
REQUIREMENTS OF APPLICANT FOR TEMPORARY CONCEALED HANDGUN PERMIT

The Tribal Council or Chief Tribal Judge of the Supreme Court may issue a temporary concealed handgun permit not to exceed 30 days to a person who a law enforcement officer believes is in an emergency situation that constitutes a significant risk of safety to that person or that person's family. The applicant may submit proof of an existing and validly issued protective order for the protection of the applicant as evidence of an emergency situation. The temporary permit may not be renewed and may be revoked by law enforcement, the Council or the Court without hearing by submitting the original written revocation document to the Prosecutor and a copy to the applicant or holder of the permit.

Upon a showing of an emergency situation, the applicant must present the following prior to consideration for the issuance of a permit:

1. An application, completed under oath, on a form provided by law enforcement that must include ATF Form 4473;
2. A non-refundable permit fee of \$25.00; and
3. A full set of legible fingerprints and proof of identification.

Prior to the issuance of a permit, a law enforcement officer **MUST** ensure that the applicant has no firearm restrictions in accordance with ATF Form 4473.
