♦ Honorary President for 2018-2020, Marlene Herman (1958B)

♦ Honorary Life Member, Linda Pastetnik (1972B), a most



deserving Alumni member was also added to our "Honoured 10". Linda was nominated by her peers for her exceptional nursing expertise as well as her role in orchestrating the Reunion Homecoming dinner & luncheon for the past 21 years! Linda's contributions were recognized in the presence of her family and class mates celebrating their 45th reunion at the Homecoming dinner.

♦ In Memory of Audrey Lay Class of 1948 Jan. 1927- Sept. 2018

We were saddened to hear of the passing of Audrey Lay. Audrey was an enlightened and empowered woman - from choosing her profession, knowing when to retire and when to die with dignity. Following graduation from the WGH School of Nursing, she spent her entire nursing career at the WGH, retiring in



1977. She volunteered for many years in executive positions with the Alumni and was awarded Honorary Life Membership in 2004. Last May, she celebrated her 70th Nursing reunion with classmates and family, including her daughter from the class of 72B. She will be missed by her family and many friends.

◆ Celebration of Christine Byquist, Class of 1945

Christine Byquist is an Alumni member whose impact on our nursing history is inspiring! In addition to her 30 year career as a PHN with the City of Winnipeg, Chris made a significant



contribution to the nursing profession in Manitoba when she helped organize and then became the first President of the <u>first nurses only union</u> in the history of Manitoba. The process was not easy – as Christine and her colleagues met in each other's homes to discuss how to break away from the City of Winnipeg Union (CUPE) and form an association that

would focus on nursing and health issues. They actually mortgaged their homes to hire a lawyer to develop a collective agreement for nurses. A certification vote and hearing in front of the Manitoba Labour Board eventually lead to the formation of the Winnipeg Civic Nurses Association Local #1 – the first nurse only union in Manitoba history and predecessor to MONA and our present MNU. Chris was honoured for her initiative and courage that supports the careers of nurses today at the Homecoming 2018 dinner, with her proud daughter, Ruth Byquist (1973), present.

♦ Alice Challoner (Larkin), Class of 1980, honoured at the new HSC Women's Hospital

On December 9, 2017, the Challoner family and the Health Sciences Centre Foundation paid homage to an inspirational individual in health care: Alice Challoner (Larkin).

In Alice's memory, the Challoner family made a generous gift of \$250,000 to the HSC Foundation. The donation was used to develop a state-of-the-art integrated operating room in the hospital. Integrated operating rooms feature high-definition cameras that improve real-time information available to surgical teams. The signal from the cameras is also connected to a designated classroom in the hospital. The cameras improve both safety and efficiency in HSC's surgical program, while creating educational opportunities for nurses and other medical professionals.

In recognition of their gift, Operating Room #3 in the new HSC Womens Hospital has been named the <u>Alice Challoner (Larkin) Operating Room</u>. It will be the largest of three obstetrical operating rooms in the new hospital and it will help mothers deliver their babies in a safe and supportive environment. It features permanent structures for delivering twins, and triplets can also be accommodated.

♦The Alumni Bell

The **Alumni Bell** is an important part of our Alumni history and a tribute to all of the Presidents of the WGH/HSC Nursing Alumni. This beautiful brass bell became a part of the Alumni shortly after the 50th anniversary/ Golden Jubilee celebration of our Nursing Alumni. The names and dates of all Alumni Presidents were listed on the bell until there was no more space available. The list was then continued by attaching plaques to the base as needed; this ensures that all Alumni Presidents are recognized - from 1904 to the



present. In addition, a large WGH monogram crest graces the top of the bell. Since 1957, the Bell has been traditionally rung by the Alumni President to very effectively call the Annual General Meeting to order. The Alumni Bell is stored in the WGH / HSC Archives Museum – and loaned to the Alumni president each year for the AGM.

♦Ann Callaghan Thomas (1958) was honoured in the Manitoba



Legislative Assembly on May 29, 2018 by Nahanni Fontaine, MLA from St John's Ward. Ms Fontaine recognized Ann's incredible life journey as a residential school survivor who went on to graduate from the WGH School of Nursing in 1958 as one of the first indigenous Registered Nurses in Manitoba. Ann is very deserving of this honour because of her life-long dedication to

healing, wellness and learning – and her mentorship of young Aboriginal individuals, through her motto "if I can do it so can you!"

♦ Farewell to our Victoria Chapter

The Victoria Chapter of the Nurses' Alumni Association was established in 1946. Throughout their history they have had 60-70 graduates on their roster, (the majority of the members from the Victoria area but as many as 12-18 from points north of Victoria). Their Chapter has traditionally met four times a year for luncheon, with an annual meeting taking place at the spring meeting. On average 20 members attended meetings. In recent years the Victoria members have travelled to Parksville to allow those graduates living up island to participate more fully in Alumni/ Chapter news and activities. Over the past several years the Victoria Chapter has made an annual donation to Archives/ Museum Collection Endowed Fund with the HSCF. In 2017 the Victoria Chapter was forced to disband as their membership was declining and aging Alumni were dealing with health issues. They

donated their accumulated membership fees to a local charity and sent their archival materials to Winnipeg to be added to our long and rich history.

Congratulations and best wishes to all those graduates in Victoria and up island who made this Chapter a thriving organization for 70 plus years.

Archives/Museum Update

The work of the HSC Archives/Museum includes standard archival work, answering reference questions, outreach activities and grant writing initiatives. In the past fiscal year, we received 52 acquisitions and answered 55 reference questions. Outreach initiatives included 13 articles for HSC Focus, and a continuation of the "Heritage Window" exhibits. The large exhibit this year was recognition of the 50th anniversary of the Renal Program.

We applied for and received a grant from the Federal Young Canada Works Summer student program. We were also awarded a Provincial Heritage Grant to document the graduates of Winnipeg General Hospital who served as Nursing Sisters during World War One. With matching funds from the WGH/ HSC Archives/Museum Collection Endowment Fund, an online exhibit documenting each of these graduates was created. Access to this exhibit is through both the Alumni website and the HSC Archives webpage.

Thanks to the continued generosity of the Alumni through the Endowment Fund, research into the history of the Women's Hospital and women's health in Manitoba is underway, in preparation for the move to the new Women's Hospital. Emma Prescott. Archivist

WGH Class 58B "60th Reunion"



1958 B's "60th" Winnipeg General Hospital reunion was planned around the annual general meeting and homecoming dinner of the WGH/HSC Alumni Association. We were a class of 64 graduates of which 17 have passed away, and 3 have been lost through the years, leaving 44 out of which 25 made it to this year's reunion.

Thursday, after the general meeting, lunch was a noisy time as we had our first opportunity to start our celebrations. At an age of approximately 80 years young we were pleased to be able to be there. **Pat Cross** (McManus) arrived at the luncheon directly from the airport, with her family who travelled with her. Pat lives in Florida, but still has a mother residing in Winnipeg! Thanks to our classmate **Margaret Cuddy** (McCrady) who helped in the planning of our next two events: first - Thursday evening we met at Ralph Connor House at 54 Westgate at 6 PM for a chef planned wonderful dinner and visiting; second - Friday at 10 AM we had a guided tour of the Canadian Museum of Human Rights. Some of the ladies stayed for lunch at the Era Bistro.

Friday evening was the Homecoming dinner. It is a very special time, especially for our class this year. The visual displays on the walls showed pictures of our time as student nurses. When the 1958B year was announced, some very special classmates were honored:

Joyce Ewashko (Balacko) who passed away in 2016, was honored for her enthusiasm and work for the Alumni. At this time, Joyce's family honoured their mother by giving each of the attending classmates a memory 58B cookie in the shape of a nurse's cap.

Ann Thomas Callahan was honored in June 2006 when the new Critical Care Building was named after her, for her unflagging commitment to health care, community, and continuous learning. Darlene Foster was honored as 50 years ago, she was one of the primary nurses involved in the development of the ICU at the HSC and she was also involved in developing the ICU course which still stands today. Jubilee Memorial Fund

The current Jubilee Memorial Fund Balance as of May 2018 is \$3071.67. In 2010 the Executive moved to retain 3 years lecture costs at all times in the Fund. Excess monies are moved to the Archives/Museum Collection Endowment Fund. This also meets the spending requirement for this CRA charitable account. The Alumni Association Executive wish to thank all those who donated to this Fund over the past year(s) — to remember classmates and special events and to support both the annual lecture and the archives.

Education Committee Report

The Education Committee met twice during the 2017-2018 year, to review Jane A. Malcolm (JAM) applications yearly and Viola Leadlay (VL) applications twice yearly.

JAM funds continue to be managed by the Winnipeg Foundation. In the last fiscal year, \$36,806 was awarded to 1 Baccalaureate applicant, 1 Doctoral applicant, 2 Masters applicants and 1 RN Refresher program applicant. Recipients include Solita Crispin (1989), Shelley Andre (1986), Maria Almeida (1992), Monica Woods (1983) and Kristin Valari (1993).

The VL Continuing Education Fund continues to be managed by the Health Sciences Centre Foundation. In the past fiscal year, \$3803 was awarded from this fund. Recipients include Julie Halipchuck (1997), Debbie Miller (1993), Tanya Welch (1995), Monica Woods (1983) and Shelley Andre (1986).

The Education Committee receives many cards of appreciation from recipients of both the JAM and VL bursaries.

The values of the awards for the JAM Fund remain unchanged from last year: Baccalaureate Degree - up to \$12,000; Master's Degree - up to \$20,000, Doctoral degree - up to \$25,000. The spending rate for the JAM Fund increased to 4.8% for 2018; as of January 31, 2018, the **market value for the JAM fund was** \$861,830.70.

As of March 31, 2018, **§163,680.92** is in the VL Fund at the HSC Foundation. A year-end report from the HSCF will be forwarded to the alumni.

The availability of Alumni educational funds has been communicated in the Alumni Journal, HSC Nursing Newsletter, HSC Nursing Website, the Manitoba RN Journal, the ARNM website, the Class Rep letter and the Alumni's AGM. The terms of reference for the Education Committee were revised

March 2017. Application forms and accompanying policies were reviewed and revised February 2018.

All Education Committee members will remain on the committee for the coming year.

\$8,019.29 + D. Gembey estate **\$25,000**. To date there has been \$180,000.00 deposited to the Fund from the D. Gembey (Class 1951) Estate.

Grants from the Fund to the Archives/Museum:

- > 2016 First Grant \$5000.00 provided support for project to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of HSC Adult ICU opening. Matching monies were secured by the HSC archivist. Oral histories, panel displays, an online exhibit and social event were done/held. All can access the project's work via the HSC website https://hscarchives.com. Darlene Foster, Class of 58, who was instrumental in the design of the ICU, was a key speaker at the social event.
- > 2017 \$10,000.00 Grant supported two projects:
- (a) \$5,500.00 for the "Remembering the WW I Nursing Sisters who were graduates of Winnipeg General Hospital and Children's Hospital Schools of Nursing." Over 140 nurses from our two Schools of Nursing served in WWI. An online exhibit was created. Grant monies will be used for the initial historical research which begins May 14, 2018.
- > 2018 estimated Grant amount \$10,000.00. A project must yet be determined collaboratively by the Alumni Association and the HSC Archives/Museum Conveners continue to attend the HSC Heritage Committee meetings.

Our Alumni is 115 years old this year!

This year we celebrate the 115th anniversary of our Alumni and our accomplishments over that time!

- ♦ The first work of the Alumni in 1904 was to draw up a <u>Directory of Nurses</u> to ensure that "a nurse" had successfully completed a recognized nursing program of studies. These early initiatives to protect the public evolved into the Manitoba Association of Registered Nurses (currently the College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba) with Manitoba leading the way for these Directories across Canada.
- ◆ Through the years, our Alumni raised monies to sustain themselves through membership fees, donations, and the annual Fund Raising Tea. Then in May 1968, Jane A. Malcolm (1919) left the Alumni a large bequest to provide financial assistance for students. The principal was transferred to the Winnipeg Foundation and became the Jane A. Malcolm Bursary Fund. Evelyn R (Roberts) Laughton (1933) added her bequest to it in 1997. In the years since, grants from this Fund have supported many of our alumni to further their nursing education. The Viola Leadlay Nursing Education Endowed Fund, begun with a bequest from Viola Leadlay in 1983 and, now managed by HSC Foundation, similarly provides grants to support ongoing education for both HSC nurses and Alumni. What foresight these nurses had!
- ♦ The Homecoming Dinner became an annual event in 1910. This yearly occasion is an extraordinary gathering which brings classmates together and celebrates special reunion classes each year. The Jubilee Memorial Fund, established in 1979, continues to support an annual health related lecture during Homecoming.
- ♦ In 1907, the Alumni Association began publishing the <u>Alumni Journal</u>, to maintain communication and cohesiveness among members. In 2012, this method of communication was changed to an Alumni <u>Website</u> and an annual <u>Newsletter</u>; both continue to inform members of Alumni happenings!
- ♦ The Archives/Museum began in the 1900's when volunteers retained materials and described events that would become historically significant. It has grown into one of the major archival holdings in Winnipeg and beyond. Documents,

photographs and artifacts are currently a treasure trove for researchers, scholars, film makers, current and former students and others. In 1988, the Administration of HSC requested that the Alumni become responsible for the historical archives of the entire complex. And in 2008, our Association entered into a formal agreement with the Health Sciences Centre Foundation (HSCF) to establish the Archives/Museum Collection Endowment Fund whose goals are to provide monies for the professional management, preservation, and enhancement of the Collection in perpetuity.

♦ Our Alumni history outlines many ground-breaking ideas and activities that support our Alumni members. As a result, today's grads are providing innovative bedside care, research, education or engaging in other health related activities.

So please stand up and be proud of our Alumni, of Nursing and of YOU! And consider volunteering to help us keep this organization going strong!
