PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD

During Lent there will be a **display in front of church** to help us visualize the Passion of our Lord in a tangible and intimate way. Each week the display will have elements added to it depicting those last days of our Lord and Savior. It begins with the two beams that made up the cross on which Jesus was crucified and will end with a glorious empty cross — reminding us that Jesus suffered and died for us but did not stay dead!

For March 28: John 19:39-40a
Later, knowing that all was now completed, and so that the scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I am thirsty." A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips. When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished."

For Good Friday: John 3:14-15
(see also Numbers 21:8-9)
Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life.

For Easter! Matthew 28:2-6
There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men. The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay."


Q: Why is Jesus called "Christ," meaning "anointed?"
