

Avoidable versus Unavoidable

This decision tree was developed by Martha R Kelso to determine if a wound is avoidable or unavoidable per the criteria defined in the federal guidelines by CMS

1. Evaluate the resident's clinical condition and risk factors

2. Define and implement interventions that are consistent with resident needs, resident goals, and professional standards of practice

3. Monitor and evaluate the impact of the interventions

4. Revise interventions as appropriate

If the answer is yes, proceed to the SECOND criteria

If the answer is no, stop and proceed with coding the wound as avoidable

If the answer is yes, proceed to the THIRD criteria

If the answer is no, stop and proceed with coding the wound as avoidable

If the answer is yes, proceed to the FINAL criteria

If the answer is no, stop and proceed with coding the wound as avoidable

If the answer is yes, proceed with coding the wound as UNAVOIDABLE

If the answer is no, stop and proceed with coding the wound as avoidable
