Whether you've been waiting to find the right time to sew your first guild name tag or a replacement, here's your opportunity. Our daytime pre-meeting sew-along for February is a paper pieced nametag-making session.

We'll meet Friday, February 7 from 9:30-11:30 am at HTCC and get the job done.



SUPPLIES Needed

- Fabric scraps (approximately 5"x7" pieces of 3 or 4 colors)
- Scrap (approximately 8"x10" contrasting piece for background of star.)
- 1 coordinating fat quarter (border and backing)
- Batting 5"x7" White or a light color
- Basic sewing supplies: pins, small sharp scissors, seam ripper, etc.
- Sewing machine -don't forget your cord & foot pedal and extension cord (You could probably partner with a friend to share a machine.)
- Neutral (or matching) thread & bobbins
- Rotary cutter & small mat & small rulers. We will have a couple for the group, but personal one to share with your neighbor would be helpful.
- Glue stick




COMMUNITY SERVICE
