This statement sets out my **Skills**, **Knowledge**, **Experience**, **and Behaviour (SKEB)** in relation to fire risk associated with multilayer paint combustible surfaces and fire retardant and intumescent systems and evidences my professional competence under the Building Regulations and BSI Flex 8670 framework.

However, competency is not a fixed position. In complex or emerging risk areas—such as the fire performance of **multilayer paint systems** or the interaction of coatings with passive fire protection (PFP) measures—it is essential that those operating at the boundary of their expertise know **when and how to escalate**. Timely, informed escalation is key to avoiding compliance failure, misjudged risk tolerance, or unintended safety compromises.


Continual Professional Development (CPD)
