## Sacred Heart Parish marks 100

TILLAMOOK — Several hundred people gathered here last weekend to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Sacred Heart Parish.

Among those socializing and praying were former students of the parish's grade and high schools, sisters who had taught at the parish schools, and former pastors, both Benedictine and diocesan.

The highlight of the weekend was a centennial liturgy, which was presided over by Archbishop William Levada. Five former pastors joined Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta, current pastor of Sacred Heart Parish, in concelebrating the Mass.

Music was provided by a quartet of musicians from Marylhurst, and the parish centennial choir was conducted by William Clements.

Historical highlights of the 100-year-old parish were shared with the congregation during the Mass.

The festivities began on Friday evening with a school reunion. The parish grade school was opened in 1897 and was closed in 1980.

The reunion also included students from two other Catholic institutions: Sacred Heart Academy

and Tillamook Catholic High School. The parish schools were taught by nuns from Scranton, Pa., and by Sisters of St. Mary of Oregon.

A fish fry was held in a tent specially erected on the parish grounds for the event. Father Orso-Manzonetta said that curious onlookers

were attracted by the tent, with one gawker even asking where the elephants were kept.

On Saturday evening a folk Mass was celebrated. Parishioner Sean Dooher led the music.

Following that Mass, there was a ceremony honoring people who

had been important to the parish, such as priests and sisters who had served at Sacred Heart Parish, administrators of the school and lay people.

A longtime parishioner, Thomas Waud, served as master of ceremonies for the evening's program.

Following the formal event, people danced to tunes played by Al Schwend's "The Polka-Tones."

On Sunday afternoon, following the centennial liturgy, Saturday evening's program was repeated for those unable to attend. This was followed by a spaghetti and meatball dinner prepared by women of the parish, who used a recipe given them by Father Orso-Manzonetta.

"People enjoyed the events so much," said Father Orso-Manzonetta, "that they want us to repeat the gathering every five years. We shall see... but it sure was fun!"

• Father Aldo Orso-Manzonetta, pastor of St. Peter Parish, Newberg, to be in residence at Sacred Heart Parish, Tillamook;

- Father Gregory Gage, pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish, Salem, to be pastor of St. Peter Parish, Newberg;
- Father Patrick McNamee, pastor of St. Helen Parish, Junction City, and priest moderator of St. Rose Parish, Monroe, to be

pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish, Salem;

- Father Joseph Black, pastor of St. Jude Parish, Eugene, to be pastor of St. Helen Parish, Junction City, and priest moderator of St. Rose Parish, Monroe.

• Father Richard Paperini, teacher at Central Catholic High School, Portland, to be pastor of St. Jude Parish, Eugene;

- Augustinian Father Bill Ryan to be pastor of All Souls Parish, Myrtle Creek, to fill a vacancy;

• Father William Karafi, teacher and coach at Central Catholic High School, to be pastor at Holy Trinity Parish, Bandon, succeeding Father Joseph Gebhardt, who is retiring.

Father Borho, 63, was born in Nekoma, ND, and was ordained May 18, 1957 in St. Mary Cathedral after studies at the University of Portland, Mount Angel Seminary and St. Edward Seminary, Kenmore, Wash.

Father Borho's assignments have included associate pastor at St. Cecelia (now Queen of Peace) and St. Francis parishes, Portland; St. Mary Star of the Sea, Astoria, and St. James, McMinnville. He also was assistant director of St. Mary Home for Boys, Beaverton. He has also

Father Black, 57, was born in Drumlish, County Longford, Ireland. He was ordained June 17, 1966, at All Hallows College, Dublin, after completing studies there and at St. Mel College, Longford.

Since then he has been chaplain at McAuley Hospital; associate pastor at St. Rose and Cathedral parishes, Portland, and in Astoria. He has been pastor of Star of the Sea Parish, Brookings, and has been at St. Jude since 1977.

Father Gage, 49, was born in Los Angeles. He was ordained May 20, 1967, in St. Mary Cathedral after studies at Mount Angel Seminary, with the Oblates of St. Joseph in Santa Cruz and at St. Thomas Seminary, Kenmore.

Since his ordination he has been an associate pastor at St. Henry Parish, Gresham, and All Saints, Portland. He has been pastor at St. Vincent de Paul Parish since 1979.

Father Gutmann, 33, was ordained May 27, 1983, in St. Mary Cathedral after studies at Portland State University and Mount Angel Seminary.

Since then he has been an intern at St. Peter Parish,

Eugene; parochial vicar and temporary administrator at St. Mary Parish, Eugene. He has been at the Cathedral for about a year. He also is an associate vocation director.

Father Karath, 43, was born in Cleveland. He was ordained Dec. 7, 1971, in St. Peter's Basilica, Rome, after studies at St. Charles College, Columbus, Ohio, and the Pontifical Gregorian University.

He has taught since his ordination, first in Columbus and since 1975 at Central Catholic High School. He became a priest of the Portland Archdiocese in 1979.

Father Kolasinski, 60, was born in Milwaukee where he was ordained May 25, 1957, after studying at St. Francis Seminary, Milwaukee, with the Benedictines at Benet Lake, WI, and at Harvard University.

Since his ordination he has been an associate pastor at Pecos, NM; a chaplain at Providence Hospital, Portland; an associate pastor at St. Rose Parish, Portland, and Our Lady of the Lake, Lake Oswego, where he also was temporary administrator, and Christ the King, Milwaukee. He has been pastor at St. Francis Xavier Parish, Sutherlin, Star of the Sea,

Brookings, and for the last year at Gervais and the nearby St. Louis Parish, St. Louis.

Father McHugh, 59, was born in Portland. He was ordained May 18, 1957, in St. Mary Cathedral after studies at Mount Angel Seminary and St. Edward Seminary, Kenmore.

Since his ordination he has taught at Central Catholic High School, been pastor at Immaculate Conception Parish, Stayton, and Our Lady of the Lake Parish, Lake Oswego. He then served three years as a chaplain with the military ordination and returned to be parochial vicar at St. Cecilia Parish, Beaverton. He has been at Seaside since January.

Father McNamee, 45, was born in Portland, and was ordained June 20, 1970, in All Saints Church, Portland.

His assignments have been associate pastor at All Saints, St. Joseph, St. Rose and St. Mary Magdalene parishes, Portland, and St. Mary Parish, Corvallis. He has been pastor at Junction City since 1981.

The 9-year-old Rottweiler, a breed of dog that is 1,900 years old, has a knack for impressing the boss.

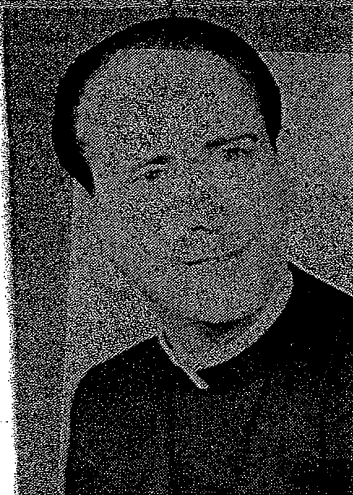
When the late Archbishop Robert Dwyer met her, he reportedly exclaimed, "My, what a princely beast!"

## Father Aldo To Mark Jubilee

Father Aldo C. Orso-Manzonetta will celebrate the silver jubilee of his ordination to the priesthood on Sunday June 1, at St. Michael the Archangel Church, 424 SW Mill St., in Portland.

A Mass of Thanksgiving will be offered at 3 p.m., followed by a reception in the parish hall.

Father Aldo received his education at St. Francis Academy, Washington High School, University of Portland, St. Thomas Seminary in Denver, Colo. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 3, 1950 (The Holy Year) at St. Mary's Cathedral by Archbishop Edward D. Howard.

Following ordination, Father Aldo was assigned to St. Cecelia where he served as administrator until June, 1951, when he was assigned to the Downtown Chapel, then as administrator at Our Lady of the Mountain, Ashland, then as assistant at All Saints' Parish in Portland, then as chaplain at Mercy Home, North Bend. He has been pastor of St. Michael's Parish since 1959.

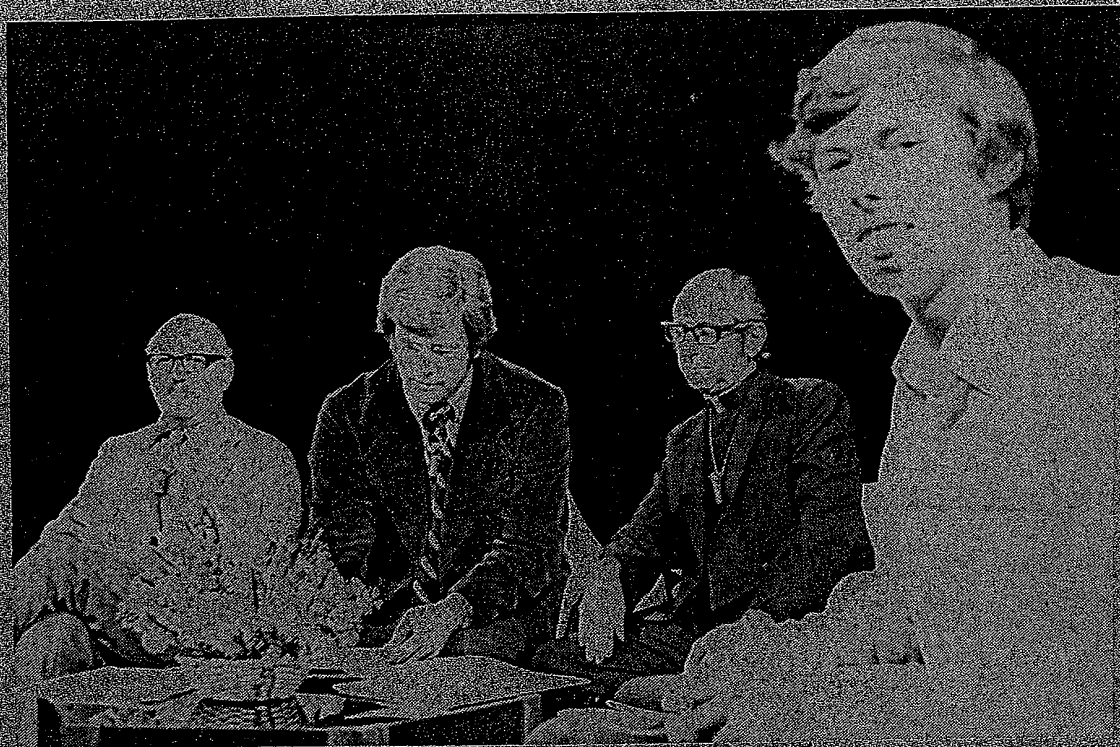

The 40th anniversary of Portland's All Saints parish will be celebrated this coming week, starting with a solemn pontifical Mass Sunday, Jan. 19.

Celebrant will be Archbishop Howard, with the Rt. Rev. Thomas J. Tobin, parish priest, as assistant priest.

This parish had its beginnings when the late Archbishop Alexander Christie purchased a lot in the Laurelhurst addition for All Saints church. A combined church and parish house was dedicated on Jan. 20, 1918, with Father William Cronin as first pastor. It was not long after that that the attractive chapel-like church was enlarged.

Early in 1928 Msgr. Arthur C. Lane was named pastor, replacing Father Cronin. During his pastorate, after settling some legal and zoning difficulties, Msgr. Lane started the parish school in 1936.

In mid-1942, the Rt. Rev. Thomas J. Tobin was appointed pastor and has served continuously since. In addition to Father Orso-Manzonetta, he now has as assistants, two priests recently arrived from Europe, Father Ridi and Father Micolvilovich.

Parish property is now bounded by N. E. 39th Ave. and Glisan St. and Laddington Ct., forming a "pie-slice" shaped area. Three large residences on N. E. Glisan St. were purchased by the parish in recent years and have been remodeled into a convent, rectory and meeting rooms.

From 1936 to 1953 the Sisters of the Holy Names taught at All Saints, and since that time the Sisters of St. Francis from Dubuque have been instructors.
