## Member-to-Member Tips & Tricks

*From Tim Carey of Shadowhills Border Terriers:*

When choosing foods, you look at protein content, fat content and water content to determine values as "dry matter". But also look at calorie content, especially if your dog is very active, in heavy training, or it's winter when they need more calories to keep warm. Pay attention to the calorie values given with relation to how you actually measure their food. Some foods have higher calorie content per kilogram of food weight while others have higher calorie content by volume (per cup). Depending on how you measure your dog's food servings, choose accordingly. I compared two foods: one was 3400 calories per kg (weight) and 512 calories per cup (volume), while the other was 3870 calories per kilogram but only 420 calories per cup. The first food was heavier in weight per piece and smaller in volume per piece than the other., i.e. denser. Both foods had similar protein, fat and moisture values as fed. Both are good foods but the amount of calories that get to your dog depends on how you measure their daily ration, in a cup (volume) or by weight on a scale.

*From Reni LeBard about getting information about Border Terrier health issues:*

The BTCA Health Committee is available to anyone with a Border Terrier, not just members of the BTCA. The information is [right on their website](#), [www.btcoa.org](http://www.btcoa.org). If you scroll down to *Related Border Terrier Health Information* and click on *Health and Genetics Committee*, there is an email address and they explain how it works. They were very prompt in their responses to me and questions. I was emailing a representative who would relay information to the committee and back to me.

*Also from Reni about training for Rally and Obedience:*

I am sharing some ideas for the newsletter when it comes to Obedience and Rally training. We don't have a lot of choices locally with in-person instruction for Obedience training so I usually take online courses.

For online training schools, there are two that I actively participate in and can personally recommend. First, I recommend Fenzi Sports Academy! I have taken numerous Obedience classes through Fenzi, but they also have a great selection of courses in a variety of topics that rotate each term, including agility, behavior, foundations, health & fitness, nose work, Rally, Obedience, and more! For online Obedience training, I also recommend The Obedience Road with Connie

Cleveland. Connie's teaching methods are mostly positive, but she doesn't shy away from using corrections when used appropriately with rewards. Members will have access to Connie's huge library of content on how to teach and perform all of the Obedience exercises from Beginner Novice through Utility, proofing, troubleshooting, and preparing to show. Her website is organized so that searching for specific topics is easy. Connie hosts frequent webinars for members only; you can email Connie videos if you need her help, and there is a member-only Facebook group. Open enrollment only happens a couple of times a year, but check out The Obedience Road here: <https://www.obedieroad.com/learn-competitive-obedience>

## In The News


- Our \$250 annual club donation for 2025 went to the Washington State 4-H Foundation.



## Look What We Did!


