

Remembering Ray

I was at the Double Door about 6 years ago and someone said to me "Do you know Ray? You would really like talking to this guy...you have to meet him". No, they weren't trying to "set me up" they just knew I had a passion for music and loved to talk in depth with others that were as enthusiastic. Ray Otstott was definitely one of those people. His knowledge far exceeded mine, as he was also a real musician, (as opposed to me, who plays piano and guitar, but not for public consumption). Ray's perspective revolved around his love of the guitar-and it was always evident. The first thing I noticed about Ray was he was among a handful of people I have known that are truly nice and kind to the core. He was even tempered. He had an amazing wit, and often submitted captions for The Charlotte Observer's "you Write the Caption" Challenge for editorial cartoonist Kevin Siers that ran for several years. His captions were always the least predictable, and the funniest. When Ray poked fun at you, it was pure fun, never mean. His smile always lurked near the surface, his full smile and enthusiasm was contagious, and his love of music bonded him to anyone who shared that joy.



I was privileged to get to know Ray more through the years, and when I began writing the newsletter in March 2017, I wanted more input from our music community. I knew Ray had written some reviews for books, music, venues and added his voice to Quora when a question arose around Jazz guitarists, or anything of a musical nature. It didn't take a rocket scientist to want him to write his first article "On The Road" in March 2017. He based it on the musicians he saw while traveling. He was apologetic at the time, saying "I'm not a writer", but you can read his enthusiasm, which is what we needed. By the end of the year, he was a member of our Board of Directors, and we were blessed to have him. He took over the membership and the merchandise coordinator/administer. He accounted for every penny, he was at events promoting the Blues Society-not just at The Rabbit Hole-but at McGlohon, Neighborhood Theatre, The Evening Muse, Whitewater Center, he was the first to volunteer if he was available. He loved his family and friends, and good Lord, if there was a guitar slinger in town, you can bet (if he was worth seeing) Ray was there. He continued to contribute to the newsletter with music reviews, and his last article "Sinister" was in last month's newsletter. He called me and said "I sent you something, edit it as needed, but I think you'll like it". I did.

Ray was a great balance on our board, and I would call him on occasion. bounce an idea off him, knowing he would consider his response thoughtfully. He took his position seriously and his dedication was noteworthy-especially as I knew he was battling pancreatic cancer at the same time. He was my hero: his attitude was always positive. When he was in the ER that Monday, he was more concerned about not making the board meeting the next day and making sure business for CBS was taken care of. That was Ray.

I found a photo one of our friends had taken of Ray recently, and I have included it here. It is quintessential Ray Otstott. The intense concentration on his face as he really listens to the music and the musicians is a look of rapture. He was totally engaged. It was a look those of us who have seen him at shows recognize immediately. He paid attention, he listened and he loved music. The Friday before he died, he saw Pat Matheny. Pure Ray, music filled his soul.

Ray donated the Candy Apple Red Guitar we are raffling this year. It was from his personal collection. The first signature on the guitar was his. It will continue to gather signatures throughout the year, and I will think of him often and miss him more than you'll know. We lost more than a board member or member of our group. We lost a good man. You will be missed my friend. Love you buddy.



A BRICK FOR ROBIN ROGERS



She was a one in a million talent. The whiskey soaked voice, the sorrowful soulful harp, songs that tore the heart in two. A dynamic performer. A professional. Loyal to the core and a joy to work with A talent as big as her heart. No gig was too small, no audience too large: they all felt the magic that was Robin Rogers every time she hit the stage...She was signed by a label that loved her and appreciated her amazing abilities. Her second release on Blind Pig Records "Back in The Fire" debuted at #3 on Billboard's Blues Albums Chart. She was set to be a superstar in the blues world until cancer, the hated big C, reared its ugly head. She fought it like a warrior but within months our beloved Robin was gone. She was honored with a BMA Award for Best Contemporary Female Blues Artist in Memphis a few months later Robin Rogers was loved by all. To honor her in the City of Blues, Memphis TN, we are raising money through a raffle to buy an 8x8 brick that will be intalled in front of the Blues Hall of Fame.

You could win this limited edition plaque commemorating The Double Door Inn. Only two exist. This collectible has been donated to Charlotte Blues Society to raise funds to purchase a permanent brick which will be installed in front of the Blues Foundationbuilding in Memphis. Geoff Achison Sunday May 5 The Rabbit Hole CBS Blues Sunday

In 2017 Charlotte Blues Society treated our members to an special evening of blues from Australian Blues guitarist/singer/songwriter and winner of multiple Australian Blues Awards, Geoff Achisonl. He was accompanied in the States by his American Soul Diggers tour group and they rock the Rabbit Hole all evening.

In 2018, Geoff's planned U.S. Tour took a de-Tour, and a night of acoustic blues was put on hold. Sunday May 5th is the final Inight of Geoff's US tour for 2019, and it will appropriately enough end its run at The Rabbit Hole performing for the Charlotte Blues Society once again.

This special evening is one that will long be remembered for those who are fans of Achison, who is best known for his guitar playing and songwriting.

Geoff began his apprenticeship with legendary Australian bluesman 'Dutch' Tilders establishing himself as a fine lead guitarist before striking out with his own. He released his debut album in the early 90s and began touring throughout the USA, UK & Europe. Geoff's music has been compared favourably to major artists such as Eric Clapton, JJ Cale and the Allman Brothers Band having a solid foundation in the blues and was honoured in 2011 as official Patron Of the Melbourne Blues Appreciation Society. Early in his music career, Geoff developed a keen interest in American blues which re-kindled his interest in studying six-stringed guitar. In rural isolation, he was mostly unaware of the electronic effects employed by some guitarists and devised some of his own techniques to emulate the sounds of echo/delay, tremolo and wah-wah pedals which added to his unique playing style.

In 1987 Geoff made the move to Melbourne and soon established himself on the scene playing lead guitar for popular Australian blues performer 'Dutch' Tilders. In time Geoff began to work on his own music releasing his debut album 'Big Machine' in 1994. He represented Melbourne at the 'International Blues Challenge' in Memphis TN winning the coveted 'Albert King Award' in 1995. Encouraged, he set his sights on the world market and successfully established international touring routes in the USA and UK. To overcome the difficulties of bringing a band from Australia, Geoff began hiring local musicians to form a backing group when required. On his first extended overseas trip, Geoff received a beautiful new acoustic guitar from the famous Gibson guitar company and recorded his third album 'Gettin' Evil' with a US version of his 'Souldiggers' band. Upon his return to Melbourne, Geoff was able to recruit an all-star group which featured some of Australia's most celebrated musicians. With Mal Logan on keys, Roger McLachlan on bass and Gerry Pantazis on drums, Geoff was finally able to realise his musical vision with The Souldiggers and built the group's reputation with exciting and spontaneous live performances.

As a song-writer, Geoff explores a myriad of themes from love & loss to politics & philosophy and often with his wry sense of humour shining through. Vocally, Geoff has been compared favourably to the gruff voiced Joe Cocker, Warren Haynes and Paul Weller. An extraordinary guitarist who plays quite unlike anyone else, Geoff has been a driving force on the Australian blues/roots scene inspiring and influencing many of his younger compatriots.

Little Boys Blue – Hard Blue Space (VizzTone Label Group VT-LBB-18) www.littleboysblue.bandzoogle.com/

Little Boys Blue have pretty much flown under the radar nationally among blues lovers for two decades, but the band out of Jackson, Tenn., should make major waves with this release of rock-solid, thoroughly original music that come across with a strong traditional feel.

The band's fronted by JD Taylor, a double-barreled talent whose pleasingly easy-greasy vocals are matched by his rich, full-bodied tone on harmonica. Aided by a quartet of guitarists -- including John Holiday, aka Kid Memphis, and JD's son, Alex - the rhythm section keeps things swinging from the jump.

Highlights on this one include "Blues Bug," "Hard Blue Space," "Might As Well" and "If The Blues Start Calling," but the entire set is terrific. This one's going onto my short list for album of the year.

If you're an old-school traditionalist like me, you'll definitely wear this one out.

Tony Holiday - Porch Sessions (VizzTone Label Group VT-THPS01)

Originally from Utah, but now based out of Memphis, Tony Holiday is a gifted singer and harmonica player in his own right, but strikes gold with this 13-song, all-star laden disc that was recorded while touring nationally himself and captured on the front porches of several of the participants during his stops.

Among the artists featured here are fellow harp players Charlie Musselwhite, Bob Corritore, Aki Kumar, James Harman, Ronnie Shellist, Mitch Kashmar and John Nemeth as well as guitarists Kid Andersen, John Primer, Kid Ramos, Rockin' Johnny Burgin and Matthew Wilson. The powerful, but relaxed informal performances kick off with Harman for "Pick-Pocket Fingers." Other highlights include Musselwhite and Kumar

double-teaming "That's Alright," Nemeth covering Little Sonny's "Woman Trouble" and Junior Wells' "Blues Hit Big Town" and Holiday's closer, "Coin Operated Woman."

If you love harmonica, you'll adore this one. It shines like a diamond. Good news: Holiday just recorded a follow-up that was captured on the steps of Stax Records with an equally impressive cast of characters. Look for that one down the road.

GAlly Venable - Texas Honey (Ruf Records 1267)



Based out of Kilgore, Texas, guitarist/vocalist Ally Venable burst onto the music scene in the Lone Star State at age 12 and is already a veteran road warrior blues rocker despite not turning 20 until this past April.

A collection of nine originals and two covers and the third CD in her catalog, this one was produced by Mike Zito at his home base in Nederland, Texas, and features a guest appearance by Eric Gales. But the star of the show is Venable, a fiery string bender with a sweet set of pipes.

"Nowhere To Hide' powers out of the gate as Ally comes face-to-face with her own cold heart and the trouble it brings before delivering "Broken,' the realization that the uncaring attitude she displayed in dealing with a cheating lover was nothing but a sham.

Other pleasers include the self-descriptive "Texas Honey," "Come And Take It," which features Gales, and "One-Sided Misunderstanding, which gives Zito space to shine..





LBig Daddy Wilson – Deep In My Soul (Ruf Records 1259)

A native of Edenton, N.C., Big Daddy Wilson has been living in Europe and has made a name for himself as an acoustic bluesman for the past decade with a track record that includes several excellent CDs. But he returns to the States and fronts a full band to delve into his soul-blues roots. The result is magical.

Recorded and produced by Grammy-winning producer Jim Gaines (Santana) near Memphis and the legendary FAME Studios in Muscle Shoals, Ala., and featuring the sensational Laura Chavez on guitar and a full horn section, this one simply smokes.

Highlights include "I Know," the sweet love-song opener, the pure funk "Tripping On You," the deep blues ballads "Hold On To Our Love" and "Redhead Stepchild" and the wah-wah driven "Voodoo."


John Mayall – Nobody Told Me (Forty Below Records)

Now in his mid-80s, John Mayall has been making music since leaving work as a graphic artist more than 60 years ago. Not that he needs it, he hits on all cylinders here in power blues trio format with helping hands from Joe Bonamassa, Larry McCray, Todd Rundgren, Alex Lifeson, Steven Van Zandt and Carolyn Wonderland.

Mayall's on keys and Bonamassa's at the controls for "What Have I Done Wrong," the first of seven covers to open the 10-tune set. He yields to McCray for "The Moon Is Full" with John doubling on harp before Lifeson jumps into action for "Evil And Here To Stay" and Rundgren for the Little Milton standard, "That's What Love Will Make You Do."

Like fine wine, Mayall continues to get better with age. Other don't miss cuts include the trio of originals that conclude the set: "It's So Tough," featuring Van Zandt, and "Like It Like You Do" and "Nobody Told Me," aided by Wonderland. If you're a musician, you'll find keys to all the tunes in the liner notes.



Marty Gunther has lived a blessed life where the blues is concerned. A native Rhode Islander now based in Charlotte and App State alum, his first experiences with live music came at the feet of first-generation blues legends at the Newport Folk Festivals in the 1960s. A professional journalist and harmonica player whose work appears in Blues Blast Magazine and other outlets, he was a longtime member of the Chicago blues community before founding the Nucklebusters, a band that's been entertaining South Florida since 1987. Marty is also a member of Charlotte Blues Society and on the Board of Directors of CBS.



BLUES JAM GUIDELINES

Blues Jam Guidelines and Courtesies Charlotte Blues Society Blues Jam.

You are participating in a tradition that is over 25 years in the making. The Charlotte Blues Society has consistently promoted a Blues Jam as part of its Blues Sunday. The Charlotte Blues Society's Blues Sunday occurs on the first Sunday of each month. The Blues Jams do not happen at every Blues Sunday. Always refer to charlottebluessociety.org for details and schedules. We hope your experience will be inspiring and that your own musical abilities will be informed by these jams.

We offer the following guidelines to consider when signing on as a participating jammer:

*A practical suggestion, sign up early. On the sign-up sheet please list your instrument and/or ability that you wish to contribute to the Jam. While the Blues has a lot of variations, please be advised this is a Blues Jam. Please keep it real ladies and gentlemen.

*Be respectful of any equipment that you use, backline and PA, treat it as your own or possibly better than your own. If you have a special amp, pedal or set-up that you need to use, remember guideline #1; Come early

*Keep track of your place on the sign-up sheet. It is not up to the Jam Master to track you down when your time to shine arrives.

*Please be advised that you need to be tuned and ready BEFORE you get on stage. Additionally, if you are a guitarist that tunes down a half step, please note the House band will be tuned to standard 440. Two choices remain, either tune to 440 or make allowances in your choice of a chord voicing.

*If you only hear yourself on stage, perhaps you are too loud. Likewise, if you hear everyone else, but not yourself; turn up.

*Be respectful of your fellow musicians, no matter what their ability may be. Everyone usually starts at the same place.

*In regards to soloing, again please be respectful of other musicians in the jam. For example, rhythm guitar is not just something to waste your time on while you wait for your next solo. One of the lessons of a Blues Jam is to learn how to be as apt an accompanist as you hope to be as a soloist. The Jam Master will be generous with solos, but be mindful of other musicians that may be waiting to jam.

*Lastly, have fun. Also respect the traditions as well as the innovations of the Blues. Likewise, respect the Charlotte Blues Society and The Rabbit Hole for providing the space and equipment for you to jam.

We are fortunate to have an experienced blues man and great "Jam Master" in Michael Ingmire. Help him make it a great jam by following our guidelines. No matter what degree of experience you have, Michael will help make your first, and every jam, one that is fun and make you want to come back for more!




