

- The average quilter identifies as female (98%), is retired (70%) and is in her 60's.
- They are comfortable with technology and have 10 years of quilt-making experience.
- She/he owns four different types of sewing machines and has a household income of \$70k or more.
- On average she/he starts 11 projects a year and finishes 9!


This year the leadership team is adding "Pop-Up Events" to add some fun to our year of "Let's Have FUN!"
