April 15, 2018 Third Sunday of Easter First Reading. Acts 3:13-15, 17-19 Second Reading. 1Jn 2:1-5a Gospel. Lk 24:35-48

"Peace be with you."

Our Easter liturgies recall many accounts describing the experience of the original disciples of Jesus as they found Faith through their encounter with their Risen Lord. These stories are heard by us like a family group that is listening to one another, sharing personal recollections of a past event that meant a great deal to the whole family. Given from different points of view, these different Gospel accounts bring a far fully appreciation of what took place.

Last Sunday we heard the story as it was recalled in the community of John's gospel. Today, we hear Luke's account of the disciples' meeting with the Risen Savior. From all these accounts a coherent story emerges that invites the Church of every age to share in the original moment of Resurrection faith: the disciples are confused and frightened; when Jesus comes into their midst, finding faith in him is not easy and immediate; his greeting, however, and his loving acceptance of them into his abiding friendship brings them a great joy, and they find full faith in him; he charges them with the mission of bringing to the whole world the good news of their Resurrection faith and the 'forgiveness of sins' it brings.

In today's world of confused moral values, who is to judge the moral guilt of many things that are done? But if what is done is a turning away from the light to darkness, from what leads to life to what leads to death, it is sinful in the sense that it is an aberration that has destructive consequences from which only God can save us.

Our mission is to bring liberation from sinfulness in all its forms, by sharing the light and life of the Risen Lord with our struggling world.

The Sacrament of Confirmation

Today a group of young people from our Parish will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. I still encounter many adults who "fell through the cracks" and missed the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is never too late to be confirmed! Why is it important to be confirmed after being properly prepared for it?

In Baptism we begin to live a supernatural life. As we practice the virtues of faith, hope and love, and as we unite with Christ in His Church in offering worship to God, we also grow in grace and goodness.

But at this stage our spiritual life, like the life of a child, is largely self-centered. We tend to be preoccupied with the needs of our own soul, with the effort to "be good." But we cannot continue to be self-centered, to live a religious life revolving around self.

The Sacrament of Confirmation is about "living for others."

In this Sacrament, we receive a special grace by which our faith is deepened and strengthened, so that it will be strong enough not only for our own needs but for the needs of others with whom we shall try to share it.

With the onset of adolescence, a child begins to assume, progressively, the responsibilities of adulthood. He begins to see his place in the total family picture and in the community at large. It is in this sense that Confirmation is a spiritual "growing up."

In order that we may have such a concern for Church and neighbor, in deed as well as in feeling, the sacrament of Confirmation gives us a special grace, a special power and makes us sharers with Christ in His role of prophet or teacher.

The "adult Christian" now participates with Him in the task of extending His kingdom, of adding new souls to His Mystical Body. Our words and our works are directed not merely to our own sanctification but also to the purpose of making Christ's truths alive and real for those around us.
