



- DUNGAREES ASHORE: 427 Men apprehended last month in the San Diego area for violations, either being out of uniform or being in unauthorized places while wearing dungarees. Men who violate the rules on wearing dungarees ashore will lose the privilege in addition to any disciplinary action required. This is in keeping with Admiral ZUMWALT'S philosophy which he recently expressed in a news conference when he said; "We should treat our Naval Personnel as grown and mature individuals and permit them to do everything consistent with the maintenance of good order and discipline. Those who abuse the liberal policies will find themselves undergoing disciplinary action. Those who use them as mature individuals, the vast majority, will have no problems.

The Chief of Naval Operations did not specifically place a limit on the length of sideburns, but said that those that reached to the top of the earlobe were considered not to violate Uniform Regulations, if they were straight and well trimmed. Sideburns longer than that may be judged acceptable on an individual basis, subject to review by OOD'S and other officers in positions of authority on a continuing basis.





4. POSTAL REMINDERS:

Neat, clean uniforms are socially acceptable anywhere and are recommended, in spite of advice we have received that wearing them may attract troublesome attention and advances from the fairer sex, that can be avoided by wearing civilian clothes.
