Crank; sisters, Diane Joy Witlow and Linda Sue McIntosh; brother-in-law Howard McIntosh; and a nephew. Surviving are two children, Hope Lee Bett and husband Jack of Glen Allen, VA and Carlton C. Crank and wife Jeannie of Penn Laird, VA; two granddaughters, Melody Lee Bett and Danielle Jeanette Crank; two great-grandchildren, Liam and Korianne; and two nieces. Mrs. Crank was born and spent early years in Louisville, KY and was a graduate of DuPont Manual H.S. 

# **News on the Union Church Steeple!**

Last Month we included an article about the condition of this wonderful 1882 church and mentioned our hope that initial repair work on the damage caused by the fall of its steeple in March, 2025, and by water entry since then, could be carried out before the end of August. This has not happened but we are still hopeful that some progress can be made before the end of September. It was our understanding that, since 2018 the Browntown Baptist Church has owned the property, but now we have been told two other churches may have some rights of ownership, making maintenance decisions more complicated. Our current understanding is that the church leaders want everyone who has expressed a concern and the desire to help to know that the churches involved are working on addressing the repairs of the building and that they will shortly let people know how they can support the Church in making those repairs.

# Warren County Fire and Rescue 2025 Citizens Fire Academy: Starts September 24, 2025 | 6:00 PM

Warren County Fire and Rescue has recently announced the return of their Citizens Fire Academy this September!

This program is free and open to any adult who lives or works in Front Royal or Warren County! <u>Location</u>: Warren County Public Safety Building (at North end of the Browntown Road).

The Citizens Fire Academy (CFA) is a **FREE seven-week program.** Participants will gain an insider's perspective on the Warren County Department of Fire and Rescue Services. Each session will focus on a different component of the department, covering topics such as emergency medical services, fire suppression, and the pathways to becoming a trained volunteer or career firefighter.

Attendees will learn about the criteria for becoming an emergency responder in our community, engage in hands-on experiences related to emergency operations, and learn essential fire and life safety information to help protect their families and homes.

## How to safely be rid of weeds or unwanted grass!

It's the time of year that many of us are dealing with weeds .... on our lawns and gardens. If you are among those who use commercially available (toxic) chemicals, such as Weed-Be-Gone, Roundup, etc., you should know that there are alternatives to these chemicals, and are much less harmful to the environment and to our bodies. One such alternative uses <u>natural ingredients</u>, found in most households; here's the recipe for an effective weed killing, (and/or grass killing), alternative:

1 Gal. Vinegar, 2 Cups Epsom Salt, ¼ Cup Dawn Detergent.

Dissolve Epson Salt in the Vinegar first. Then add in the Dawn. Stir

If a **skunk sprays your dog**, you can wash the dog with a mixture of 1 quart hydrogen peroxide, 1/4 cup baking soda, and 1 teaspoon of Dawn dish soap
