There is plenty to see in Ireland and a lot of territory to cover. Therefore, this quick itinerary is merely meant to give you a taste of what there is to see and do. Depending on your interests, this itinerary can easily be stretched out to your desired length of travel.



### DAY 1

- Arrive in Dublin mid-morning.
- Drop your luggage off at the hotel and take an afternoon city tour to get your bearings. Consider taking the Hop On/Off Bus Tour.

- Pick up a rental car and head to Waterford.
- Some popular attractions to see include the Medieval Museum, Reginald's Tower, House of Waterford Crystal, Cathedral of the Most Holy Trinity and more.

- On the way, consider a stop at Blarney Castle or Jameson's Distillery.
- Or stop in Cork and visit The English Market, a popular spot to get fresh teas, bread, jams, meats and cheeses, sweet treats and more. Consider picking up a few items and having a picnic.

- Today we will head to Killarney.
- Visit Killarney National Park, Ring of Kerry, Muckross House & Gardens
- Visit Dingle and the Dingle Peninsula, Ross Castle, and more.



### DAY 6

- On the way up to Galway today, we will stop off to see the famous Cliffs of Moher.
- Once we get to Galway, be sure to experience the local flavors with a wide variety of cafes, bistros and fine dining.
- Galway is a fun, party town. Check the calendar and see if your visit lines up with one of several popular festivals including Galway International Arts Festival (July), Galway Film Fleadh (July), and Galway International Oyster Festival (September).
