Project Summary:

Project has two main thrusts, each prioritized in the Mosquito Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP):

- 1. <u>Fuel Reduction</u>: hiring contractors with grant and SCPOA funds to create shaded fuel breaks in priority areas identified by the CWPP along the main access routes and at the head of steep canyons that can funnel fire into the community, as well as some dead tree removal; and
- 2. <u>Strengthening defensible space</u>: in-kind efforts led by residents, the Mosquito Fire Protection District (MFPD), CAL FIRE, and local volunteers (individuals in each neighborhood and teams from MFSC, SCPOA, MVFA, MFPD, and MFA) to reduce fire risk around homes.

These will be supported by education and outreach activities; planning will include a forest management plan by SCPOA as well as updating the Mosquito CWPP within the county-level CWPP renewal process.

Participation Invited: sign up to show interest in volunteer efforts (separate sheets).

<u>Defensible space evaluators</u>: train with Cal Fire (March 20, 2019, 1-3 PM); help neighbors determine needs, access resources.

<u>Owners / residents</u>: Create and maintain defensible space around homes; keep record of time and tools used, areas mowed, trees felled, etc. A standardized record sheet will be developed and shared.

Log splitting and chipping teams: help yourselves and neighbors dispose of trees and branches.

Join MFSC: help with planning, organization, outreach, and CWPP renewal.
