QUILT APPRAISALS - AUGUST 22 & 23

KAREN SHELNUTT

“What is that quilt worth?”

How many times have you wondered that? Lisa Erlandson, Certified Quilt appraiser will be teaching at the QGSC August guild meetings and will also offer quilt appraisals. Here are some of the details:

Guidelines: Quilts of an estimated value of \$250 or more are suitable for written appraisal. All items of a collection, where the average value exceeds \$250, should be appraised. Antique, contemporary, art and quilted clothing are all welcome. Lisa will supply all the paperwork and materials needed to complete the appraisals. No verbal appraisals

Appraisals will be written for insurance replacement value. They will take about 30 min per quilt, and are confidential between the owner and appraiser.

Cost is \$60.00 per quilt and checks are made out to QGSC. (She will donate \$5.00 per quilt back to the guild.)

Appraisals will take place Friday August 22 9am – noon at Evergreen Church, and Saturday August 23 9:00 am – all day if needed, at the home of Joan Willcocks.

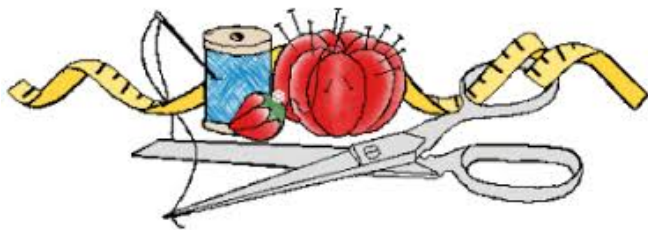
This year the leadership team is adding "Pop-Up Events" to add some fun to our year of "Let's Have FUN!"

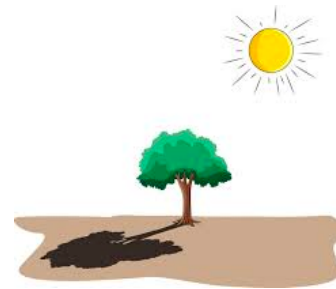

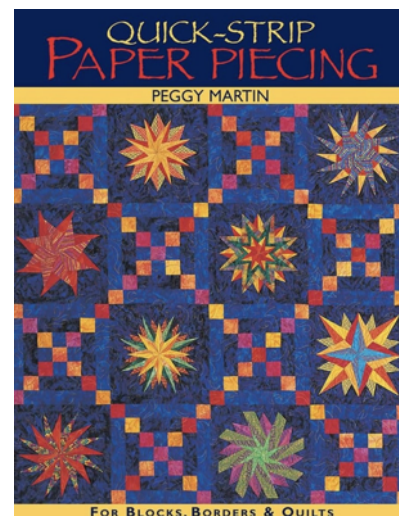
