



Jeff Beck & the Blues

"The Blues had a baby and they named it Rock and Roll"-Muddy Waters

There would be no nineteen sixties British musical invasion on the shores of America without the Blues records that Sailors, American and other nationalities, brought to various British ports in the 1950's. Because of those shared records; American Blues became the lifeblood of a lot of British musicians. One who was especially smitten was Jeff Beck. With the recent passing of Jeff, I found myself reflective on the influence of the Blues on him. I recently wrote a piece about Beck for *Politichicks.com "Jeff Beck (1944-2023), published on January 26, 2023.* That article is a historical profile of Jeff. From the womb to the tomb. For the purposes of this article, and the organization it is written for, this article is about Jeff Beck and the Blues.

Jeff Beck became enamored of the guitar when he and his Mother were listening to Les Paul and Mary Ford play and sing the classic, "How High the Moon." Jeff was six. Hearing the sound of Les's guitar, Jeff asked his Mother, "What instrument is that?" His Mother's response was, "That is an electric guitar." Beck replied,

Early in his musical development, Jeff Beck was influenced by Les Paul, B.B. King, Steve Cropper, Cliff Gallup (who played guitar for Gene Vincent) and Lonnie Mack, among many. Later on, Steve Cropper produced the immortal 1972 "Jeff Beck Group" album with the great version of the Don Nix classic, "Going Down," on it.

Jeff Beck was exposed to the Blues by Rolling Stones co-founder and Pianist, Ian Stewart. Stewart loaned Beck an album titled "American Folk Festival of the Blues." This album included two tracks by Buddy Guy. Buddy Guy was a huge influence and inspiration on Jeff Beck's guitar work. The Folk Festival of the Blues album was part of a yearly festival that would include European tours featuring musicians like Muddy Waters, Howlin' Wolf, Willie Dixon and Buddy Guy, among others.

As a guitarist, I considered Jeff Beck to be very similar to Buddy Guy and Hubert Sumlin. These two musicians were both frenetic and graceful, like the best of Deep Blues. Unlike Eric Clapton or boyhood friend, Jimmy Page, Beck went for the quirky side of the Blues. Deeply influenced by Guy and Sumlin. Jeff Beck became possessed by the Blues. In 1965, when Beck was 21 and Eric Clapton was 20, they spent the night in a van so they could get early seats to a Buddy Guy concert in London.

Clapton was inspired by Guy's use of a three piece line-up which directly influenced Clapton's approach in his future power trio, Cream. With Jeff Beck, Guy's playing directly influenced his approach to guitar player, both in technique and sonic dexterity. The Blues, and other musical forms, helped to lead Beck to become a sonic warrior with the guitar.

When Jimi Hendrix first came to England in 1966, the two people that he first wanted to meet were Jeff Beck and Eric Clapton. Without the early innovations of Jeff Beck, his use of the Stratocaster tremolo arm for deep bends and harmonic feedback, it would be difficult to imagine some of the more interesting innovations of Hendrix.

Whenever Jeff Beck would jam with someone like SRV, Buddy Guy, B.B. King, Albert Collins or any great Bluesman, there was almost a childhood-like change in his demeanor.

The lines disappeared from his face and Beck became almost like an enthusiastic teenager. In the aftermath of Beck's passing, I found myself watching his performances with the aforementioned Bluesmen and Eric Clapton, among many. What I liked about Jeff Beck's Blues playing was that he was unabashedly free. Unlike many of his contemporaries, Beck was not as concerned about getting the tradition of the Blues down as he was about pursuing the freedom and innovation of the best Blues playing.

I profoundly regret never being able to see Jeff Beck live in person. Either I was gigging or I was broke. Yet, as a guitarist, he remains a profound influence. Interestingly enough, Beck himself has credited Beatles Producer, George Martin, as the one person who gave him a career. Martin was the Producer for the best selling Jeff Beck album, "Blow by Blow." That experience helped Jeff become free as an artist. The Blues remained part of his artists forte. Yet, he pursued many different idioms throughout his career.

Without a doubt, Jeff Beck will not be replaced, in this lifetime or the next.


JOE LOUIS WALKER - WEIGHT OF THE WORLD

San Francisco native Joe Louis Walker has released plenty of outstanding albums in his 50-year career, but he outdoes himself on his latest effort, a deeply personal, all-original effort that bears his soul and touches on problems that all of us endure while living in a post-COVID world.

Produced by BMA nominee/tunesmith Eric Corne at The Building in Marlboro, N.Y., not far from Joe's adopted home in the Hudson River Valley, Walker alternates between electric, slide and nylon-string guitars and harp as he delivers one of the most emotionally charged sets you'll hear this year. An album with no flaws, some of the high points include "The Weight of the World," "Is It a Matter of Time?," "Hello, It's the Blues," "Waking Up the Dead," "Don't Walk Out That Door," "Count Your Chickens," "Bed of Roses" and "You Got Me Whipped." A must listen!

Founded in Madison, Wis., in 2001 by harp player Joe Nosek, The Cash Box Kings boast one of the best lineups in the blues today and produce a sound that would have fit comfortably in the golden age of Chicago blues in the '50s and '60s. They simply sizzle from the start of this deep-in-the-pocket set, which includes nine originals and two well-crafted covers.

Oscar "Mr. 43rd Street" Wilson's vocals and Nosek's runs on the reeds cut like a knife throughout with backing from guitar ace Billy Flynn, percussionist Kenny "Beedy Eyes" Smith and keyboard player Lee Kanehara. Guest stars include Deitra Farr and John Németh on mic, Shoji Naito (Eddy Clearwater) and Jon McDonald (Magic Slim & the Teardrops) on six-string, The C-Note Horns and a host of others.

The hits come fast and furious. Don't miss "Oscar's Motel," "Down at the South Side," "I Can't Stand You" featuring Deitra, "Hot Little Mess," "Nobody Called It the Blues," "Trying So Hard," "She Dropped the Axe on Me," "I Want What Chaz Has" featuring Németh and "Ride Santa Ride."





Sadly, he left us after a valiant battle last December - but not before putting the finishing touches on this album, a loving, farewell to fans who've been supporting him since founding the band in London in 1965.

Medical issues forced Kim to switch to slide guitar, so Savoy's familiar sound is somewhat different. But the notes he delivers on six-string, organ and harp are rich and powerful aided by top-notch backing from bassist Pat DeSalvo and percussionist Garnet Grimm throughout.

An unhurried, deeply passionate set, you'll enjoy "Falling Through," "Black Heart," "Gypsy Healer," "Blues All Around," "Texas Love," "Winning Hand," "Can't Go Back to My Hometown," "California Days Gone By," "My Baby" and "Falling Through the Cracks."




TERESA JAMES - WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM HER FRIENDS

Possessing one of the sweetest voices in the blues, Texas-born, L.A.-based Teresa James is a 2023 BMA nominee for contemporary female vocalist of the year, and and she shows why on this interesting disc, which - as its title implies -puts a thoroughly azure spin on ten hits culled from the Beatles' catalog. The all-star lineup includes Nashville stalwarts Kevin and Yates McKendree and is anchored by percussionist Richard Millsap of Band of Heathens on percussion and bassist/hubby Terry Wilson, a longtime fixture in the Eric Burdon Band. Recorded in California and Tennessee, Kevin and Terry co-produced. As familiar as the Fab Four's catalog may be, all of the songs here sound brand new. Dial in "Ticket to Ride," "Tax Man," "Don't Let Me Down," "Oh Darlin'," "You've Got to Hide Your Love Away," "Everybody's Got Something to Hide," "You Won't See Me" and "Think for Yourself."




ANDY J. FOREST - I DON'T WANNA WORK: MODERN VINTAGE BLUES

Give a listen to "Determination," "I Don't Wanna Work," "Startin' All Over," "Frady's One Stop Store," "High Times Low Life," "Voodoo Lips" and "Piety Street Strut."

Both superstar keyboard player Bruce Katz and guitar god Mike Zito are in the star-laden lineup, which was recorded and engineered by Ron Keck at Subcat Studios in Syracuse. Never boring, always interesting, the 11 original tracks range from rock-steady shuffles to blues-rock, country blues and funk.

Zito's featured on "Riffin' the Blue" to open before Tas takes the lead for the rest of the set. The pleasers include "Brown Liquor Woman," "Stand Up!," "Throw It All Away," "Heal My Misery," "House of the Blues," "Miss This Man" and "Memphis Gone."

Johnnie Mae's "I Got the World in a Jug" kicks things off. You'll also enjoy "Love Her with a Feeling," "You for Me," "Blinded," "In a Spin," "Soul Food," "Walkin'," "We Got to Stick Together," "Southbound" and "Fire and Ice."




BILLY TRUITT - ABSTRACT TRUTH



From the 1940s through his death in 2001, there were few people in the blues more important than John Lee Hooker and there were few more important LPs than his 1962 release, *Burnin'*, which helped lay the foundation for the modern sounds we enjoy today. Fans too young to remember will understand why with one listen to this lovingly reissued CD.

The king of the boogie, John Lee joined forces with Motown's legendary house band, The Funk Brothers, for this one, including guitarist Larry Veeder, keyboard player Joe Hunter and bassist James Jamerson. Previously issued by Chicago's Vee-Jay label, it includes the original recording of "Boom Boom," one of Hooker's biggest hits ever.

Other choice cuts - all of which appear here in both mono and stereo format along with a previously unreleased alternate take -- include "Lost a Good Girl," "A New Leaf," "Blues Before Sunrise," "Let's Make It," "I Got a Letter," "Drug Store Woman," "Keep Your Hands to Yourself" and "Thelma."

A member of the CBS board since 2018, Marty Gunther is no stranger to the area or the Blues. In addition to writing the "Red Hot'n Blues Reviews" column and contributing occasional articles, Marty's an in-demand journalist across the Blues spectrum. Senior writer at Blues Blast Magazine, he's also a contributor to The Groove, the monthly newsletter of the Crossroads (III.) Blues Society, and his CBS reviews appear regularly in Chicago Blues Guide.
