Additional responsibilities that Donna has taken on include Treasurer of the Jubilee Memorial Lecture Committee from 2010-2017 and Newsletter Convener/Rescuer from 2007-2016! This long and amazing history makes Donna a most worthy and deserving addition to our "Honored 10"!

♦ In Memory of Pat Edward - Class 1955A; Apr.1933- Jan.2020 It is with sadness that we announce the passing of Pat Edward. Pat had a varied career before and after obtaining her BSc in Nursing at the University of Saskatchewan where she later obtained a

Teaching & Administration diploma. In 1970 she became the first Nurse Practitioner at the Winnipeg Clinic. She was the Provincial Coordinator for the National Breast Screening Program in 1981 and 3 years later she founded the Manitoba Mastectomy Visitation Program for the Canadian Cancer Society. These are just a few of her many accomplishments.



Pat also received numerous awards and accolades, including YMCA Woman of the Year Award. Pat was President of the Class of 55A and kept in close contact with her classmates through the years. She was Alumni President from 1961 to 1963 and class representative for many years. In 2003 she received an Alumni Honorary Life Membership.

In 2013 Pat moved into Oakview Place where she maintained an active 'mental' life, keeping abreast of sport scores, politics and the activities of classmates. She continued to attend the Alumni Luncheon with her classmates each May, including in 2019! Pat will be missed.

◆Victorian Order of Nurses for Canada Donation

In early December 2019, HSC Archives/Museum received a

donation of historic materials related to the Winnipeg branch of the Victorian Order of Nurses for Canada. These items had originally been donated to the Margaret Elder Hart Heritage Room in the Faculty of Nursing at University of Manitoba (U of M).



However, due to changing priorities, the U of M asked the HSC Archives/Museum if we would be interested in acquiring the items. Given that many of the Winnipeg General and HSC nursing grads would have worked for the VON during its many decades in Manitoba, we saw it as a definite fit with our mandate and were pleased to add the items to our collection.

The collection includes a uniform hat and buttons, two scrapbooks, a box of glass slides, five photographs that were used in an exhibit, a blood pressure instrument, a binder with an



equipment bag list, and two history books—one celebrating the 50th and one the 100th anniversaries of the VON. These complement books on the VON that were already in our collection.

The catalogue record for this collection has been added to our site on the Manitoba Archives Information Network and can be

◆ New Women's Hospital Opens!

The new HSC Women's Hospital at 665 William Avenue officially opened on December 1, 2019. The first patients were welcomed into the new 388,000 square foot facility, with patients from the old hospital being moved into the new building throughout the morning. When the last patient was moved from the old facility at 735 Notre Dame Ave., the facility stopped accepting patients and was officially closed. As the new facility now provides state of the art care for women and their families, it is important to celebrate and recognize the legacy of the old HSC Women's Hospital and the history of women's and maternal health at HSC.

The old Women's Hospital, formerly known as the Maternity Pavilion and Women's Pavilion, officially opened on May 6, 1950. Though the intention was to move patients from WGH slowly



over time, Mother Nature had other plans. As spring flood waters rose around hospitals closer to the rivers, patients were transferred to WGH, and women and babies had to be moved to the Pavilion as soon as possible. With the help of everyone, all patients were moved from WGH to the Pavilion in two hours. In the middle of the move, the Pavilion's first baby was born!

When it opened in 1950, the Maternity Pavilion was considered to be a state-of-the-art facility. Separated from the General Hospital to reduce the risk of infection, it included 132 beds for maternity and gynecological care and was designed to provide maximum safety and comfort to new mothers and babies. Investment in a new Maternity Pavilion underscored the importance of having babies in a hospital, providing peace of mind to the mother and access to the most modern methods and equipment. The success of the Maternity Pavilion was evident in the record number of births that took place in 1953 when 4,019 babies were born! By the mid-1970s, Women's Hospital required renovations to continue to deliver excellence in obstetrical and gynecological care. These renovations took place in 1982 and included a newly integrated Labour and Delivery unit that incorporated the philosophy of family-centered care.

In 1973, Health Sciences Centre was established by the government of Manitoba. The Women's Pavilion was renamed the Women's Centre, which was changed to Women's Hospital in 1979. And on April 1, 2000, HSC became an operating division of the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority.

In 2000, HSC began to practise family-centered care, where staff plan care based on the needs and beliefs of family. The Women's Family Birthplace, or LDRP, opened in September 2000 and was a home-like setting for healthy women and their babies. This model was in place until 2016 when demand and complexity outpaced space and resources. Subsequently, labor, delivery, and recovery remained in one place while postpartum care was moved elsewhere. The same time frame saw the growth of the Gynecological and Gyne Oncology programs at Women's Hospital, the opening of six modern operating theatres for gynecology/oncology surgery, and one floor of the hospital being devoted to the comprehensive care of gynecological oncology patients.

Over the past several decades, nursing has been central to the provision of family-centered care and responsible for a multitude of nurse-driven practices at Women's Hospital. Some of these include Kangaroo Care for premature infants, a Breastfeeding Hotline and Clinic, Cradle Chat for perinatal families, the Antenatal Home Care Program for women with pregnancy complications and the inception of the Mature Women's Program to meet the gynecological needs of all women. To support the surgical environment of Women's Hospital, a nurse-managed Pre-Assessment Clinic was initiated to provide comprehensive preoperative assessment and care to all patients requiring admission

post operatively. More recent nurse-driven programs include the Prenatal Connections program, to provide services for women who had to leave their home for maternity care, and The



Partners in Inner-City Integrated Prenatal Care Project to reduce barriers to prenatal care for inner-city women. Additionally, in 2015, a nurse-led collaborative pilot project found that keeping mothers and babies together was beneficial for infants of opiate-addicted mothers on methadone maintenance.

Over its 65+ year history, staff initiatives and practices at Women's Hospital have set the standard for health care for women and their families in Manitoba and internationally. But despite the implementation of extraordinary programs and optimal care practices, staff was physically limited by the space of the current building. Dreams of a large, state-of-the-art facility did not go unanswered.

In 2007, Manitoba Health Minister Theresa Oswald announced that a new Women's Hospital would be built at HSC. Construction on the new HSC Women's Hospital began in June, 2011. This beautiful state-of -the-art facility is now open! It will assist staff to build on well-established care practices, with improved space and technology. And it will allow our dedicated staff to improve the patient experience, and facilitate continued excellence in patient care, research, leadership, and education related to women's and maternal health.

Archives/Museum Update

The work of the HSC Archives/Museum continues to include standard archival work, answering reference questions, outreach activities and grant writing initiatives. In the past fiscal year, we received 90 acquisitions and answered 64 reference questions from a local, national and international user base. Outreach initiatives included 12 exhibits in the Heritage Window and 3 articles for HSC Focus (HSC Focus ceased to be published in June 2018. We are actively looking for other avenues for articles). The large exhibit this year was recognition of the history of Women's Hospital at HSC.

We applied for and received a grant from the Federal Young Canada Works Summer student program and applied for a Federal Young Canada Works Intern grant. The funds from the WGH/HSC Archives/Museum Collection Endowment Fund were matched by HSC to produce a new online exhibit entitled *History of Women's and Maternal Health at HSC* in celebration of the move to HSC Women's. Access to this exhibit is through both the Alumni website and the HSC Archives webpage.

Jubilee Memorial Fund

The current Jubilee Memorial Fund Balance as of April 2019 is \$3198.92. In 2010 the Executive moved to retain 3 years lecture costs at all times in the Fund. Excess monies are moved to the Archives/Museum Collection Endowment Fund. This also meets the spending requirement for this CRA charitable account.

The Alumni Association Executive wish to thank all those who donated to this Fund over the past year(s) – to remember classmates and special events and to support both the annual lecture and the archives.

Education Committee Report

The Education Committee met twice during the 2018-2019 year to review Jane A. Malcolm (JAM) applications yearly and Viola Leadlay (VL) applications twice yearly. JAM funds continue to be managed by the Winnipeg Foundation. In the last fiscal year, \$30,435 was awarded to 1 Doctoral applicant, 3 Masters applicants, 1 RN Refresher program applicant and 1 Conference attendance (VL applicant). Recipients were Maria Almeida (1992), Solita Crispin (1989), Lorie-Anne Danielson (1993), Kristen Valeri (1993), Monica Woods (1983) and Marilyn Muir (1991; Viola Leadlay)

The VL Continuing Education Fund continues to be managed by the Health Sciences Centre Foundation. In the past fiscal year, \$2250.84 was awarded from this fund. Recipients include Shelley Andre (1986), Cheryl Kalupar (1991), Marilyn Muir (1991), Julie Halipchuck (1997) and Rhonda Thorkelsson (1991).

The Education Committee has received many cards and notes of appreciation recognizing the generosity of the alumni from recipients of both the JAM and VL Continuing Education Fund.

The Education Committee received a \$200 donation from the class of 1976 in memory of their classmates that have passed. The check and a copy of the letter received were forwarded to the HSC Foundation to be added to the Viola Leadlay Nursing Education Endowment Fund.

The values of the awards for the LAM Fund remain

The values of the awards for the JAM Fund remain unchanged from last year: Baccalaureate Degree - up to \$12,000; Master's Degree - up to \$20,000, Doctoral degree -

up to \$25,000. The 2018 spending rate for the JAM Fund increased to 4.8% and has increased to 5% for 2019. As of January 31, 2019, the market **value for the JAM fund was \$818,937.42**. The total capital received into the fund since its inceptions is \$27,402.31.

The Viola Leadlay Continuing Education Fund was transferred to HSC Foundation December 2015, and is now known as the Viola Leadlay Nursing Education Endowment Fund.

- > The amount of the initial transfer was \$138,204.83 which was split between the two components of the fund for ease of tracking and reporting (our nursing Alumni and HSC continuing education series)
- > The starting balance for the Nurses Alumni Association Awards portion of the fund was \$69,102.42.
- > There has been \$508.00 in donations to the fund which again have been split between the two components of the fund (\$254.00 to the Nurses Alumni Association Awards portion of the fund).
- > As of March 31, 2019, our portion of the Viola Leadlay Nursing Education Endowment Fund is \$79,734.32 (down from \$81,840.16 last year).
- > The current spending rate is 4%.

The availability of Alumni educational funds has been communicated in the Alumni Journal, HSC Nursing Newsletter, HSC Nursing Website, the Manitoba RN Journal, the ARNM website, the Class Rep letter and the Alumni's AGM.

The terms of reference for the Education Committee were revised March 2017. Application form was revised April 23, 2019 to specify who is eligible to apply as well as the year of graduation form WGH/HSC School of Nursing. I would like to express my appreciation to the members of the Education Committee and the executive for their continued support.
