Background:

On February 17, 2015, during the Board's Workshop meeting, the County Attorney's office, including its outside legal counsel and Planning consultant, presented detailed analysis concerning the status of the County's current Pine Island litigation. During that meeting, the County Attorney's office recommended moving forward with preparing Land Development Code and Lee Plan amendments to revise the current regulations in a manner that will protect the unique character of Pine Island, while limiting the County's liability resulting from the creation of the Coastal Rural category and corresponding development regulations. In order to proceed, the County Attorney's office is seeking formal direction from the Board to move forward with drafting necessary regulations.
