Each year hams radio operators from the Citrus Belt Amateur Radio Club sponsors this event. US-66 highway runs (did) from Chicago to Los Angles. Operators alone this highway set up using special call signs from W6A though W6U. The event runs for one week. Just prior to this event I purchase a used Drake B-Line which was built in January of 1971. When I started in this hobby I purchase use Drake radios and always had a soft spot in my heart for these rigs. Since route 66 was a celebration of the years back I though what better than to use these wonderful radios of the past to obtain a full sweep of working all of the stations. It took me some time and a lot of work but completed the task using this rig. Believe it or not, Oklahoma City was my hardest contact. He stayed on 20 meters for most of his time which put him to close to my QTH. But toward the end he moved to 40 and I was able to work him. One of the stations stayed on CW, so I plug my hand key into the Drake Transmitter and work him, not pretty but made the contact. Bob Heil ran W6R out his home near Springfield, MO.

Remembering Peggy Sue and Buddy Holly

Many of us remember Buddy Holly's hit song "Peggy Sue" but, did you know --

Peggy Sue Gerron, ex-K5PSG, of Lubbock, Texas, who inspired singer Buddy Holly's 1957 rockabilly hit "Peggy Sue," died on October 1. She was 78. First licensed in 2004 as KE5AKW, she later obtained the vanity call K5PSG. Her license expired in 2014, and K5PSG has since been reissued.

Gerron went to high school with Holly and later married The Crickets drummer, Jerry Allison. As rock 'n' roll history has it, Holly originally titled the song "Cindy Lou," but Allison convinced the singer to change the tune's name to "Peggy Sue." In a 2004 interview, Gerron said that story is close to the truth, but not entirely accurate.

After Holly's death in 1959, Gerron toured with The Crickets after the band got back together. Over the years, Gerron made public and media appearances all over the country.

She said her participation in the 2004 W5B special event in Lubbock commemorating Holly helped inspire her Amateur Radio aspirations. "You can do TV specials, and you can be interviewed by the very best DJs," she said, "but there is nothing like the feeling of putting your finger down, and transmitting your call sign, and having somebody answer back."

Jim Horton, WB8YWA, retired from Schneider Electric Building Automation division back in January 2012. He was National Account Manager overseeing national key customers as Verizon Business, Cox Communications, American Airlines and others. Jim's interest in Ham Radio started one very cold Michigan winter day when his Father sent him outside with a 1 watt CB hand held radio to see if he could talk with a man up in Alaska that his father was talking to on his CB base radio. He did indeed talk with this man. Afterwards when he had finished, he looked up into the sky and told himself; "this is too cool and I need to be able to do this all the time". He was fourteen. Years later in Viet Nam he had the chance to stand in line at a remote tent where the MARS station was set up with working phone patches via Barry Goldwater's ham station in Arizona. When he got in front of the Collins S-Line and heard his mother's voice in the speaker, knowing this was half way around the world, it sealed the thought; "someday I will be able to do this no matter what". He was 21 years of age. After service he left Michigan and enrolled as a freshmen at Midwestern University in Wichita Falls, Texas. He met the love of his life, Sherry, in English class and in 1968 they were married. He always states that the best thing he got out of Midwestern was Sherry. After school they went back to Michigan and had two children, James and Jodie. In 1975 Jim received his Ham license, 16 years later than that cold winter night in 1959. During this time he owned a CB store where he sold and serviced CBs. He enrolled in Bell & Howell Electronic School and completed all of the Heath/Zenith Digital courses. In 1989 he returned to Texas where he went to work at Control Systems International which later became Schneider Electric. Upon retiring he felt he should get to know more Hams locally and joined LARA where he now serves as the Technical Director. He loves all aspects of the hobby of Ham radio including chatting each morning with his close friends of 40 plus years, new friends he has just met, building his station and best of all helping others with their ham radio stations. Other interests are his four grandchildren, traveling with his wife, taking the RV on extended trips. He is active at First Baptist Church of Lewisville. Most of all is his love for Jesus.

WILL BE HOSTING A HAM RADIO TECHNICIAN CLASS

SATURDAY DECEMBER 8 & 9, 2018

8:00 AM-5:00 PM

AT THE LEWISVILLE CENTRAL FIRE STATION TRAINING ROOM

Get your first (Technician) ham radio license. All students who successfully complete the class and testing will receive their first ham radio compliments of LARA.

Entrance to the training room is at the rear of the building adjacent to the fuel pumps. Test session will be conducted on Sunday December 9 following the class. Fee for the test is \$14.00. The fee is payable in cash, check, or money order. Applicants will need to provide a form of identification, preferably photo ID, if one is available.

There is no age limit for individuals to take this class and test for the Technician license.

The class will be taught using the ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, 3rd Edition. Having the manual for the class is not mandatory but strongly suggested. It is also suggested that students review the manual prior to the class sessions. Manuals can be purchased at ARRL.org, Amazon.com, Barnes and Noble and other local book stores.




