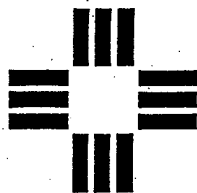

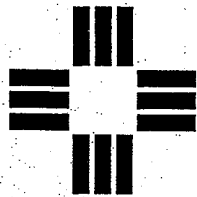

I met with [REDACTED] this afternoon. He told me that his past sexual relationship with Father Aldo was troubling him a lot. He sometimes feels guilty about it even though he knows that the priest was wrong. He told me that he was put into a foster home and because that did not work, he was placed at the YMCA in downtown Portland. He saw this man driving around in a yellow and black car. The man befriended him and told him that he was the janitor at St. Michael Church. He would take him to the living quarters in the back and have sex with him. A couple of times he had him stay overnight and gave him some very strong sleeping pills which knocked him out. After this he would tongue the pills and spit them out in the toilet. This began when he was sixteen and lasted about four years.

He was suspicious that Father Aldo was not the janitor because he didn't think the janitor would live in the back of the church. One Sunday he went to Mass and saw him dressed in his white robes. He did not think this was right for a priest.

He also told me that he had lost his belief in God and confidence in men because Father Aldo had hurt him. He said it is hard not to have any faith.

He said he needed someone to talk with. I asked him what kind of person he would like to speak with. He said that he would like to talk with a woman. I told him that I did not know a woman who I could recommend, but I did know a man, Frank Picard, who was a counselor and I could get a recommendation from him. He said he would not mind all that much talking to a man. I told him that I would contact Mr. Picard and get back with him.

I called Frank Picard and told him about the situation. He said that he would be happy to see him. He thought it would be necessary for him to meet with him before he could recommend a woman counselor if that was his preference. I told him that I would have ~~NAME~~ call him.

He also asked me for assistance with his rent for this month. I told him that I thought the Cathedral Parish St. Vincent de Paul would be able to help him. I called Sr. Fidelis and she said that she would help him with this month's rent. He told me that he has a job and after this month would have enough to pay his rent.

_____ is the individual who reported to Sr. Fidelis at the Cathedral over a year ago that he had been abused by Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta when he was a minor and living on the streets in Portland. I subsequently interviewed him and we have confronted Father Aldo with this allegation.

I had told Mr. _____ that I would like the opportunity to visit with him again and he was agreeable. Shortly thereafter he was arrested and convicted of some minor crime and has been in jail since then. He has corresponded with me and with Sr. Fidelis during the time he was in jail. On one occasion he asked me for help in getting a place where he could live when he got out of prison and a chance to talk to me some more.

_____ He wrote to me again asking for Father Aldo's full name and for my phone number. I responded accordingly. He never has tried to contact me by phone.

Mr. _____ is scheduled to be released from prison in May. He wrote to Sr. Fidelis asking for a place to live the first month after he got out. She asked my advice on how to respond. After consulting with Pat Reilly _____, I advised her to write back to him and tell him that we would find some way to help him get a place to stay when he gets out of jail. I also asked her to tell him that I would like to meet with him when he gets out.

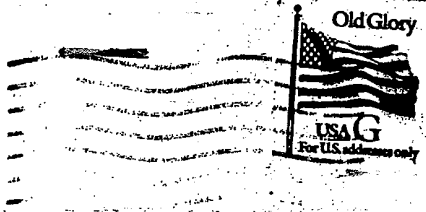

DATE: February 7, 1995

At Mr. _____ request Archbishop Levada and I met with him to discuss his concerns about Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta.

He has known Father Aldo for twelve years and has been close friends with him. He first met him at St. Peter in Newberg. They became good friends. At one point Father Aldo was having a rough time and was in bed. He invited Mr. _____ to join him. Mr. _____ told him no and responded that he needed to stop feeling sorry for himself and act like a priest. Father Aldo didn't make any other advances and their friendship continued.

Someone else who he knew warned him to be careful of Fr. Aldo because Fr. Aldo had fondled two of his sons in an improper way while he was still at St. Michael. Mr. _____ defended Fr. Aldo. Over the years two other people have told Mr. _____ that Fr. Aldo had abused young boys that they knew while he was pastor at St. Michael.

While Fr. Aldo was at Tillamook, Mr. _____ became aware of an emotional attachment he developed toward _____. He knew that I was aware of this because Fr. Aldo told him that he had to come to see me about it. Fr. Aldo's typical pattern in developing these emotional friendships is to heap gifts on a person and then only go as far as a person will allow him when he makes an advance.

Mr. _____ and his friend helped to move Fr. Aldo when he retired. His friend's fiancée's father's friend alleged that he had been abused as a child by Fr. Aldo at St. Michael (one of the three mentioned above). Together Mr. _____ and his friend confronted Father Aldo and explained because of this behavior he would not be able to baptize Mr. _____ son or marry his friend. Father Aldo, although he denied that anything had happened, said he understood.

Mr. _____ said that he would talk with his friend upon his return from vacation and see if he would be willing to talk about the incident he is aware of.

- 2) The MMPI suggests that Father Aldo uses a great deal of repression and minimization.
- 3) We have a record of several allegations which are consistent with his sexually acting out with young men about 20 years ago.

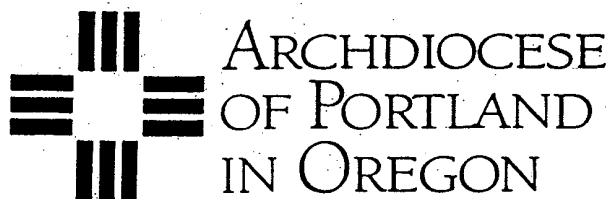

DATE: June 23, 1994

I met with Father Aldo concerning the complaint I received some time ago. from Father Aldo has been unable to come to Portland because of an automobile accident he had. He has been without transportation.

I reviewed what Mr. [REDACTED] had told me regarding a sexual relationship he allegedly had with M. [REDACTED] during the years he was pastor at St. Michael in Portland. Father Aldo categorically denied any sexual involvement. He said he remembered the individual as a somewhat mixed up street kid who he had tried to help from time to time. He doesn't know why he would make this accusation.

I reviewed his file with Father Aldo and pointed out some other allegations made in the past which he had denied when they were made. He said this has been a very troubling thing to him. He does not know why such accusations have followed him. He would like to do whatever necessary to clear himself. I asked him if he would be willing to undergo a psychological evaluation from Dr. [REDACTED]. He said he by all means would undergo this if it would help to clear his name. I made arrangements for him to meet with Dr. [REDACTED].

I also asked him about his threatened law suit against Tamy [REDACTED]. He said that she had libeled his good name and he didn't want her to get away with it. He didn't want his name to be ruined in the community. I asked him who had the letter. He said as far as he knew only the Archbishop and I and someone in the parish to whom he had given it. I explained to him that the Archbishop and I know the circumstances behind the letter and it certainly would not effect our opinion about him. I told him that if he pursued the suit it would undoubtedly become well known in Tillamook County. I told him I thought the best thing would be to just drop it. He said that is what he would do.

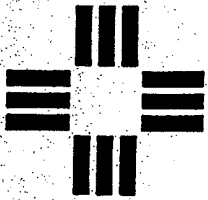

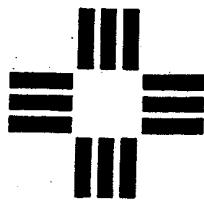

A homeless person named _____, whom Sister Fidelis has seen from time to time when he has come to ask for assistance, made the accusation to her that he was sexually abused by a priest twenty years ago. The priest he accuses is Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta. He is at the present time seeing a counselor through the county.

I have asked Father Jacobberger to have Sister Fidelis contact me so that I might get more information from her and see whether it will be possible to contact him and speak with him. He said that he will ask her to call me as soon as she is able.

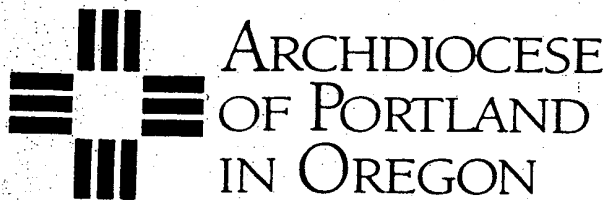

DATE: January 6, 1994

I spoke with Sister Fidelis this morning regarding the allegations made by [redacted] that he was sexually abused by Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta.

She said she had known Mr. [redacted] for some years. He has been a homeless person and has needed assistance at various times. It was only at her last meeting with him that he mentioned among a list of other problems that he was abused by Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta some years ago. He was quite agitated when she spoke with him. This evidently occurred over a period of time, although she was not certain as to the dates or the age of Mr. Bahr when it occurred. She judges him to be in his mid to late 30's at the present time.

She might have dismissed this since he seems to be a very mixed up individual, but some years ago a counselor told her that he was seeing a man who had been sexually involved with Father Aldo. She did not say anything about this because she was concerned that the counselor had breached a confidence. He had spoken with her because he was very upset by this allegation. She does not know for certain the age of this individual, but believes that he was over 18 when it occurred.

I asked her whether she thought that Mr. [redacted] would be willing to speak with me. She said that she thought he would and agreed to talk to him about it the next time he appeared.

This afternoon Father Jacobberger called me. He had Mr. [redacted] in his office and wanted to arrange a time for us to meet. We scheduled a meeting at the Cathedral on Monday, January 11 at 3 p.m.

I met with Mr. [redacted] at Cathedral on January 10, 1994 at 3 p.m.

He told me that when he was sixteen or seventeen he was living at the YMCA in downtown Portland. He had gotten into trouble shoplifting and had spent some time at JDH. When he got out they thought it would be best that he not return to his neighborhood in north Portland and so they arranged for him to stay at the Y.

He met a man who claimed to be the janitor of St. Michael Church. He offered to pay him money if he would spend the night with him. He took him to St. Michael and spent the night with him in the room behind the church. He remembers the layout of the old priest's living quarters fairly accurately. At the time he did not realize that the man was Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta, but after he had slept with him several times he decided to check the place out on Sunday and that is when he learned that the man who called himself the janitor was Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta, the pastor. At first Father Aldo always gave him some pills which he learned were a barbiturate. Daradell? This made him very groggy and he was not too much aware what went on after he went to bed. One night he decided not to take the pills and that's when he realized completely what was going on.

This went on for four or five years until Father Aldo was transferred from the parish. (There is some discrepancy in Mr. Bahr's statements regarding his age at the time that it took place. He told me that he is now 37 years old. Father Aldo left the parish August 1, 1983. According to this calculation, he would have been 27 at the time Father Aldo left and approximately

22 when they first met.) He would sleep with him at least once a week and sometimes four or five times a week. Mr. [REDACTED] remembers that Father Aldo had a Cadillac, but he also had a yellow car with a black stripe. He had a large black dog as well. Father Aldo would pick him up in the car and then let him off two or three blocks from the church so that people would not see them arriving together. He would then come to the door and Father Aldo would take him in. Father Aldo would give him money for sleeping with him. He would insist that he leave early in the morning before people came. On some occasions when he needed help and came during the day, Father Aldo got very irritated with him. One time he went to ask Father Aldo for some help with a friend of his. Father Aldo got mad at him and called the police. The police took them both in and put them in jail for the night. They let them go in the morning because Father Aldo didn't want to press charges.

I asked whether he knew of anyone else that Father Aldo had sex with. He replied that on occasion Father Aldo asked if he had any friends that would like to have sex with him. He never gave him any names. He said another person he knew by the name of [REDACTED] said that Father Aldo had had sex with him. He hasn't seen this person in years and has no idea where he is.

I asked him how he was doing. He said he had been having real tough times financially, emotionally and physically. He has been homeless and living on the street. Sister Fidelis helped him get a place to stay for a week. He is trying to get on welfare. His doctor put him in touch with someone from Multnomah County who is helping him with his problems.

He said he has not spoken about his sexual relationship with Father Aldo with anyone until he blurted it out to Sister Fidelis. He said it was hard for him to talk about this but he was glad to have the opportunity to tell someone about it. He wanted to see someone who was helping him with getting on Welfare before 4 o'clock, so I gave him a ride. I gave him my card and asked him to call me again so that we could talk some more. He said he would appreciate the opportunity to talk more about his experiences.

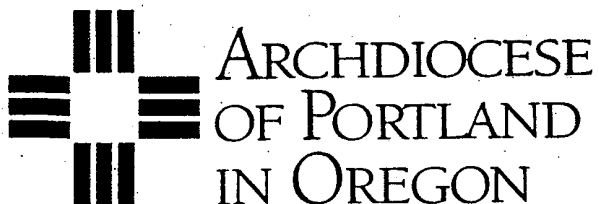

Father Aldo brought to the Pastoral Center so that I might speak with him about their relationship.

He told me that he and Father Aldo became friends after he returned from service in the Army. He and Father Aldo share a number of interests, including music, theater and photography.

He assured me that there was nothing improper about their relationship. It is definitely not a sexual relationship. Their friendship is based on their common interests. His father has also become friends with Father Aldo and the three of them have dinner frequently.

He is over 21 and has been attending community college. This summer he is working for his father driving a bulldozer on a development project. He would like to pursue his interests in theater.

He is disturbed about the rash judgment and gossip that has taken place in Tillamook. He said he wished that people who had concerns would talk to him directly.

I asked him whether he had stayed overnight at the rectory and he said he had on two or three occasions in the guest room.

I thanked him for coming to see me and apologized for the inconvenience. I explained that I was obliged to investigate once I had received an expression of concern. I told him that I would write a memo on our conversation and place it in Father Aldo's personnel file. He responded that he appreciated having his statement in the file, but he realized it would not completely make up for the damage done by this unfounded complaint.

I explained that I had received a phone call from someone in Tillamook who expressed concern about his relationship with

Father Aldo stated that there was nothing improper in their relationship. After he returned from Desert Storm, he came to see Father. Subsequently, they became friends because of a number of common interests. Father Aldo said that he tried to help him as he got back into civilian life. He loaned him his car to take his date to the prom. They are interested in photography, music and the theater.

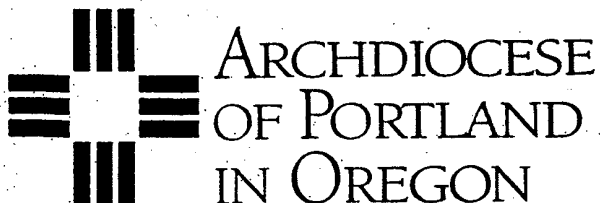
Father Aldo denied any kind of sexual relationship. He stated that he was good friends with father, who is not Catholic, and the three of them have dinner frequently. He offered to ask to come to see me and said he had already talked with him about this. I said I would appreciate the opportunity to speak with him.

He asked who had made the complaint. I told him that I believed the person wished to remain anonymous, although I might talk with the person and inform that person that Father Aldo would like the opportunity to discuss the matter.

Father Aldo said it did not surprise him because Tillamook is a small town that thrives on gossip. He said it was unfortunate that people were so ready to misinterpret a friendship.

I called Father Park to ask him about the complaint we had received concerning Father Aldo. I asked him whether he had any information about this. He said that he did in fact know about the relationship between Father Aldo and this young man whose name is . He does not know that there is anything improper about the relationship, but it definitely has given the wrong impression to a number of parishioners in Tillamook.

Father Park knows the young man's parents, . He also knows . He came to Mass for a while at Rockaway. The young man is about 21 years old. When he came back from the service, he and Father Aldo formed a close friendship. He has heard about this from the secretary in the parish in Tillamook, and also from his assistant, Hal, who has mentioned a number of people have expressed their concern. He feels that many good people in Tillamook feel anguish about the relationship that Father Aldo has with .

Father Aldo has been depressed after the death of his dog. This happened about eight months ago. The dog is buried at a site that Father Aldo still visits. He frequently refers to the loss. Father Park feels that this man's presence has fed into an emotional need that Father Aldo has. Father Aldo has been too generous to this young man. He lets him drive his car and uses his house.

Father Aldo mentioned to Father Park one time that he is aware of this gossip about him. His attitude is that it is none of their business. He is not doing anything wrong. Father Park feels that because the relationship is so open, it is unlikely that there is any improper sexual activity occurring. Father

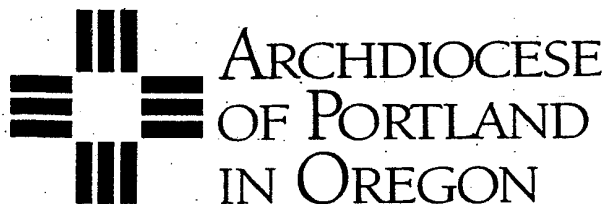

I called Father Bliven to ask him about his conversation with [redacted] who had called me concerning Father Aldo. I told Father Bliven that she had reported when she spoke to him about this, that he advised her to call me and that he had told her that Father Aldo had problems with boys in the past. I asked Father Bliven to share with me what knowledge he may have about Father Aldo's relationship with boys in the past.

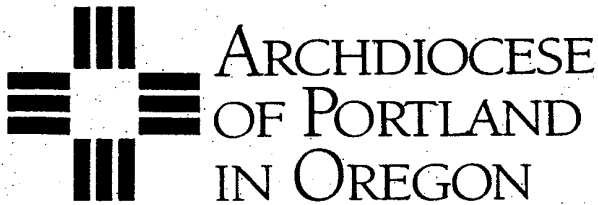
Father Bliven stated that his knowledge came from the parishioners at St. Michael's. He said it was widely known among the Italian parishioners that Father Aldo was attracted to boys. There was a kind of agreement that as long as he would be their priest, they would not turn him in. In Father Bliven's opinion, this was a kind of Italian solidarity. Italians do not turn in other Italians. Father Bliven also said that on one occasion when he was in church before services, a man came in yelling that the priest had screwed him. There were other people in the church so Father Bliven went immediately to talk to the man. The man said, "I was screwed by a priest and many times. But not you, Father. It was a priest who was here before you." The man was not a parishioner and was unknown to Father Bliven.

During the first year that Father Bliven was at St. Michael's parish, there were many strange looking young men who came to the door asking for Father Aldo. Furthermore, when Father Bliven was at All Saints parish years ago, some parishioners there complained about Father Aldo's relationship with boys.

I thanked Father Bliven for this information and told him it would be helpful. Father Bliven said that before [redacted] came to speak with him he had assumed that Father Aldo had grown out of this kind of behavior.

_____ called with a concern about Fr. Aldo Orso-Manzonetta. She was referred to me by Fr. Bliven, who is a friend. She is a parishioner at Sacred Heart Parish in Tillamook. She is also a sex abuse counsellor for the county.

The building she works in is near the rectory, and she can see it through the window in her office. For some time she has been concerned about a young man who comes and goes to the rectory frequently. He is a former altar boy in the parish. She is not sure of his age, but he drives a car to the rectory. She has no knowledge of what goes on in the rectory but it gives a bad appearance. She is particularly sensitive because of her work.

Two other people have talked to her about this. One is a parishioner, _____ who works for _____. She has observed Father Aldo with this same young man on several occasions. She talked to _____ because of her concern about this relationship and the impression it gave in the parish and the community.

The other person is a _____ a counsellor and co-worker. He also expressed his concern after seeing this young man going to the rectory frequently. He has observed him driving into the garage and bringing booze into the rectory. He also was concerned about the possibility of an improper relationship and the impression it gives in the community.

She said that she was not anxious to call, but Fr. Bliven encouraged her. Tillamook is a small community and gossip travels quickly. This could be very damaging to the Church.

She was happy because her job is difficult and she was looking forward to having a priest she could talk to and receive spiritual support from. When he arrived she went to meet him and told him about her work and asked if she could talk to him from time to time. He was very cold. She asked him one more time and he was again cold. When she told this to Father Bliven he told her that was understandable because Fr. Aldo had had problems with young boys in the past.

Father Huneger met with me to discuss a memo he directed to myself and the Archbishop concerning a call about Boys in the Rectory. He identified the priest concerned as Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta. The woman he talked to was [REDACTED]. The memo reflects what she told Father Huneger.

She had been encouraged to speak with the Chancery by [REDACTED], who had been unable to reach the Archbishop. Father Huneger then called Martha [REDACTED], whom he knew. She corrected the information he had received from [REDACTED].

The mother of this boy was not at the funeral. He had been taken there by his grandparents. Also, she was uncertain that another woman in the parish had stated that that kind of thing happens all the time. She thought perhaps the woman said that it had happened once before. She had made the statement in support of Father Aldo. The woman whose son Father Aldo allegedly invited to stay the weekend at the rectory is [REDACTED]. Father Huneger could find out her phone number and address if that were required.

RE: Concerned Call about "Boys in the Rectory"

I received a call this morning relating ~~that~~ the pastor of one of our parishes invited a boy that he met at a funeral to stay overnight at the rectory. His mother was taken aback, but was assured quite innocently by another woman from that parish that the pastor does this all the time. The way it came to me was that the young boy was invited to come explore a common interest in "CD's" (compact disks).

I received the call from a party that was contacted by a close friend of the mother whose son had been approached by the pastor at the funeral.

It seems to me that this should be pursued, even though nothing untoward may be happening, for even if nothing of the kind is going on that was going on for several years in one parish in Louisiana, the appearance is scandalous, particularly when youngsters are invited who are not parishioners and are scarcely acquainted with the pastor.

I would prefer not to put the details of person and parish in this writing, but will convey this to you verbally at my next opportunity.

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The caller was very concerned that this get to you, even though they felt that because they were relaying what others were afraid to call in about, it would be preferable for me to help follow up the question mark that is in some people's minds.

I spoke with Fr. Aldo today and he confirmed that the son of a family he knows will occasionally stay in the rectory guest room, with his parents' knowledge and

approval. He assured me there is no question of an impropriety.

I explained to Fr. Aldo that in today's climate priests must avoid having any minor stay overnight in the rectory unless accompanied by a family member, because people are very sensitive to appearances and may jump to unfortunate conclusions. I further indicated that our diocesan insurance insists on such a policy, which will be in our forthcoming Administrative Manual.

In the meantime Fr. Aldo gave me his assurance that he would not continue the practice.

I did reach her today. She told me that her son [redacted] had implied that something had taken place between Fr. Aldo and a [redacted] a classmate of [redacted] -- while both were football players at Central Catholic. She said that Jeff did not know where Tommy Harold was at the present time -- that the family had moved out of Portland.

I told her that I had taken the matter up with Fr. Aldo and that he did not remember the incident nor could he remember either Jeff or Tommy Harold.

Mrs. [redacted] agreed that there was nothing to be gained by pursuing the matter further with her son -- in fact she said he felt he had spoken to her in confidence, and since the incident had taken place so long ago, it probably should not be pursued any further.

She was very sympathetic and understanding -- she is a nurse by profession.

SUMMARY OF MEETING OF JULY 20, 1983

Present were: Fr. Aldo Orso-Manzonetta: Fr. Joseph Wood, OSB; and Bishop Waldschmidt, c.s.c

The meeting took place at 1:30 p.m. in the office of Bishop Waldschmidt, who had called the meeting.

Bishop Waldschmidt explained the purpose of the meeting: to discuss certain "accusations" against Fr. Aldo which within the past two weeks had been brought to Bishop Waldschmidt's attention.

As a result of the Fr. Laughlin case, several individuals brought up incidents allegedly involving Fr. Aldo in similar sexual acts with males, including some minors. The expressed reason why this information surfaced at this time was the concern on the part of those bringing the issues to light that the Archdiocese should not have to face another case of this kind, but should take appropriate action.

Bishop Waldschmidt presented the material that had been brought to his attention:

1. Several years ago, a [REDACTED] (aged at that time 19 Or 20) who was to become the future son-in-law of the [REDACTED] family, alleged that Fr. Aldo told him that he was frightened because of some threats that were made against him. [REDACTED] agreed to stay overnight with Fr. Aldo. During the night, Fr. Aldo allegedly made sexual overtures to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] left the residence and walked home. He reported this to Mrs. [REDACTED], who in turn went to see Abp. Dwyer. There was no information on what happened after that.

Fr. Aldo responded that Mrs. [REDACTED] was a "difficult" person, who did not like him. He stated that he did not recall anything that could have given rise to such a story.

2. Fr. Joseph Wood reported that last year, Fr. Ted Frison of Newman Center, at Portland State University, called Fr. Wood to say that two male prostitutes had been picked up by Fr. Aldo and had sexual relations with him. Subsequently, one of the boys had a religious conversion and went to see Fr. Frison to discuss the incident. Fr. Frison told the boy to contact Fr. Wood and discuss it with him. Fr. Wood indicated that the boy had called and made an appointment, but did not keep it.

Fr. Aldo responded that since St. Michael's parish is in the down-town area, he had all kinds of people come to the rectory for help. Fr. indicated that he had tried to work with some of the prostitutes -- but found he was not having much success, so he gave it up. He indicated that he realized that in trying to work with these individuals, he was taking the risk of being suspected of immoral conduct -- but that he did so anyway, since he regarded it as part of his ministry and his obligation as a priest.

Fr. Aldo gave the same response to two other items:

- 1) A "rumor" that for a number of years the local police suspected that Fr. Aldo was "messing around" with young boys.
- 2) A statement from a former priest of the Archdiocese expressing concern about Fr. Aldo's associations -- "his associations were a cause for alarm"

3. Fr. Jacobberger reported that he had received a call from an [REDACTED], a long time member of All Saints Parish and a friend of the Jacobberger family. Mrs. [REDACTED] was formerly known as Mrs. [REDACTED], but had remarried after the death of her first husband.

Mrs. [REDACTED] has two sons, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], both of whom attended All Saints grade school, where for several years Fr. Aldo was an associate.

Approximately three weeks ago, Mrs. [REDACTED] was visiting her son [REDACTED], (now about 41 years of age) who presently lives in [REDACTED]. She informed [REDACTED] about the Laughlin situation and [REDACTED]'s immediate reaction was "He's not the only one they should go after. It was the same problem with Fr. Aldo". [REDACTED] implied that a [REDACTED], a classmate of his, had been involved with Fr. Aldo.

Fr. Aldo replied that he did not recall either [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] and certainly did not recall any incident such as [REDACTED] implied.

Bishop Waldschmidt asked Fr. Aldo directly if Fr. Aldo had a problem with his sexuality, and indicated that the Archdiocese was willing to provide whatever help might be necessary. Fr. Aldo stated that there was no problem -- and reiterated that the rumors and charges arose out of his honest efforts to assist young men who needed help.

Bishop Waldschmidt stated that he would write up a summary of the meeting and send it to Fr. Aldo for his comments and corrections, if necessary. A copy of the meeting, signed by all participants would then be given to the Archbishop for his confidential files, so that there would be an official record of the response of the Archdiocese to the issues raised.

In their discussion, Archbishop Dwyer revealed the fact that Father Aldo had a homosexual problem. That seems to be the end of the story.

Fathers Ted Frison and Gary McInnis made this report from the Newman Center at Portland State University. Last summer two male prostitutes (young boys) were picked up by Aldo and, according to them, had sexual relations. Subsequently, these two boys, especially one, found Jesus and became very religious. As a result of this conversion, they went to see Frison, and in the presence of Gary McInnis, revealed this information.

Ted Frison directed the boys to contact Father Joe Wood, Personnel Director. I believe an appointment was made, but was never kept.

Another "rumor" report comes from Bill Curtin that for a number of years the police have been suspicious that Aldo is "messaging around" with young boys.

Dear Archbishop Power,

I would like to take this opportunity to formally thank you and Father Jacobberger for your kind support and assistance during my laicization process.

As you fully realize, leaving the priesthood was a very difficult and serious life event for me and my family. During a recent growth seminar, the question was asked, "what was your greatest achievement?" My immediate response was, "being ordained a priest."

I would also like to express my deep concern and support to you as I have personally to Father Tom Laughlin over the current crisis. I remember vividly Father Ed Zenner's question at the funeral of a priest, when he was speaking of the saving and rescuing work of priests, but "who rescues the rescuer during his time of need?"

I don't know the answer to this question, but I am aware of the lack of appreciation expressed for all the good work someone like Father Laughlin has achieved and extended to others. For myself, I appreciate very much the precious opportunities I have had to know and work with him. While on the Priests' Senate, we worked and traveled together on several projects, and though we didn't always agree, I always admired his easy way with people and forthrightness.

A final concern is Father Aldo. You might recall that after I left St. Michael's residence for my assignment to MacLaren and Hillcrest Training Schools, I conveyed concern about Father Aldo's associations. I would again like to voice concern in the context that "the archdiocese does not need another scandal." While I never witnessed explicit acts and could not substantiate any wrong doing, the associations were cause for alarm. If Father Aldo has been warned and/or offered help, then this current

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letter is not necessary.

A perplexing development is press coverage and notoriety given this subject. I do not know if you had the opportunity to hear or read about the defamation of character suit against Father Hennehan in Yakima. Two abundant columns were given to a suit which has not been yet accepted by the court. Could it be that the Thronebirds series and Andrew Greeley's novels have quickened interest and readied public over-reaction?

Again, thank you for your ministry to me. If I can ever be of assistance in any way, please feel most welcome to call at any time.

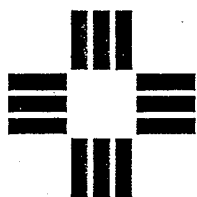

Some time ago when I reviewed various problems with you, I mentioned He is a street person who has been in and out of jail and on drugs. He accused Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta of abusing him during the 1970's when Father was pastor at St. Michael in Portland. Father Aldo denied this allegation, but it was consistent with a number of other allegations.

We have attempted to help in a variety of ways. Sister Fidelis has helped him through the St. Vincent de Paul at Cathedral. We have at least three times attempted to help him with counseling. He has begun counseling but never followed through. We have tried to help him get training for work. He frankly is very dysfunctional and will probably never recover. He comes from a dysfunctional background.

Yesterday he arrived here with his sister quite agitated. I met with them. He told me he wanted to sever all relationships with the Archdiocese and was willing to sign a release. He said in return he wanted enough money to get counseling for a year and to provide his sister with rent. He told us he thought he would need [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] to join us. We agreed to these terms. We have not been able to help him and he has been becoming an increasing problem for Sister Fidelis.

He called back after thinking about it and said he thought the cost would be closer to [REDACTED]. We agreed on [REDACTED]. She went over it in detail with Mr. [REDACTED] and his sister and had it notarized.

Both [REDACTED] and I feel that this is a good resolution. It is clear that our attempts to help him with counseling were unsuccessful and are not likely to be successful. He wanted to sever a relationship with the Archdiocese and willingly signed a release.

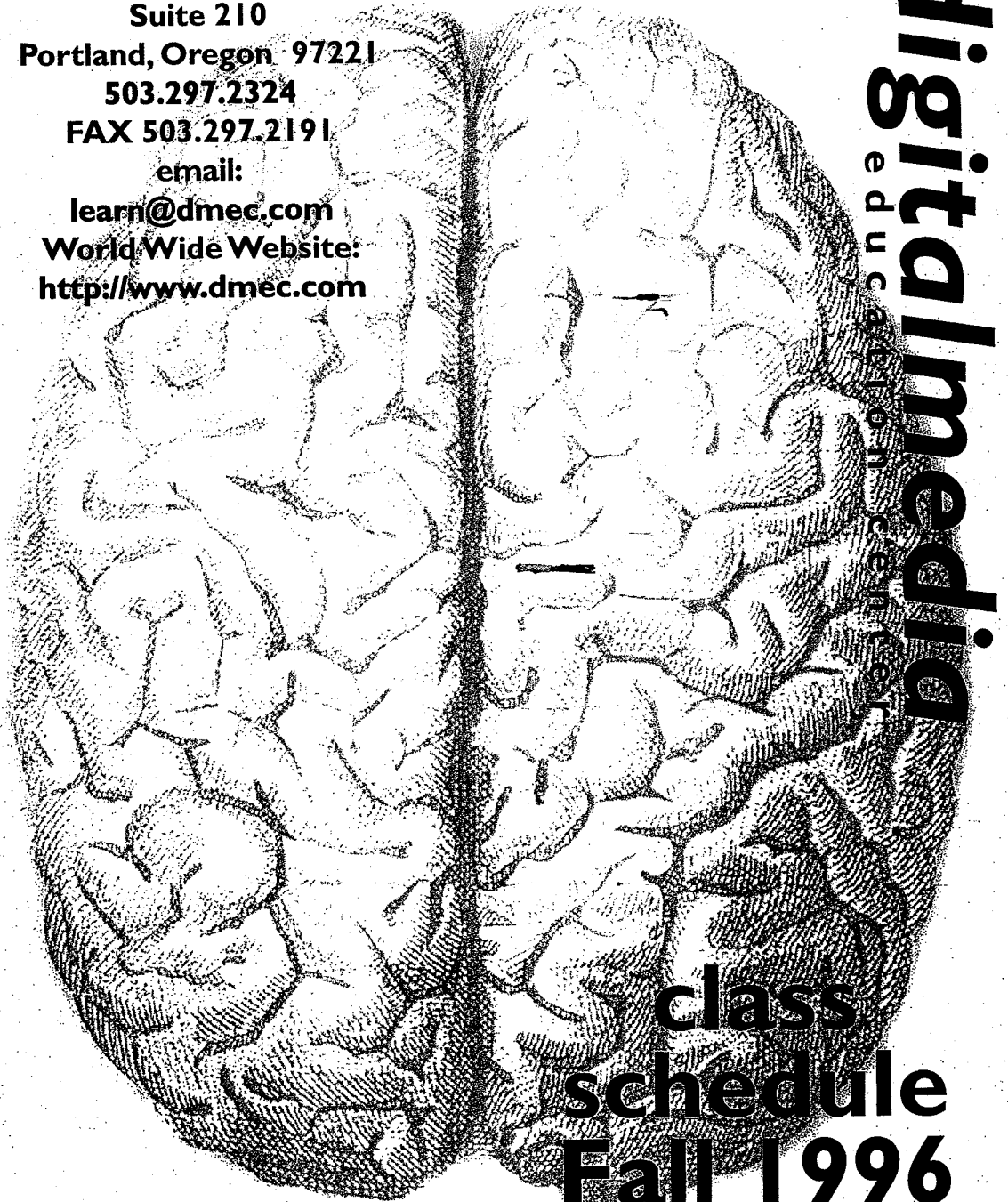

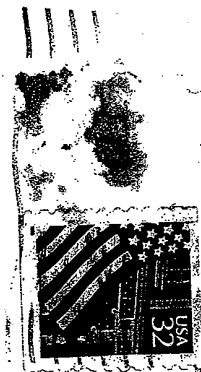

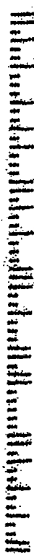
