#### Please Slow Down on our Beautiful Browntown Roads SCHOOL HAS STARTED


Remember, our roads aren't designed for the amount of traffic they carry these days. I'm sure many of you have been going down the road and find an oncoming vehicle across the center line.

## ALONG THE GOONEY SEPTEMBER 2022 GOONEY VALLEY HISTORY CLUB Answers to LAST MONTH'S QUIZ:

Creekside is now known as Gooney Alley Road. Overall, was once known as Milford or Centre Mills. Land's Run Road, named for a local family, was once the Weary Road. Spangler's Roads, near Spangler Hall would today be Limeton. Hambaugh, was an 1800's postmaster, whose name was used for what we now call Browntown. Sugartree Creek, was re-named Gooney Run by Lord Fairfax in the mid-1700's. Folks used to take the Road around Hogback, which is now Gooney Manor Loop.

Gravelly Springs Road saw many wagon loads of bark bound for the tannery; it is now known as the Browntown Trail. Parts of the Browntown Road were once called Gooney Manor Turnpike. Sadie's Icebox, a stone outcropping, above the Venable's Cove, is also called Devil's Icebox.



Oak Grove is an old name for the Waterhouse Place, which dates back to the 18<sup>th</sup> century. Silas Thornhill Road, named for our magistrate from the 19<sup>th</sup> century, is now known as Fetchett Road. Round Mountain was known, in the mid-1800's, as Stansbury's Hill.

#### GOONEY VALLEY MYSTERY # 2: POOR HOUSE FARM

On your way into Front Royal you drive past this wonderful old barn located just to the west of the Browntown Road at the junction with Poor House Road, but how many of you know anything about the history of the William Broy tannery that operated at that location prior to 1836, or about the two-story Poor House that provided "food and shelter" to the county's disabled and poor operated from the mid 1800s until the 1940s? The original building was destroyed by a fire in 1943.


Such Poor Houses were modeled on workhouses established by the English poor laws in 1832, which provided food and shelter in return for an inmate's labor. They have been described as "Places of profound squalor and sadness" and became all but obsolete in the US after the New Deal when the government began awarding welfare payments directly to the needy. Their demise was further hastened by advances in caring for the elderly, disabled, mentally ill and others who previously were shunted into poorhouses because they had nowhere else to go.


