- We are in the enhanced sheriff patrol district
- Pat Garrett is our sheriff at this time

- There are only 150 deputies in the sheriff's office so it is important to have help from the community in the form of Neighborhood Watch.
- Always encourage people to call Non Emergency for anything suspicious.
- Anyone who calls can be anonymous.
- Motion sensor lights tend to discourage criminal behavior. The brighter the better.
- There are 4-5 Clean & Sober houses on Parker Ct.
- Ride Alongs are encouraged. Go to Washco website and click Get Involved.
- Encourage neighborhood get togethers. Connect with neighbors.
- Containment sirens usually mean they're looking for someone. Stay inside because dogs would be out tracking.
- Most burglaries occur at 8am when people leave for work.
- Always keep you doors locked. Even during the day.
- Burglars typically try for 30 seconds to gain entry. Once they're in, they usually won't be there for more than 3 minutes.
- Don't hide keys outside.
- Get to know your neighbors.
