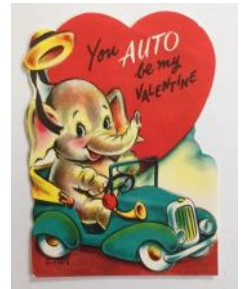
PRESIDENT'S LETTER

UFO HARVEST: 2018-2019

- The Goal of the UFO Harvest is for members to reap the benefits of completing their Unfinished Objects.
- Unfinished Object (“UFO”) is a quilting project, of any type, that is Under Construction (“UC”) or Ready to Quilt (“RQ”) as of Oct. 1, 2018 and is listed on this sheet.
- “Completed” means that the project has progressed to being Ready to Quilt (“RQ”) or Finished (“F”) by the October 2019 meeting.
- The Harvest will culminate in some fun (maybe silly) awards and prizes. No “quilt police” are involved and members are on the honor system.

Status Definitions:

- ◇ “UC” or Under Construction means that you have a design or pattern, have assembled your fabrics and have at least begun to cut or stitch your project.
- ◇ “RQ” or Ready to Quilt – means that the quilt top is complete and ready for quilting, including the backing and batting.
- ◇ “F” or Finished – means that your project is quilted, bound (if needed) and ready to use or display.

- While not required, we do look forward to seeing your UFO quilts in Show and Tell throughout the year!

Challenge Theme: "Say It Without Words"

- a short popular saying or proverb, usually of unknown and ancient origin, that expresses effectively some commonplace truth or useful thought.

Here are a few examples:

1. A stitch in time saves nine
2. A penny saved is a penny earned
3. If you snooze, you loose

Guidelines:

- Decide on the saying you want to interpret
- Max size is total of 100" around the edge. (example 25 X 25)
- Can be any shape
- You cannot use any words to convey your message.
- Express yourself with your favorite color and shape—make it traditional or contemporary, modern or abstract. Expand your creativity. Your favorite color should visually be the focal point of the quilt. Piece it, appliqué it, embellish it—just make it your own!
- Only one entry per person
- Please have a label with your name on the back.

Voting will occur at each of the July guild meetings.

Meeting dates for voting:

Day: Friday, July 12 AND

Night: Thursday, July 25

- The Challenge Quilt Committee will collect all the quilts on or before July 12. No quilt submitted after July 12th will be considered for voting.
- All quilts will be on display at each meeting
- Voting will occur at each meeting. Those attending get a vote regardless of if they attend both meetings.

Voting criteria and ribbons to be awarded:

- At each meeting, Members will get a sheet with numbers and lines. They are to fill in what they think the axiom is for each quilt.
- There will also be a space to list the member's favorite.
- All votes will be tabulated after the night time voting and the three quilts with the most correct answers each win a ribbon.
- Three additional ribbons will be awarded based on voting for Members Favorite.

Take aways from Candy Shively's presentation to stretch your creative process...

WHAT IF I...

- cut this UFO into pieces and reassembled it—or parts of it
- painted or printed something over this UFO?
- made myself create something out of this UGLY fabric?
- made myself use a color I hate?
- combined two unrelated UFOs
- broke the rules or scrambled the pattern
- left something out
- used a color that does not fit the “scheme?”
- invent my own challenge: make a series of three pieces that are 12 by 12 and only use these seven fabrics but no pattern
- shift some blocks over so they don't line up. What do I do with the other space?
- turned part of it upside down (or sideways)
- included something that isn't considered “fabric”
- spilled something on it
- cut a hole in the middle and reverse applied in something else “peeking through”?
- made a picture of a childhood memory (as a child might see it)
- let my grandchild color on it
- used nothing but letter shapes
- used nothing but number shapes
- used nothing but zebras
