POOR CELL PHONE SERVICE & SLOW INTERNET IN BROWNTOWN

The BEARR Group that was created by the Community Center in February continues to meet on a weekly basis. The Group was formed to support the work of our local emergency services and to address other risks to our lives, property, and environment. One issue we have identified is the inadequate cell phone and internet service in our area. Cell phone service is highly variable and slow internet access has driven many of us close to despair as we try to find anyone at Centurylink who has any understanding or sympathy when our internet download speed either disappears entirely or slows to a crawl.

A power outage and/or loss of a working landline potentially places lives at risk, especially in the case of a fire or medical emergency. Slow or non-existent internet service also places local business and school children at a major disadvantage. This has been especially true for children who have been expected to work “virtually” from home during the Covid-19 pandemic. We have been in contact with Cheryl Cullers, the County Supervisor for South Warren, and she is well aware of these problems. She has been working with the Warren County Broadband group to explore ways in which these issues could be addressed and strongly supports our work in this area.

HOW HAVE YOU & YOUR FAMILY BEEN IMPACTED?

In order to make a strong case for urgent action on this issue the BEARR Group would like to hear from anyone who has experienced difficulties as a result of poor cell phone service or internet service. We are especially interested in understanding what have been the “costs” to you and your family as a result of these difficulties and also hearing about successes and frustrations you may have experienced in trying to get these issues addressed.

OPERATION TELEPHONE: PROVIDING PEACE OF MIND FOR THOSE WHO LIVE ALONE

"Operation Telephone is a free service offered by Warren County Sheriff's Dept (WCSD) to provide members of our community peace of mind. Participants are asked to call WCSD each day at 540-635-4128. If their office is not contacted by 3:00 pm, they call the person's home. If unable to make contact, one of their deputies goes to the residence to check on the individual. If you have any questions, call 635-4128. There is a form to fill out. Also, there is an app (<https://www.snugsafe.com>) so that if you don't login by a set time each day, text messages are sent to your nominated contacts. If you would rather have someone call you every day at a certain time, then I, or another volunteer, can help with that.

May is swarm season for honeybees in Browntown. We have lots of beekeepers here, creating plenty of opportunities for swarms. Bees leave their old hive when it becomes overcrowded, with about half the bees remaining behind. Swarming bees are unlikely to sting, but don't approach the swarm too closely. If you see a swarm, contact me at 703 863-3118 or call one of the other local beekeepers. I donate any swarms I catch to members of the Beekeepers of the Northern Shenandoah, (BONS), to replace hives lost over the winter or to expand their apiaries.



1. Please make checks payable to BCCA for space at the Community Center or Browntown Baptist Church for space at the fellowship hall.
2. Crafter & Vendor Space is \$20, and is non-refundable.
3. Indoor 6' tables are limited at the Community Center; however, additional tables are available at the Baptist Church Fellowship Hall.
4. Outdoor craft/vendor space, (Community Center only), is 10' x 10'
5. No Yard Sale items, this is for Crafts, Antiques and Vendors. Vendors other than Crafts or Antiques must be approved by the Redbud Committee. (We want a nice variety of Vendors, but no conflicts with BCCA sales.)
6. For outside spaces, you will be responsible for providing your own table(s), chairs and/or tent. Tent is optional and is not required, but will protect you from the weather and attract more people to your space.
7. The Redbud Festival begins at 10 am and ends at 3 p.m. You must be set up and ready to go by 10 a.m. and we ask that you don't break down your booth until closing. **Once you have unloaded, please park in the back field to allow closer parking for the buyers.**
