ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1. **GMT TRAINING:** During our GMT Training period this morning all hands assemble in living compartments with Division Officers/Senior Petty Officers present for an address over the ship's entertainment system by the Commanding Officer.

2. **SEMI-PERMANENT PARKING:** The area available on the Naval Station for parking while we are deployed is the old sewage disposal area. This is a secure parking area, although the government and the Naval Station assume no liability for damage or theft. Men desiring to park their vehicles there, submit your name to your Division Officer prior to 0800 Wednesday. Division Officers turn in all names collected to ENS LITTLE who will coordinate arrangements with the Naval Station Police.

3. SIGNING OF PETITIONS: On behalf of prisoners of war held by the North Vietnamese is not discouraged by the U.S. Government. You have the permission of the Department of Defense to do this and may even use your rate and Military Title if you desire. It is considered improper to combine the appeal for humane treatment of PW's with comments on domestic political issues. You should not sign petitions in any language other than English unless you are sure personally of what it says.

4. SPECIAL LIBERTY: In spite of your heavy work load this week, strong consideration will be given to special requests of men to take their wives to the briefing at 1330 today, if their wives can not otherwise attend. Besides the Navy briefings there will be a police officer there to give information on how they can help in an emergency. The information to be provided will be very important and every married man on board should insure his wife attends.

5. E-8, E-9 INTERVIEWS: Will be conducted in USS ANCHORAGE (LSD-30) commencing at 0800 tomorrow morning, 2 February. The uniform will be service dress blue for the below listed Senior Chief Petty Officers and Chief Petty Officers.



4. SERVICE RECORD VERIFICATION: All personnel whose last name begins with R and S report to the personnel office between 0830-1115 or 1300-1500 for the special verification.
5. MOVIE SCHEDULE: OFFICERS - "FINIAN'S RAINBOW"
 CPO'S - "A TWIST OF SAND"
 CREW - "THE BRAMBLE BUSH"

6. UNIFORM:: For liberty in Sydney will be service dress white (tropical white long optional) or appropriate civilian attire for those who are allowed to wear them off the ship. Service dress whites are preferable, as you don't have to worry about them, they are a socially acceptable uniform, anywhere day or night. Tropical white long is good anywhere during the day, but might be frowned on at some places in the evening as being a bit too informal. Civilian attire must conform with local standards. You can expect the people of Sydney to be very hospitable and let you in places in civilian clothing they would not wear themselves under the same circumstances, but they would not be favorably impressed and would think you didn't know any better.

7. CIVILIAN CLOTHES: Worn from the ship on liberty must include as a minimum, shoes and stockings, a pair of slacks or trousers and something other than an undershirt to cover the upper part of your body. These must meet the same standards of being clean, neatly pressed, unfrayed and free of holes with properly shined shoes as required for the uniform when worn. They must also meet the local standards for appropriate civilian attire.

8. APPROPRIATE CIVILIAN ATTIRE: Is a difficult term to define as it depends heavily on locally accepted customs. Our 7th Fleet port directory (which was last updated for Sydney 2 years ago) says that coat and tie are a must to get into any of the nicer restaurants or clubs. You can probably walk down the streets and go in the stores with a sports coat and slacks, or even just a conservative sports shirt and slacks in very hot weather, without attracting too much unfavorable attention. You can probably get into the zoo in almost any style which doesn't violate the nudity laws. You are on your own in this, responsible for your own appearance and conduct ashore, and charged with the responsibility to dress and behave in such a manner as to reflect credit on the United States and the U. S. Navy. A very wise and old adage to follow is "When in Rome, do as the Romans do."

1. PAYDAY: Pay day will be held tomorrow morning. This will be a full pay day up through the end of the month. Tickets for the enlisted party to be held the first night in Sydney will be sold during payday.
2. SOUND POWERED PHONES: Comply with the following rule so money being spent to replace sound powered phones may be used for other needed items. "When the circuit is secured and telephones are made up, stow on hooks or in stowage box provided".
3. XEROX COPIES: Due to the high cost of Xerox copies, all correspondence originated by MONTICELLO requiring more than 10 copies must be typed on stencils or ditto mats.
4. FAMILY SEPARATION ALLOWANCE: All eligible married personnel (E-4 with over 4 years service and E-5 and above) are requested to report to the Personnel office on Friday, 5 March 71 between 0830-1115. FSA forms will be filled out at this time and Disbursing will adjust your pay so that you will receive this allowance on the first payday in March. Any stragglers should be aware that the adjustment in your pay will not appear on the first payday in March.
5. REFERRAL PROGRAM: Is a new program designed to assist active duty officers and enlisted personnel who are within 6 months of retirement/transfer to the fleet reserve, disability retirement or disability separation (with 10 or more years of active service) in finding employment in civilian life. Referral assistance includes counseling designed to assist in determining post service employment objectives, acquaintance with the civilian job markets

"SOURCES: The regulations which are set forth herein, based on Articles in U.S. Navy regulations, the Uniform Code of Military Justice, and orders from higher authority have been specifically adapted for application on board this ship. Articles of major significance in these publications have been quoted verbatim for the benefit of personnel on duty in this ship.

10. STANDBYS: In Sydney, must be rate for rate and submitted at least 24 hours in advance (in time to get correct name on POD watch list and fire party/rescue & assistance detail lists).

11. GUESTS: Of members of the crew may visit onboard after working hours until 2145, except during general visiting. Guests, male or female, are allowed on weather decks or on mess decks only. Guests for meals are permitted, with 24 hours advance notice by special request (so the supply officer will know how much food to breakout.)

12. UNIFORM: For the party our first night in Sydney, will be service dress white. Tropical white long or civilian attire which does not offend the sensibilities of the civilian population are allowed. You are responsible for your own good appearance at the party and no one is going to regulate you closely as long as you are reasonably well dressed and behaved. This is one instance where the smart guys will wear their dress whites.

13. HAIR CUTS: Must conform to Admiral ZUMWALT'S standards. Most of us will pass on length of side burns and neatness of beards. If your hair is not evenly tapered in back or neatly trimmed, get a haircut before you go ashore. Expect all OOD's to enforce this rule.

14. WHITE UNIFORMS: Be prepared to wear these onboard after liberty is announced while we are in Sydney.

15. SECURITY OF INFORMATION: You are allowed to tell people we are going to PERTH and then on duty as a unit of the U.S. Seventh Fleet. That is all. Don't tell anyone where we are going or where we are not going. If questioned about our future schedule, say; "We are not allowed to discuss where we go in the U.S. NAVY, only where we have been." Be polite.

16. REGULATIONS: From higher authority forbid us from visiting onboard communist country ships. In the past, some American servicemen did this out of curiosity when invited and wound up sorry because their photographs and tape recorded interviews were used for propoganda in a way they had not intended. Keep this in mind while in Australia and also for later in Hong Kong.
