# **Gooney Valley History Club**

Last month we asked whether you recognized the people in these two photos and promised to tell you more this month. Here is what we know.....



This family photo was taken in the 1920s, most probably in the area we know as Boyd's Mill. The man on the far right is Stephen Miller Boyd, Sr. Sitting behind him is his brother, John Boyd, and to his immediate left is his wife, Ruth Ann Bell Updike Boyd. On Ruth's left are their daughter, Mildred Brown Boyd (one of their nine children) and Mildred's son Godfrey. We do not know the name of the woman sitting on the far left. Ruth was the eldest daughter of Lafayette Updike, an important figure in the history of Browntown.

Ruth would die in 1927, just a few years after this photo was taken. Stephen, her husband, outlived her by nine years and died in 1936.

This branch of the Boyd family played a very significant role in the history of the Gooney Valley. Stephen Miller Boyd went into the mill business that we know as **Boyd's Mill, located about one mile north of Browntown**, with his father, James Wilson Boyd, in the early 1880s. He would take over full control of the mill in 1900. Stephen and Ruth built a house across the road from Mount Echo, and operated the mill until it failed in 1910. In 1907 Stephen and Ruth sold, to the South River School District No. 2, a site for a graded school building at Browntown. **That building would continue to be used as a school until it closed in 1970 when it became the Browntown Community Center.** 



The three men shooting the breeze in the back of the O.J. Rudacille store in the 1950s are all well-known local characters. On the left is **Francis Slaughter** who was the Sheriff of Warren County from 1951 to 1963. In the middle sits **Wilford George Frame** who lived on Smiths Run and worked as a carpenter in the White House in Washington DC (as did his son, Milton, for some 37 years). Finally on the right we have **William (Bill) Vincent Robinson**, one of the biggest farmers and landowners in Browntown in recent memory. **His father, Vincent Robinson, served in Mosby's brigade during the Civil War of 1861-1865.** 

Photos like these are sometimes the only link we have with the past. Please help us to ensure that our memories of those who are no longer with us are preserved.

TRUCK PULLING RAKE DESTROYED BY FIRE ON GOONEY MANOR LOOP!



We have been lucky in the last two weeks that local

shed and grass fires were contained by the quick

response of Allan Brockway, operating the brush truck stationed at the Browntown sub-station. However, back up support from Station 3 and other local fire units was essential since our brush truck (with no air-conditioning) carries only 250 gallons of water and this was not enough to extinguish either fire completely.

# LESSON LEARNED: DON'T PARK OR OPERATE A VEHICLE WHERE ITS EXHAUST SYSTEM, CATALYTIC CONVERTER OR IT'S ENGINE HEAT COULD IGNITE DRY GRASS OR STUBBLE!

FIRST LINE OF DEFENSE AGAINST A HOUSE FIRE: SMOKE DETECTORS THAT WORK Believe it or not, installing smoke detectors isn't a one-and-done task. Generally, smoke detectors are only designed to last for around 10 years. Once they pass that 10-year mark, they lose their sensitivity and don't detect smoke like they are supposed to.
