjamin Franklin. Reverse reads in Latin: *He snatched the thunderbolt from the sky and the scepter from the tyrants*. The Paris Mint has also made restrikes of the Libertas Americana and other Revolutionary War coins. With more than 18,000 listings of coins, tokens, medals, sets, and related collectibles; over 100,000 market values in up to 13 collectible grades powered by Greysheet; a streamlined, collector-friendly design; and more than 1,000 pages of authoritative content, **Mega Red X is out \$70 paper, \$100 hard cover.**

Congress has passed a bill for a \$2.50 2026 restrike of the 1926 Sesquicentennial coin design with the image of allegorical liberty, displaying the Declaration of Independence and holding a torch. On the back will be the image of Independence Hall as it was displayed on the 150th anniversary coin. The senate needs to act.



A silver medal for 342-mile race in 1904 with bust of King William II and rising sun over cityscape of Bad Homburg// (*Deutscher Automobilclub*) DAC monogram; Genius, holding torch, driving antique automobile right; to left, Victory standing right at back of auto. Bronze medal 1918 celebrating **President**



Wilson's speech before congress in which he outlined his Fourteen Points, a postwar plan for peace in Europe. Allies widely distributed copies of the speech behind German lines to encourage Germany to surrender, with the expectation that fair terms would be reached. The terms of surrender ultimately changed, however, and called for crushing penalties that shocked Germans and inspired Goetz to create this satirical medal and lead to WWII. President Wilson as Moses with tablet. "Wilson's Message"//Eagle with tablet and scales of justice "Program of World Peace."
