HYDRATION

MOSQUITOES

Mosquito season is here! The mosquito is the world's deadliest animal and is responsible for spreading diseases, including the West Nile Virus. Approximately 1 in 5 infected people will develop symptoms, including

fever. Here are four basic prevention methods to reduce your risk:



- **1.** Avoid being outside when mosquitoes are most likely to be active at dawn and dusk.
- **2.** Dress appropriately by wearing loose-fitting and long-sleeved shirts and pants.
- **3.** Drain standing water. Unattended swimming pools, flower/planter pots, bird baths, dog bowls, etc., are examples of mosquito-breeding sites.
- **4.** Deet Use an effective insect repellent, such as one that contains DEET, to discourage biting mosquitoes.

Breastfeeding-Friendly Worksites is a local effort to promote the state's Mother-Friendly Worksite designation program. The program is designed to provide technical assistance and support the lactation needs of breastfeeding professionals, their families, and employers.
