The Baptism of the Lord

First Reading. Is. 40: 15. 9-11

Second Reading. Tim 2:11-14; 3:4-7

Gospel. Lk 3: 15-16. 22-22

Reflecting on our own baptism

Today is an opportunity for all of us to reflect on our own baptism. It is not something which happened a long time and which “made” us Catholics. It is not just a ceremony lasting a few minutes which produces magical effects; it is the beginning of a lifelong journey. It is the beginning of a process of growing into the Body of Christ as its members.

Our baptism is essentially a community experience; it is not just a private or a family event although in the way it was “celebrated” it may have looked like that. It involves active participation in the life of the Church and not just passive membership.

Perhaps we could paraphrase the words of John F. Kennedy in his inaugural address: “Ask not what the Church can do for you but what you can do for the Church.”

Each one of us is called to be a living witness to the Gospel: to be the salt of the earth, a city on a hill, a lamp radiating light for all. Our baptism is a never-ending call to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Every word of Isaiah can also be applied to each one of us who has been baptized. So, let us today renew our faith in and our commitment to follow Jesus. Let us re-affirm our readiness to carry on his work.

For it is a sobering fact that without our co-operation, much of God’s work will never get done.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

This Friday we will begin the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. It is our yearly celebration made up of **reflection and prayer** to remind Christians that the restoration of full unity among us, according to the will of Jesus, involves every baptized person, both pastors as well as the faithful.

The Week takes place after the promulgation of the Second Vatican Council's decree "Unitatis Redintegratio," which has placed the Catholic Church firmly in the line of the ecumenical movement.

This week celebrates a fundamental truth: that Christ is the foundation of the Church. The Council strongly recommended prayer for unity as the soul of the whole ecumenical movement. Given that the reconciliation of Christians surpasses "human powers and capacities", prayer gives expression to “hope that does not disappoint”, to trust in the Lord who “makes all things new”.

But prayer must be accompanied by purification of the mind, the feelings and the memory. Thus, it becomes an expression of that "inner conversion," without which there is no true ecumenism. In a word, **unity is a gift of God**, a gift to be tirelessly implored with humility and truth.

The desire for Christian unity is spreading and deepening, touching new environments and contexts, arousing fervor for works, initiatives and reflections. Lately, the Lord has enabled his disciples to engage in important contacts of dialogue and collaboration. The pain of separation is felt with ever-greater intensity, given the challenges of a world that awaits a clear and unanimous evangelical testimony on the part of all believers in Christ.

The week will conclude on January 25, feast of the conversion of St. Paul, Apostle.
