
MAYRA DIAZ & JULIA SMITH



The year of the CRUMB has gotten off to a fantastic start. Fifteen sewers joined us for the Sew-cial and made 53 crumb blocks. Keep putting those square blocks (6 1/2" unfinished) together from your scraps and bring them to our meetings to add to our collection. We will be making QOV size quilts (width 55-72, length 65-90) for the dispatchers of 4Heroes. As our guest from 4Heroes explained to us, the dispatchers are often the neglected ones in the emergency line but also the first line in any emergency. He called them "the thin gold line." So the quilts we make will have gold sashing. Any donation of GOLD fabric that reads as solid will be greatly appreciated. Frank also told us that there are about 30 dispatchers. Could we rise to the challenge to get a quilt made for all of them? Surely there are enough scraps among us to meet the challenge. I will be figuring out just how many blocks we need for each quilt. Look for a sew-in Saturday to put the blocks together. We are also accepting finished quilts for the other organizations listed below.
