- Complete Blood Count
- · Hepatitis B Antibody Test
- Urinalysis
- Pregnancy Testing*
- Titers -Testing for determination of immunization need and antibodies *

Hole in Tree Trough Pool/Hot Tub Place Bacillus thuringiensis Stock large troughs • Chlorine will NOT kill mosquito larvae. (Bti larvicide) in hole (effective with mosquitofish. for 2-4 weeks). • Operate filter and skimmer every day to Clean small remove egg rafts and larvae. troughs weekly. Fill holes that catch water • Drain filters and pump out sumps regularly. with insulating foam. · Keep covers tight. Drain water from top of cover weekly. · Stock unused pools with mosquitofish **Boats** Keep boats tightly covered. Check and drain cover weekly **Clogged Rain Gutter** Clean frequently to remove leaf Rain Barrel litter and keep water flowing. Screen top with fine wire mesh. Bird Bath Change water weekly. **Anything That Will Repair Leaky Hold Water More** Plumbing Than a Few Days • Drain weekly, turn upside down, throw out or recycle, or store indoors. Pond/Water Garden Stock with mosquitofish or use Bacillus thurngiensis (Bti) larvicides (such as Mosquito Dunks). Ask about Bti at your local hardware store or nursery Leaf piles and • Thin aquatic vegetation.

Here are some of the most common places mosquitos lay their eggs. By keeping these places dry or mosquito-proof, you can avoid having large groups of mosquitos around your living spaces!
