### THEME OF THE MONTH


Development is a vast subject, working towards it without having a specific decided goal first is a vague and uncertain method of working towards success. Hence, we came up with the Theme of Month.

### BOIDS ("bird-oid object")

Let's say you want the behavior of flocking of birds in the sky, or shoal of fish in the ocean and you want this behavior to be implemented in your open world game or your intensive VFX Movie, that's where the Boids simulation comes into play.

Boids is an Artificial Life program created by Craig Reynolds in 1986, which simulates this herd type behavior. This behavior works on three basic principles:

Separation: Steer or avoid collision with the neighboring boids.

Alignment: Align your direction to the average of all the neighboring boids' direction.

Cohesion: Move towards the average position of neighboring boids.

#### Learnings

These three rules are applied to every single entity/boid. And when letting this simulation work, it perfectly demonstrates the flocking behavior. I have similarly created this behavior in C++ language using a graphics library known as Simple and Fast Multimedia Library(SFML) for showing the behavior on the screen.

I also added an extra rule for avoiding any obstacle in the way, the implementation of it is a little bumpy but it works XD.
