NY ABLE

An ABLE account is a special type of savings account specifically created to meet the needs of people with intellectual/developmental disabilities. Often depending on a variety of public assistance programs (Medicaid, SSI, etc.) that have eligibility limitations based on income and/or savings, ABLE accounts allow individuals with I/DD to save for the future while remaining eligible for these public benefits. They allow savings to accumulate on a tax-deferred basis and be withdrawn tax-free for expenses related to his/her disability.

Westchester Jewish Community Services (WJCS): Parent Management Training (PMT)

This evidence-based group, developed at the Yale Child Study Center, has been shown to be effective in decreasing oppositional, antisocial, and aggressive behaviors by training parents to manage their child's behaviors in home and at school. Glossary of Terms in Special Education



Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) - the practice of applying the psychological principles of learning theory in a systematic way to modify behavior, used often for special education and therapeutically with individuals with autism spectrum disorder.

Augmentative and Assistive Communication (AAC) - all ways someone can communicate besides talking. Includes no-tech, low-tech, and high-tech options.

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) - a 1990 law prohibiting discrimination against individuals with disabilities in all areas of public life, including jobs, schools, and transportation.

Attention Deficit (Hyperactivity) Disorder - disorder marked by ongoing patterns of inattention and/or hyperactivity-impulsivity interfering with functioning or development.

Activities of Daily Living (ADLs) - a series of basic activities necessary for independent living at home or in the community, performed on a daily basis (e.g., personal hygiene, dressing, eating, mobility, etc.).

Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) - a developmental disability that causes significant social, communication, and behavioral challenges. ASD is viewed on a spectrum due to the wide variation in the type/severity of symptoms and strengths from person-to-person.

Assistive Technology (AT) - items, equipment, software, or devices used for people with disabilities or the elderly population.

Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP) - a written improvement plan created for a student based on the outcome of a functional behavior assessment in order to increase appropriate behavior and decrease inappropriate/ unwanted behaviors using reinforcement strategies.

Behavior Intervention Specialist (BIS) - works with children using positive behavior supports and coordinating functional behavior assessments and behavior intervention plans.

Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) - a professional who studies the behavior of children and adults and creates plans to improve or change problematic behaviors and work toward behavior goals using applied behavior analysis.

Glossary of Terms in Special Education



Board of Cooperative Education Services (BOCES) - provides shared educational programs and services to school districts within New York State. BOCES programs help meet students' educational needs through relevant programs.

Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) - a form of psychological treatment (talk therapy) effective for a range of psychological problems by promoting awareness of inaccurate and negative thinking and efforts to change thinking patterns.

Competency-Based Training (CBT) - an approach to vocational education and training emphasizing what a person can do in the workplace following a training program.

Cerebral Palsy (CP) - a congenital disorder marked by movement, muscle tone, and posture disorder and/or other disabilities, typically caused by damage to the brain before/during birth.

Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE) - a multidisciplinary team appointed by the Board of Education in each NY school district to identify and evaluate 3-4-year-old children who have special educational needs, determine eligibility for preschool special education programs, develop Individualized Education Plans (IEPs), place students in the least restrictive environment, and aid in the transition process to the school district.

Committee on Special Education (CSE) - a multidisciplinary team appointed by the Board of Education in each NY school district to identify and evaluate school-age children (ages 5-21) who have special educational needs, determine eligibility for preschool special education programs, develop Individualized Education Plans (IEPs), and place students in the least restrictive environment.

Crisis Services for Individuals with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities (CSIDD) - offers crisis prevention and response services to those with developmental disabilities and complex behavior needs, as well as their families/caregivers. Services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to OPWDD eligible individuals age 6+.

Community Transition Services (CTS) - individualized services intended to assist a person's transition from an inpatient/intensive program to living in the community.

Glossary of Terms in Special Education



Developmental Disability (DD) - a group of conditions due to impairment in physical, learning, language, and/or behavior areas, beginning during the developmental period and impacting day-to-day functioning.

Direct Support Professional (DSP) - someone who works directly with people who have intellectual and/or developmental disabilities.

Early Intervention (EI) - services and supports available to children from birth to age three who have developmental delays or disabilities, or to those at high risk for child abuse/neglect. Services can include speech, occupational, physical, and psychological therapies, home visits, hearing/vision services, medical/nursing/nutrition services, social work services, transportation, and assistive technology.

Fetal Alcohol Syndrome (FAS) - a disorder caused by alcohol exposure in the womb which causes distinctive facial features, learning disabilities, bone/joint deformities, heart defects, and/or hyperactivity.

Family Support Services (FSS) - services offered by OPWDD to help families who care for a relative with developmental disabilities at home by providing aid, enhancing family stability, and preserving family unity.

InterAgency Council of Developmental Disabilities Agencies, Inc (IAC) - the largest provider association in NY for non-profit agencies that support individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities by providing services and supports to these individuals.

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) - a law that ensures free and appropriate public education to children with disabilities throughout the nation and ensures special education and related services to those children.

Individualized Education Program (IEP) - a legal document outlining the special education experience for all eligible students with a disability. This document is developed to ensure a child identified with a disability attending an educational institute receives specialized instruction and related services appropriate to their specific learning needs.

Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) - a plan to obtain special education services for children from birth to age three, protected by IDEA. A precursor document to the IEP.

Glossary of Terms in Special Education



Individualized Life Plan - a document outlining a person with a disability's goals, strengths, preferences, clinical and support needs, services and providers, safeguards, and habilitation goals.

Independent Living Centers (ILCs) - centers which provide various services to assist New Yorkers with disabilities in living fully integrated and self-directed lives by assisting with all aspects of living, learning, and earning.

Individual Support Services (ISS) - provides housing subsidies to assist individuals with developmental disabilities who wish to live independently in the community with housing costs

Learning Disability (LD) - a condition causing difficulties in acquiring knowledge and skills to the level expected of those at the same age

Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) - a legal found in IDEA to ensure that "to the maximum extent appropriate, children with disabilities are educated with children who are not disabled" and that special classes/separate environments are considered only after a determination that placement in regular classrooms with modifications and supports will not adequately meet their educational needs.

Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) - an agency dedicated to improving the integration of services for NY's children, youth, families, and vulnerable populations by promoting safety, permanency, and well-being through policies, partnerships, funding, and quality services.

Office of Mental Health (OMH) - agency which promotes the mental health of all NY residents, with a focus on providing hope and recovery for adults with serious mental illness and children with serious emotional disturbances.

Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) - responsible for coordinating services for New Yorkers with developmental disabilities, providing services directly and working with a network of nonprofits to provide services.

Occupational Therapy (OT) - therapy to improve fine motor skills, balance, coordination, sensory integration, and motor skills involved in everyday tasks like writing and getting dressed.

Physical Therapy (PT) - therapy to help improve gross motor skills, range of motion, strength, flexibility, and movement patterns due to bone/muscle issues, injury, or genetic, brain, spine, or nerve disorders.

Glossary of Terms in Special Education



Prader-Willi Syndrome (PWS) - a genetic disorder which causes intellectual disability, behavior problems, and short stature.

Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) - a paraprofessional certification in behavior analysis. RBTs assist in delivering ABA services and practice under an RBT supervisor, usually a BCBA.

Speech & Language Pathology/Therapy (SLP) - therapy delivered to treat speech and language disorders, including areas such as articulation, fluency, resonance, expressive language, receptive language, and cognitive-communication. Some speech therapy services also address oral-motor and feeding/swallowing issues.

Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) - caused by sudden injuries that cause damage to the brain.

Westchester Institute for Human Development (WIHD) - an institute addressing major social and health issues affecting people with disabilities and vulnerable children by delivering medical, clinical, and support services to individuals, families, and caregivers.

YAI - Formerly Young Adult Institute, currently goes by "YAI" since they support people from childhood onward, YAI and its network of affiliate agencies offer children and adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities a comprehensive range of services.

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Parkside Preschool is a private, not-for-profit, New York State Department of Education approved preschool program for children ages three-to-five-years with special needs.
