

## A BRICK FOR ROBIN ROGERS



She was a one in a million talent. The whiskey soaked voice, the sorrowful soulful harp, songs that tore the heart in two. A dynamic performer. A professional. Loyal to the core and a joy to work with A talent as big as her heart. No gig was too small, no audience too large: they all felt the magic that was Robin Rogers every time she hit the stage...She was signed by a label that loved her and appreciated her amazing abilities. Her second release on Blind Pig Records "Back in The Fire" debuted at #3 on Billboard's Blues Albums Chart. She was set to be a superstar in the blues world until cancer, the hated big C, reared its ugly head. She fought it like a warrior but within months our beloved Robin was gone. She was honored with a BMA Award for Best Contemporary Female Blues Artist in Memphis a few months later Robin Rogers was loved by all. To honor her in the City of Blues, Memphis TN, we are raising money through a raffle to buy an 8x8 brick that will be intalled in front of the Blues Hall of Fame.

You could win this limited edition plaque commemorating The Double Door Inn. Only two exist. This collectible has been donated to Charlotte Blues Society to raise funds to purchase a permanent brick which will be installed in front of the Blues Foundationbuilding in Memphis. This brick will commemorate CBS member, Award winning blues artist Robin Rogers and CBS. We are going to raffle this plaque strictly for the purchase of the brick. ## SOMETHING COLLECTIBLE FOR YOU





Sinister. What does it mean? Some definitions from the dictionary include evil, menacing, threatening, etc. You get the idea - not a good thing.

But does it really mean that? Its Latin roots mean "left" or "left-handed." Okay, maybe some parents of the sixties thought Jimi Hendrix, the left-handed guitar genius, was evil. And probably even more thought so of Black Sabbath, with their left-handed guitarist, Tony Iommi. But that was music, you say, not real life. Well, maybe Ozzy... But I digress...

The heck with this real-life stuff. Back to music!

Some decidedly not evil guitarists play or played left-handed. They represent a cross-section of music styles and genres as well as playing techniques. Let's have a look at some of them, concentrating on Blues or Blues-rock performers..

In the Blues world, probably the best known lefty is Albert King. Albert played his trademark Gibson Flying V, Lucy, left-handed, but strung right-handed - that is, with the bass strings toward the floor - the reverse of the conventional configuration. Other notable blues guitarists who play this way include Otis Rush; Eddy Clearwater; Coco Montoya, who's coming to Charlotte this week; Eric Gales, who is actually right-handed, and his late brother, Little Jimmy King; Doyle Bramhall II, who writes right-handed; and Bobby Womack. Another non-Blues notable who played this way was the late "King of Surf Guitar," Dick Dale. I've tried it (right-handed, but on a conventionally strung left-handed guitar); it isn't easy.

I came up with only a few of the more "normal" (less sinister?) lefties in the Blues world: the afore-mentioned Jimi Hendrix, who most often played a right-handed Fender Stratocaster strung left-handed, but wrote right-handed; Toronzo Cannon, who plays a left-handed guitar strung left-handed, Cesar Rosas of Los Lobos; and Al McKay of Earth, Wind & Fire. I guess the bluesers want to be more sinister, so most of them flip the strings. One other notable conventional lefty player is Paul McCartney, not a blues player but you've probably heard of him....

Among the "other" type of left-handed players are those who are left-handed but play right-handed guitars conventionally. Some of those include: both Allman brothers, Duane and Gregg; Gregg's son, Devon Allman; Jorma Kaukonen of Hot Tuna, Jefferson Airplane, and solo fame; Albert Cummings; Gary Moore; Mark Knopfler of Dire Straits; Steve Morse; and Joseph Michael Mahfoud, the featured artist from the Blues Society's 25th anniversary Blues Bash last April.

Definitely not bad company to be in...

Next time, we'll explore some right-handed guitarists who play right-handed. Ha-ha. Just kidding...

O M M Y

Tommy Z is a contemporary blues artist and radio host from Buffalo, NY who has been described as a "blues treasure" by legendary 97 Rock/WBFO DJ Jim Santella, and "one of WNY's best kept secrets" by Sarah French, Blues Matters Magazine. He is a guitar-driven electric blues-based stylist onstage, but in the studio Tommy composes a variety of music. So while experienced and studied in traditional blues, jazz and rock styles, Tommy is an artist who puts that soulful blues feeling into all the different styles he plays. He's been been recognized with numerous awards over the years, including being voted Top Blues Vocalist in Western New York 2003/2004/2006, Top Blues Guitarist 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 2004, 2005, 2006 and his band has won the Top Blues/Crossover Blues Band categories 1994, 2005, 2006, and was honored with the Muddy Waters Award for "Artist of the Year" by the Blues Society of WNY in 2004. In 2007 Tommy was inducted into the Buffalo Music Hall of Fame, recognizing him alongside some of the best talent to ever come out of WNY (including Rick James, The Goo Goo Dolls, Billy Sheehan, etc.). He has had the opportunity to perform, record with/or co-bill with some of the world's top artists in the blues/rock genre including: B.B. King (and daughter Shirley), Buddy Guy, Johnny Winter, The Fabulous Thunderbirds, Jeff Healey, Colin James, Tinsley Ellis, Roomful of Blues, Blues Traveler, Derek Trucks, Joe Bonamassa, Robert Randolph, Peter Frampton, Ian Gillan (Deep Purple), Carey Bell, John Mayall, Lynyrd Skynyrd, Tommy Castro, Duke Robillard, Elvin Bishop and many more including a tour backing up Grammy-winning blues legend Pinetop Perkins (Muddy Waters Band). Tommy has come a long way from playing the top bars and music venues in Buffalo to being an international and domestic festival headliner.

The son of a Vietnam-era veteran, he has been bringing a taste of home to US troops overseas since 2003 with blues-based concert tours in Iraq, Afghanistan, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, United Arab Emirates, Bahrain, Qatar, Japan, South Korea, Djibouti, Italy, Spain, Portugal, Egypt, Turkey, Guam, Alaska and other distant locales on behalf of USO/AFE. Rolling Stone Magazine called some of these locations, "The most dangerous gigs on Earth." Tommy contributed guitar tracks to Deep Purple vocalist/Rock and Roll Hall of Famer Ian Gillan's CD on Immergent called Gillan's Inn, on the track "When A Blind Man Cries," which also featured blues-rock legend Jeff Healey and of course Deep Purple's Jon Lord.

In 2006 a CD entitled Universal Love was produced with outstanding Canadian engineer/producer Nick Blagona (BeeGees, Chicago, Police), and it was described as "soul-rockin' blues" by Bob Putignano, NYC Blues Society President and Sounds of Blue DJ (WFDU), "awesome" by Bob Silvestri, Best of WNY, and "should feature high on your list of 'new' acts to investigate" Mick Rainsford, Blues in Britain Magazine. He's been featured/mentioned in industry magazines such as Fender's Frontline, Mix Magazine, Blues Matters, Blues Blast, Blues Music Magazine (Germany), Blues-E-News, Jazz/Blues Florida and Guitar Edge Magazine, etc.

In addition to his performance schedule, Tommy is a Canisius College graduate (BA Communication), guitar teacher, and between CD's as an artist he has spent much of his creative time as composer/producer for Film, TV, Sports, etc. His credits include writing the victory song for the St. Louis Blues (NHL), Red Hot Chili Peppers Biography, Ryan and Sean's Not So Excellent Adventure (iTunes #1 indie film), Last Comic Standing (NBC), TLC's Stager Invasion, Animal Planet's Swamp Wars (main title), Bravo's Chef Roble and Co., Insane Pools: Off the Deep End, Discovery Channel's Biker Live, America's Top Model, Insane Pools/Off the Deep End and others.

In 2015 the band was invited to be the international headliner for the Cali Blues and Folk Festival in Colombia, South America for nearly two weeks of concerts and master classes which were extremely positive in their reception. In 2015 Tommy was hired as a new blues radio host/DJ by the NPR/WNED affilated station WBFO 88.7 FM where he programs classic and modern blues music for listeners in the WNY/Southern Ontario area and online at www.wbfo.org. The follow-up album, "Blizzard of Blues" was released in the Winter of 2016. Two weeks before the official release date it debuted as the #1 Blues Rock Album (Roots Music Report) where it spent eight straight months on the RMR airplay charts. On the day of release it shot up onto iTunes Top 10 Blues Chart while being featured and then it debuted on the Billboard Blues Top 10 Album Chart alongside such greats as Billy Gibbons, Gary Clark Jr., Johnny Winter, Buddy Guy, Tedeschi/Trucks, etc. It was the only release by an unsigned independent artist on that week's chart. The reviews and accolades and chart positions continued to pile up for "BoB" including a debut on the Feb. 2016 Living Blues Radio Chart at #14.

In the Summer of 2018, Beth Hart had a short term medical issue which forced her to cancel an appearance in Western New York opening for Kenny Wayne Shepherd. When names were being tossed around the KWS tour bus for a replacement, it was none other than Chris "Whipper" Layton, drummer for Stevie Ray Vaughan and Double Trouble, who spoke up and said,"I know him (Tommy Z), call those guys." It turned out to be one of the most epic Canalside concerts ever. 2018 concluded with the Tommy Z Band as the headliner of the Buffalo Ball Drop. It is the 2nd largest ball drop in the country with upwards of 40,000 in attendance and widespread TV coverage.

Mary Lane – Travelin' Woman (Women Of The Blues Records WOB001) www.ormanmusicmedia.com/women-of-the-blues-records/

One of last surviving members of the generation of blues artists who endured the Great Migration, Chicago Blues Hall of Famer Mary Lane called upon the heavyweights for this release, her first album

since Mojo Mamas in 2000.

Once a favorite of piano great Sunnyland Slim and currently the subject of the film documentary, I Can Only Be Mary Lane, she's an expressive old-school blues shouter who's backed here by harp masters Corky Siegel and Billy Branch, guitarists Dave Specter and Colin Linden and two recently departed sax legends, Gene Barge (Muddy Waters and Etta James) and Eddie Shaw (Howlin' Wolf). This collection of ten tunes – all penned by Lane in collaboration with producer Jim Tullio or Linden – are an unexpected treasure from a Windy City standard bearer who remains at the top of her game at 83.

The debut release of Women Of The Blues Records, highlights include the uptempo "Leave That Wine Alone," the slow-blues burner "Let Me Into Your Heart," the uptempo shuffle "Ain't Nobody Else" and the Delta-flavored "Make Up Your Mind."





Arlen Roth - Tele Masters (Aguinnah Records AQ 0414) www.arlenroth.com

Here's a release that's a little outside the box as far as blues lovers go. Arlen Roth is one of the most influential musicians of all time with a track record that includes work with Bob Dylan, Levon Helm, Ry Cooder and The Bee Gees, among others, and he serves up a guitar lover's delight with this one. A mostly instrumental album that includes a mix of blues, country and early '60s rock, it features six-string duets throughout with a cast of characters that includes Joe Bonamassa, Steve Cropper, Albert Lee and several others. Among the highlights are "Remington Ride" with Wariner, "White Lightning" with Cropper, "Funky Mama" with Hiland and "Promised Land" with Donahue. Stinging, singing guitar loaded with fat reverb, a little twang and over-the-top style throughout. Highly recommended.

Gaye Adegbalola – The Griot (Hot Toddy Music/VizzTone Label Group VT-HTM-2420) www.adegbalola.com

As a 25-year member of Saffire – The Uppity Blues Women, Adegbalola was never shy about speaking her mind, frankly delivering basic truths with a wry sense of humor, and she lays it on full force once again with this tasty solo effort.

A gifted songwriter, guitarist and harmonica player, Adegbalola carries forward the songster/storyteller of West Africa tradition, she penned 14 of the 17 tunes here, which deal with everything from adult themes to mundane observations about everyday life. The uptempo opener, "Nothing's Changed," boldly states that racism in America remains strong despite the passage of time, that folks with big money still control everything and that there's much more that we can do. "Liearrhea" deals with folks who grin in your face while simultaneously spreading vicious untruths. Gaye warns the double-talkers, however, that she's going to "love the hell right out of you."

On a more upbeat note, "Ain't Technology Grand?" commends modern devices for putting the entire world in your hand and capture wrong for everyone to see. Fair warning, though: Some of the lyrics on this one include explicit language. PAGE 10





Little Queenie – Purple Heart (Deeva Records/XYYX Records XYYX003) www.littlequeenie.com

A fixture in New Orleans since the '70s, where she performed regularly at Tipitina's, Leigh "Little Queenie" Harris is currently living in hospice care in rural North Carolina where she's fighting a valiant battle against breast cancer. This disc consists of recently rediscovered material once thought lost after Hurricane Katrina devastated the city.

She delivers a roux of funk, blues and R&B here backed by an all-star lineup that includes guitarists Jimmy Robinson and CC Adcock and Austin-based bassist Sarah Brown. The opener is a previously unheard version of Queenie's "My Dawlin New Orleans," aided by Bonerama.

The slow shuffle "Whatever You Had" describes the realization that the singer doesn't love her man any longer and that it's time for him to go. Other highlights "Lost My Mind," delivered from the position of a lady who's both devil and angel, the soul blues "Shoulda Kept On Walkn," and the percussive "He Knows His Way Around" in which Queenie in the role of a MILF on the hunt for a young, skillful lover.

Various Artists – Blue Muse (Music Maker Relief Foundation MMCD198) www.musicmaker.org

Based in Hillsborough, N.C., Music Maker Relief Foundation celebrates its 25th anniversary of providing aid to impoverished traditional Southern musicians with this meaty compilation, which includes cuts from many of its artists as well as a helping hands from Taj Mahal, Eric Clapton, Dom Flemons of the Carolina Chocolate Drops and soul-blues star Robert Finley.

Among the artists included in its 21 cuts are 92-year-old Atlanta keyboard wizard Eddie Tigner, 89-year-old John Dee Holeman, Guitar Gabriel, Cary Morin and Ironing Board Sam. Don't miss the richly illustrated booklet that accompanies this one. It's a companion piece to a coffee table book of MMRF founder Tim Duffy's stunning black-and-white photos, also entitled Muse. His images will also be on exhibit at the New Orleans Museum Of Art from late April through July 28, 2019.



Marty Gunther has lived a blessed life where the blues is concerned. A native Rhode Islander now based in Charlotte and App State alum, his first experiences with live music came at the feet of first-generation blues legends at the Newport Folk Festivals in the 1960s. A professional journalist and harmonica player whose work appears in Blues Blast Magazine and other outlets, he was a longtime member of the Chicago blues community before founding the Nucklebusters, a band that's been entertaining South Florida since 1987. Marty is also a member of Charlotte Blues Society and on the Board of Directors of CBS.








# BLUES JAM GUIDELINES

Blues Jam Guidelines and Courtesies Charlotte Blues Society Blues Jam.

You are participating in a tradition that is over 25 years in the making. The Charlotte Blues Society has consistently promoted a Blues Jam as part of its Blues Sunday. The Charlotte Blues Society's Blues Sunday occurs on the first Sunday of each month. The Blues Jams do not happen at every Blues Sunday. Always refer to charlottebluessociety.org for details and schedules. We hope your experience will be inspiring and that your own musical abilities will be informed by these jams.

We offer the following guidelines to consider when signing on as a participating jammer:

\*A practical suggestion, sign up early. On the sign-up sheet please list your instrument and/or ability that you wish to contribute to the Jam. While the Blues has a lot of variations, please be advised this is a Blues Jam. Please keep it real ladies and gentlemen.

\*Be respectful of any equipment that you use, backline and PA, treat it as your own or possibly better than your own. If you have a special amp, pedal or set-up that you need to use, remember guideline #1; Come early

\*Keep track of your place on the sign-up sheet. It is not up to the Jam Master to track you down when your time to shine arrives.

\*Please be advised that you need to be tuned and ready BEFORE you get on stage. Additionally, if you are a guitarist that tunes down a half step, please note the House band will be tuned to standard 440. Two choices remain, either tune to 440 or make allowances in your choice of a chord voicing.

\*If you only hear yourself on stage, perhaps you are too loud. Likewise, if you hear everyone else, but not yourself; turn up.

\*Be respectful of your fellow musicians, no matter what their ability may be. Everyone usually starts at the same place.

\*In regards to soloing, again please be respectful of other musicians in the jam. For example, rhythm guitar is not just something to waste your time on while you wait for your next solo. One of the lessons of a Blues Jam is to learn how to be as apt an accompanist as you hope to be as a soloist. The Jam Master will be generous with solos, but be mindful of other musicians that may be waiting to jam.

\*Lastly, have fun. Also respect the traditions as well as the innovations of the Blues. Likewise, respect the Charlotte Blues Society and The Rabbit Hole for providing the space and equipment for you to jam.

We are fortunate to have an experienced blues man and great "Jam Master" in Michael Ingmire. Help him make it a great jam by following our guidelines. No matter what degree of experience you have, Michael will help make your first, and every jam, one that is fun and make you want to come back for more!


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


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
