FESTIVAL TIME IN WATERTOWN

Festival Time is Getting Near

If you haven't gotten your booth yet for the July 7 Music and Arts Festival, there is still some time. You can also participate as a sponsor. The line-up is incredible this year. Musicians with world-wide followings will be in the square of Watertown performing free to the public.

"This festival has been a part of Watertown for over 20 years," says Gabrielle Hardy, "It was originally called the 'Jazz Festival,' and most of the music is still Jazz with some amazing Blues artists thrown in."

Visual artists will have booths where they sale their works. Darlene Shadden will be doing quick pastel portraits for festival patrons and the Tennessee Association of Woodturners will be demonstrating.

The music line-up is the following:

4PM The Jazz Alliance According to Joe Morris, writer for *Images of Mt. Juliet*, "One group getting some positive buzz recently is the Jazz Alliance. The band was formed with local musicians and some from the surrounding area. The group has about 18 members, and typically the whole roster is on hand for performances."

5PM Sugar Lime Blue Ken Beck of *The Wilson Post* wrote "Sugar Lime Blue....might just trip you back to the 1970's with their ultracool retro vibes, a musical melting pot that oozes a unique blend of country, rock, blues and jazz....but also expect to be surprised by a group that's practically impossible to label."

6PM Chazz Williams According to a post on Fisk University's site, "Saxophonists Chazz Williams is an artist with a unique style of Inspirational, instrumental music. Being a native of

Chicago, his music reflects elements of the Chicago smooth Jazz sound."

7PM The Corey Mac Show "A true blues man at heart, Corey Mac has been making a name for himself on the Nashville music scene for close to a decade. During that time, he has managed to hone his craft; sharing the stage with some of the greatest blues artists," says Ralph Cowalski.

8PM Vantrease Jazz Band Ken Beck from the *Wilson Post* wrote "A truly homegrown act, the Vantrease Jazz Band, headed by brothers Earl and Ernest Vantrease, will hit the stage. Earl, who plays trumpet, and Ernest, on keyboards, were raised in Watertown," says Beck. Earl says "My brother played with Buddy Rich and B.B. King and toured and recorded for many years with Ray Charles."

9PM Glenn Martin Glenn Martin is a composer, arranger, and jazz trombonist, and has worked as a clinician throughout the United States. His compositions or arrangements have been performed by the United States Marine Band, the Modern Jazz Tuba Project, the Tennessee Mid-State Jazz Band, the East Tennessee All-State Clinic Jazz Band, and at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic, as well as by other school and college groups.

10PM Annie Sellick & Friends "Annie Sellick is very much a jazz singer, who focuses on the music, but she is also a storyteller and her rendition of emotionally complex songs is masterful... she is also a stunning visual performer. After seeing her perform twice I see no reason why she shouldn't be a star," according to critic Roger Crane L.A. *Jazz Scene*

Susan's workshop will be at her studio on Depot Street in Watertown. She will also conduct two workshops. One from 10am to 1pm and one from 2pm to 5pm.

Susan says, "Jewelry ties us to moments in our existence. It binds to the elements of our emotions and senses, it has meaning, purpose and value. We are emotionally tied to its meaning and beauty, it defines us and marks our place in culture and gives us confidence in the intimate moments of our lives."


