*Women's Suffrage Centennial Anniversary Quilt, 1920 – 2020*

Jennifer Woods and Susan Peryam want to thank everyone that made blocks for the 2020 Raffle Quilt commemorating the centennial anniversary of women's right to vote in the United States. The nineteenth amendment extending full suffrage to women was ratified on August 26, 1920. Women working together for their rights wore white and the primary colors in their signage were cheddar and purple. In the 1960's blood was shed when the fight for women of color to vote was won.
